



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

A depression over the English Channel will drift slowly northeastwards towards southeast England. As it does so, heavy and possibly thundery rain developing over northern France may extend into southeast England. At present there is significant uncertainty in the details, but 10 to 20 mm of rain could fall in a few hours locally.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **18:00 on Sun, 10th Jun 2012** until **23:55 on Sun, 10th Jun 2012**

Outbreaks of rain are likely to become heavy and possibly thundery on Sunday evening over parts of southern England, particularly the southeast. The public should be aware that this could lead to localised surface water flooding.
