



# National Severe Weather Warning Service



**Chief Forecasters Assessment**

A strong, moist southwesterly flow will persist across the region until early Tuesday, with the embedded frontal system continuing to generate prolonged heavy rainfall across many northwestern parts of Scotland. Another 50 to 80 mm may fall before this clears, so that (including what has fallen since late Saturday), total 3-day rainfall totals in excess of 120 mm will be widespread within the Yellow Warning area.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **10:50 on Mon, 27th Oct 2014** until **18:00 on Tue, 28th Oct 2014**

A frontal system will remain relatively slow-moving across western and northwestern parts of Scotland through the rest of Monday, finally clearing southeastwards during the first half of Tuesday. Until then, heavy persistent rainfall is likely to continue across much of the warning area, with peak intensities likely late tonight and early on Tuesday. The largest rainfall totals are expected in the area covered by the separate Amber Warning. Residual impacts may occur for some time after the clearance of the rainfall.

The public should be aware that disruption is likely due to localised flooding. This warning is an update to that first issued on Friday.
