Wet and windy weather swept across Scotland and Northern Ireland overnight, most of the rain in northern and northwest Scotland. The persistent rain cleared most of these areas soon after dawn. Showery, windy weather affected much of Scotland for a time, with heavy and squally showers reported in the north and northeast, and a period of high, stormy winds in the far north. The showers and wind died down in the afternoon, with much of northern Britain having a dry evening.

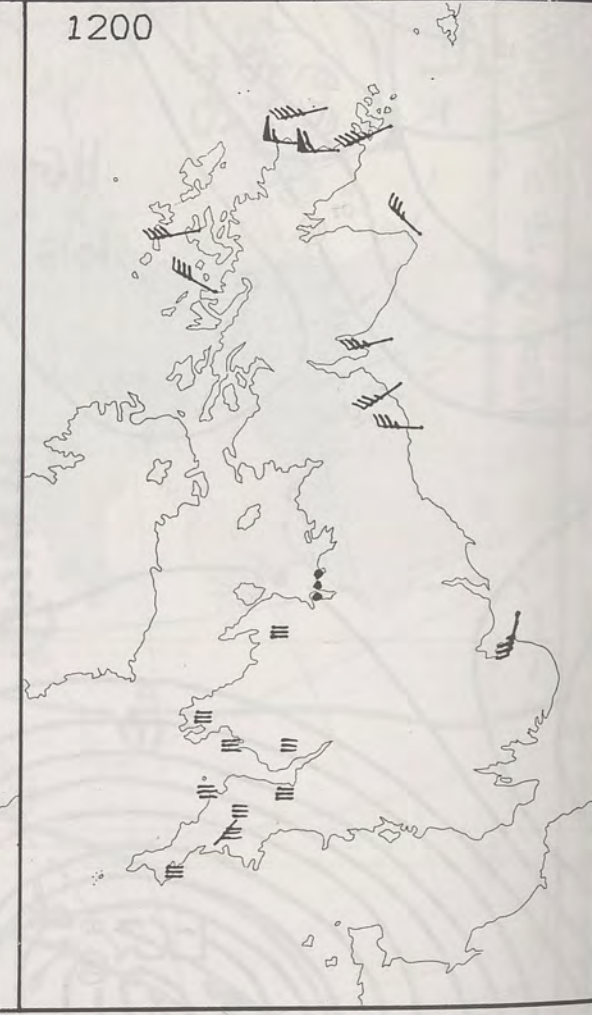
England and Wales had a dry, cloudy and reasonably mild night. Rain moved slowly from the north over many areas during the day, with some drizzly rain in the south ahead of the main rain belt. Brighter and drier weather followed the rain area into northern England and North Wales.

Maximum temperatures were well above normal, though temperatures in many northern areas fell as the colder air swept down from the northwest.

