



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment
 Following earlier heavy snow showers temperatures will widely fall below freezing allowing icy conditions to develop on untreated surfaces. Note that snow showers are likely to persist across the extreme northeast of the Scottish mainland and the Northern Isles well into Sunday morning.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Alert of Ice**

Valid from **00:00 on Sun, 19th Feb 2012** until **11:00 on Sun, 19th Feb 2012**

Although the heaviest of the snow showers over the northern half of Scotland should have died out by Sunday morning, the public should be aware that widespread ice is likely to form on untreated surfaces and last for much of Sunday morning. This is likely to cause some disruption.
