



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

An unstable airmass will cover Northern Ireland today, and as temperatures rise, scattered heavy and possibly thundery showers will break out. These may give 10-20mm in an hour in a few places and perhaps 30mm in 3 hours. However, as is often the case with showers, many parts will miss the worst and a few places could escape with a dry day.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **11:00 on Wed, 06th Aug 2014** until **18:00 on Wed, 06th Aug 2014**

Scattered heavy showers will develop across Northern Ireland from late morning with the risk of isolated thundery downpours, mainly across the north. The public should be aware of the risk of localised flooding and potential disruption to transport and outdoor events.