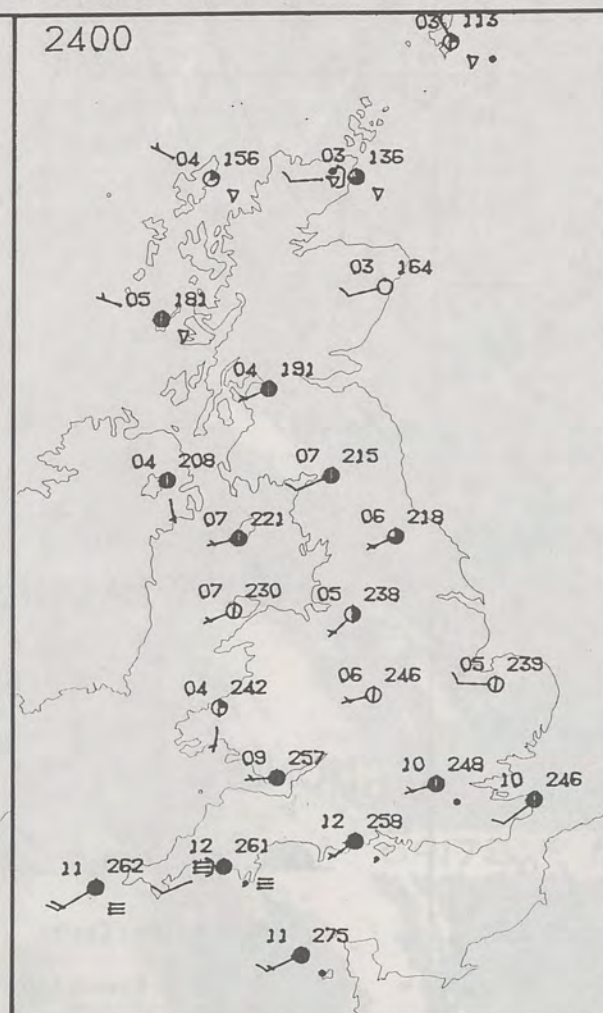
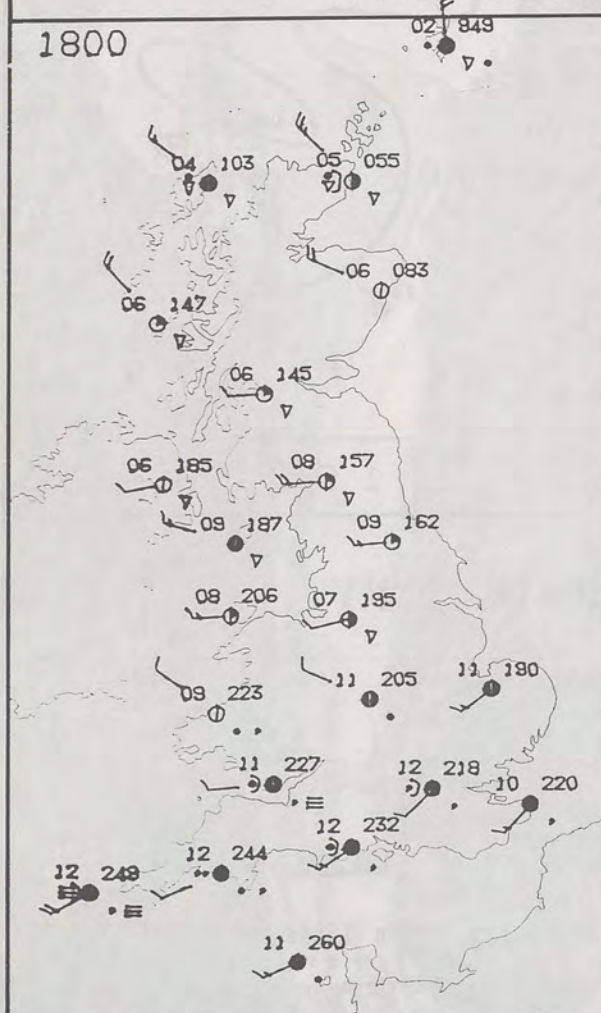

Some sleet or snow showers were reported in the far northeast of Scotland, but most of northern Britain had a dry night, with broken cloud at first. Towards dawn, rain, heavy at times reached Northern Ireland and western Scotland and spread quickly across all of northern Britain by mid-morning. Large amounts of rain were reported in central and western Scotland. The weather turned somewhat drier over Northern Ireland during the afternoon.

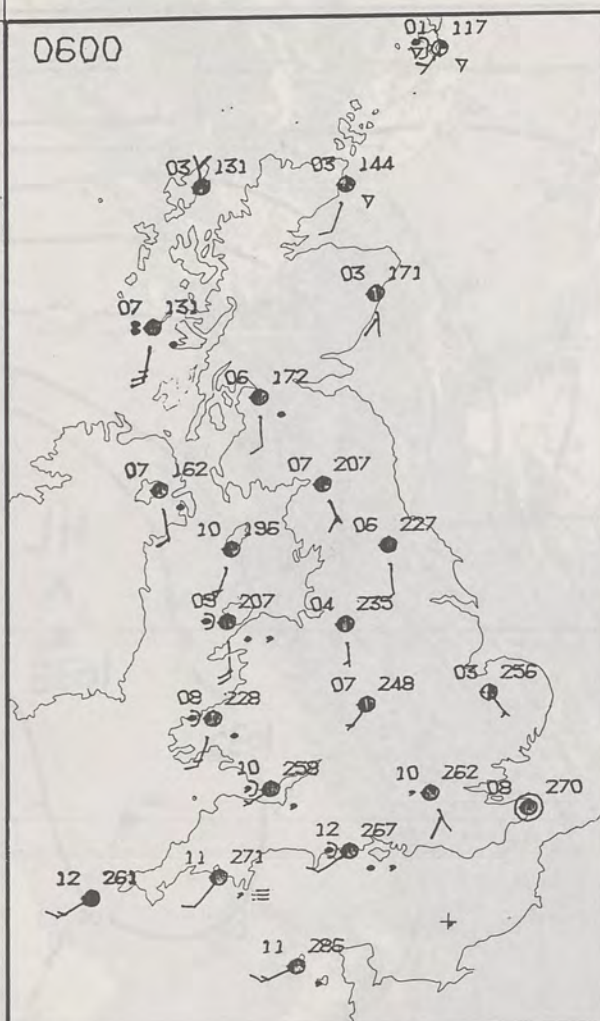
Southernmost counties of England stayed in mild and moist westerly winds overnight, whilst the remainder of England, and most of Wales had a dry night, with well broken cloud. During the morning, mild and moist air spread quickly across all remaining areas of England and Wales, with some drizzle and hill fog. However, good cloud breaks turned up in the southwest and to the lee of high ground.

