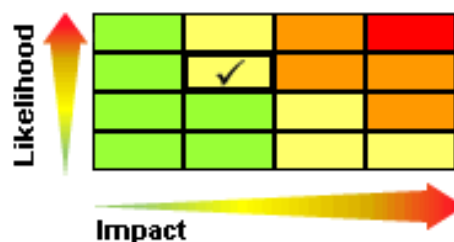
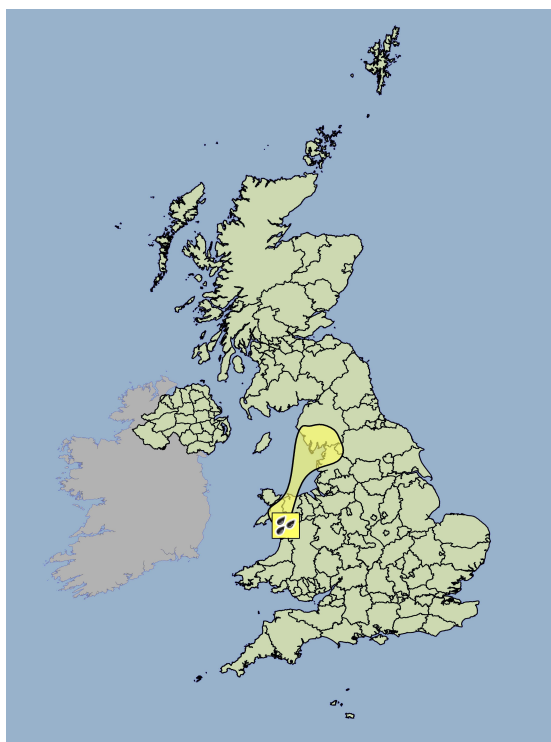




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

A frontal system will bring a further spell of rain to parts of Wales and northwest England later today. This is likely to be heavy at times and lead to 20-30mm falling in just a few hours, and locally in excess of 60mm over high ground in Snowdonia and Cumbria. The heaviest rain should clear by midnight, but there is the potential for some localised surface water flooding, which could persist into Friday morning.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **15:00 on Thu, 15th Aug 2013** until **23:59 on Thu, 15th Aug 2013**

Heavy rain is expected to arrive later this afternoon and persist through much of this evening.

The public should be aware of the potential for some minor disruption to travel due to localised flooding.
