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REMARKS.

Fri-day

The barometer has again fallen slightly, but uniformly, on all our coasts; the change in the south of England having taken place chiefly during the night, while in Scotland the fall has ceased. Readings are still rather high, and that at Helder is 0.34 m. higher than at Valencia, and 0.42 m. higher than at Thureo.

Temperature has again risen except in Ireland, the change being considerable in the northeast of Great Britain, and Norway. It is now lowest on our southeast coasts, and in Holland: Helder is 18° colder than Valencia and Thureo.

The direction of the wind is very similar to that reported yesterday morning, but is rather more variable in the North. In force it is light generally.

A little rain has fallen in the north. The sky is however, now much clearer everywhere, with fog in the east and south-east of England. The sea is nearly calm except at Christiania and

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REMARKS.

Tues - day

The barometer has risen rapidly at all our western stations since yesterday, while in Norway and Holland it has continued to fall. The change amounts to three quarters of an inch in the south of Ireland, but the rise has apparently ceased at Valencia. The highest readings are in the south; and that at Brest exceeds by 0.53 in. that at Thurso.

Temperature has decreased generally, principally in the west and north.

REMARKS.

The barometer has continued to rise on our northern and western coasts since yesterday, while in the southeast there has been a slight fall. Readings are now comparatively uniform in the neighbourhood of the British Isles, though still highest in the southwest; the difference between those at Scilly and Thurso is only 0.39 in.

Temperature has again fallen generally. At Ardrossan the thermometer fell to 17° F, during the night, and it still freezes hard in Scotland generally.

Moderate to fresh W^{ly} and NW^{ly} breezes are general in our Islands, drawing more N^{ly} in Holland and the straits of Dover.

Snow or hail has been general, the sky has since cleared in many places, but continues very cloudy in the S of Ireland. The sea is moderate to calm on our coasts.

Readings are rather uniform in the British Islands, that at Valencia exceeding that at Wick by 0.32 in., but that at Christiansund by 0.68 in. Temperature has risen again nearly everywhere. It is very uniform in the British Isles.
