



# National Severe Weather Warning Service



### Chief Forecasters Assessment

Further areas of heavy rain will move north across Northern Ireland, with some placing receiving 15-25 mm within a few hours during Thursday morning. Additionally, slow moving heavy, thundery showers will develop during the afternoon which could produce 20-30 mm of rain within an hour. There is uncertainty as to where the heavier downpours will occur, but the greatest risk for further disruption is likely to be in the east.

The Met Office have issued an **Amber Warning of Rain**

Valid from **04:00 on Thu, 28th Jun 2012** until **21:00 on Thu, 28th Jun 2012**

Areas of thundery rain will move north to affect Northern Ireland during Thursday morning, with the potential for slow moving torrential downpours to develop through the afternoon and lasting into the evening. Following the downpours of Wednesday evening, the public should be prepared for further flooding to occur.
