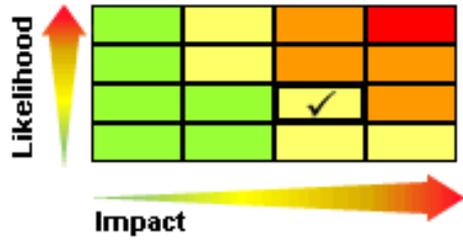



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

A developing frontal system will move northeastwards across England and Wales on Saturday. The heaviest rain is likely to be across southern areas where, with ground already saturated, further localised flooding is likely.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **00:05 on Sat, 04th Jan 2014** until **14:00 on Sat, 04th Jan 2014**

A spell of heavy rain is likely to affect southern parts of England during the first half of Saturday, clearing eastwards early in the afternoon. A further 20 to 30 mm of rain is likely in places and much of this could fall within a 6-hour period. Further heavy showers may move eastwards later on Saturday.

The public should be aware of the risk of further localised surface water flooding and disruption to travel.

This warning has been updated to include southwest England.
