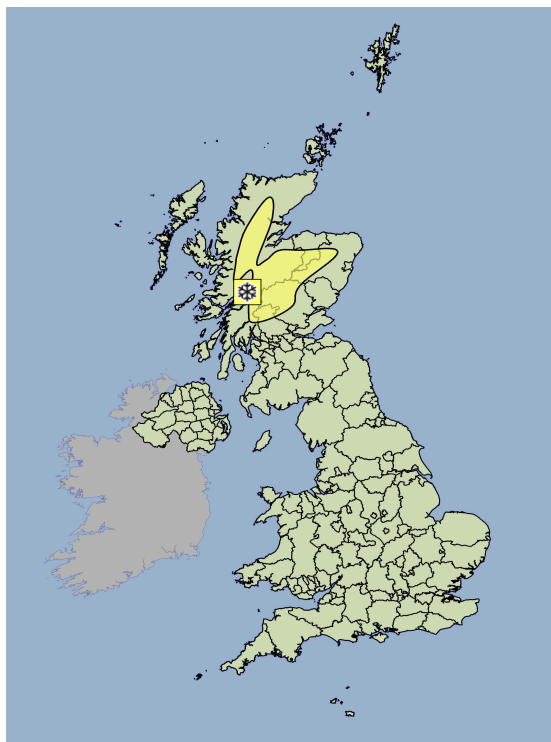




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

A cold showery westerly airstream will cover Scotland, with troughs of low pressure bringing some heavy and prolonged wintry showers through the day. While most of the snow showers will be found over higher ground, the heavier showers could bring snow to quite low levels at times. As the troughs clear east this evening, showers will become more scattered but as longer clear spells develop, ground temperatures will fall and ice will form on roads which have not yet been treated.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Snow**

Valid from **09:00 on Fri, 11th Dec 2015** until **23:00 on Fri, 11th Dec 2015**

Snow showers will continue to affect higher ground on Friday. Some of the showers will be heavy and could lead to accumulations of 2-4 cm on ground above 200-300m, while 10 cm is possible on higher routes above 400m. At lower levels most of the showers will be of rain or sleet though some slight slushy accumulations are possible in the heaviest showers. As showers become more scattered this evening, icy stretches will form on untreated roads.

Be aware that some difficult driving conditions will be encountered today with the possibility of some local transport disruption.
