


National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

A deep area of low pressure is expected to develop in the Atlantic on Sunday, tracking eastwards to be centred to the north of Scotland on Monday. The first impact of this depression is likely to be a period of persistent and heavy rain, which could bring 20-30mm quite widely across Western Scotland on Sunday morning, and over hilly areas 40-60mm is possible. As this will fall in a fairly short period of time, surface water flooding is possible on roads, especially where drainage is impeded by wind blown debris.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **00:05 on Sun, 15th Sep 2013** until **12:00 on Sun, 15th Sep 2013**

A band of persistent and heavy rain will spread from the west in the early hours of Sunday and continue into the morning. The rain will be accompanied by strong to gale force southwesterly winds. The rain will turn more showery by the afternoon.

The public should be aware of the risk of travel disruption due to surface water flooding on roads.
