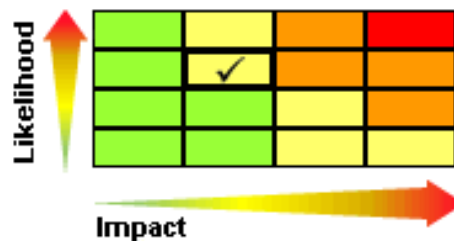
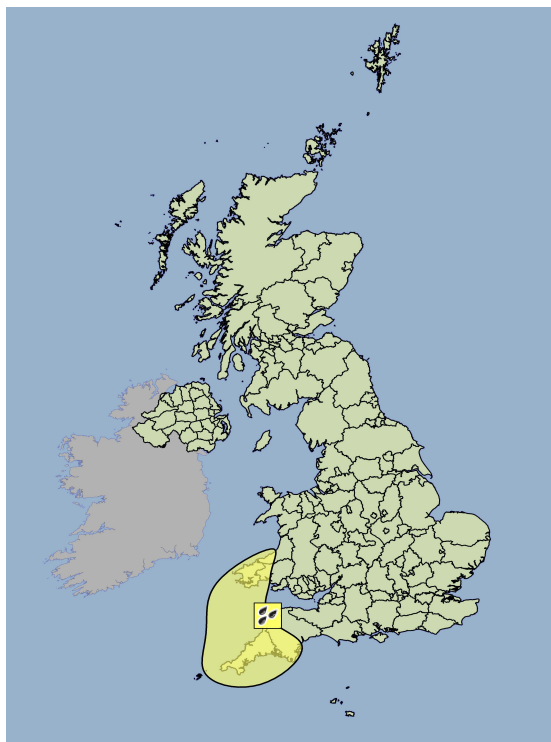




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

A slow-moving front is lying across Wales and southwest England today. As a warm, moist airmass of continental origin interacts with the front, some further heavy showers or outbreaks of thundery rain are likely in places. There still remains uncertainty as to the extent of any associated disruption.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **03:00 on Thu, 20th Jun 2013** until **23:55 on Thu, 20th Jun 2013**

Outbreaks of heavy and, at times, thundery rain are likely to affect parts of southwest England and southwest Wales for the rest of today. Some 10-20 mm of rain could fall within 3-6 hours locally although some places will miss the worst of this. The public should be aware of the risk of localised surface water flooding.

This is an update to the warning issued yesterday to include the extreme southwest of Wales.