It became very mild almost everywhere after a cold start in some central and northern areas. Shetland was rather cold for most of the day, the mild air not reaching them till the late evening.

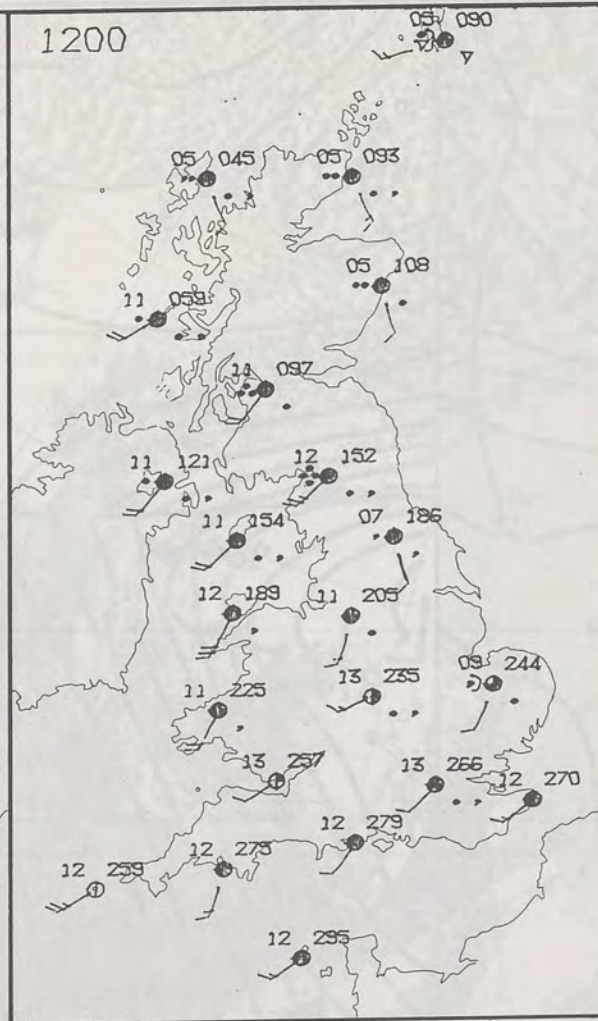

### SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

Over England and Wales dry weather continued through the night and in central and southern counties it remained dry during the day with a few breaks in the cloud, especially in southern England. In North Wales and northern England, after a mainly dry morning, outbreaks of rain spread to most parts with some heavy rain in northwestern counties.

In Scotland and Northern Ireland rain spread from the northwest during the early hours and much of the day was wet and windy. In northwest Scotland it turned brighter with scattered showers by early afternoon and over the rest of Scotland and Northern Ireland the late afternoon and evening was mainly dry.

It was very mild almost everywhere with strong southwesterly winds. In Newcastle there were frequent gusts over 60 knots and one of 67 knots around midday.

### SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

In England and Wales mainly cloudy weather persisted. There were patches of light rain in most places and in northwestern counties there was rain or drizzle much of the time. It was exceptionally mild.

In Northern Ireland and southern Scotland it was cloudy but mainly dry with only odd patches of light rain until later in the afternoon and evening; rain then became persistent and heavy especially in Northern Ireland and southwest Scotland. It was mostly mild.

In Northern Scotland a strong southwest wind brought a mixture of sunny intervals and showers, some of the showers were heavy with hail. During the evening more persistent rain spread from the south to much of the mainland.

Temperatures were a little above normal in most places.

A gust of 70 knots was reported from Shetland in the early hours.

Scotland had a wet night and the weather stayed wet for much of the morning, with periods of heavy rain, and snow over some higher ground, with sleet being reported for a short time from the Inner Hebrides. Showers continued across many northern and western parts of Scotland, with hail and snow reported. Across the rest of Scotland and much of Northern Ireland the night was clear and cold, with a widespread frost by dawn. During the day the showers became confined to the far north and northwest of Scotland, remaining areas were dry with sunshine. During the evening rain reached Northern Ireland and westernmost Scotland.

Some southernmost areas of England had some rain just after midnight but this cleared, then all of England and Wales had a dry, cold night, with widespread frost and the odd fog patch in the south. The weather stayed dry and sunny through the day. Frost returned to many eastern areas of England for a while during the evening, but freshening winds helped temperatures rise towards midnight.

There were strong winds in many northern areas later and during the evening gales or severe gales developed in the northwest. Daytime temperatures were generally near or a little below normal.

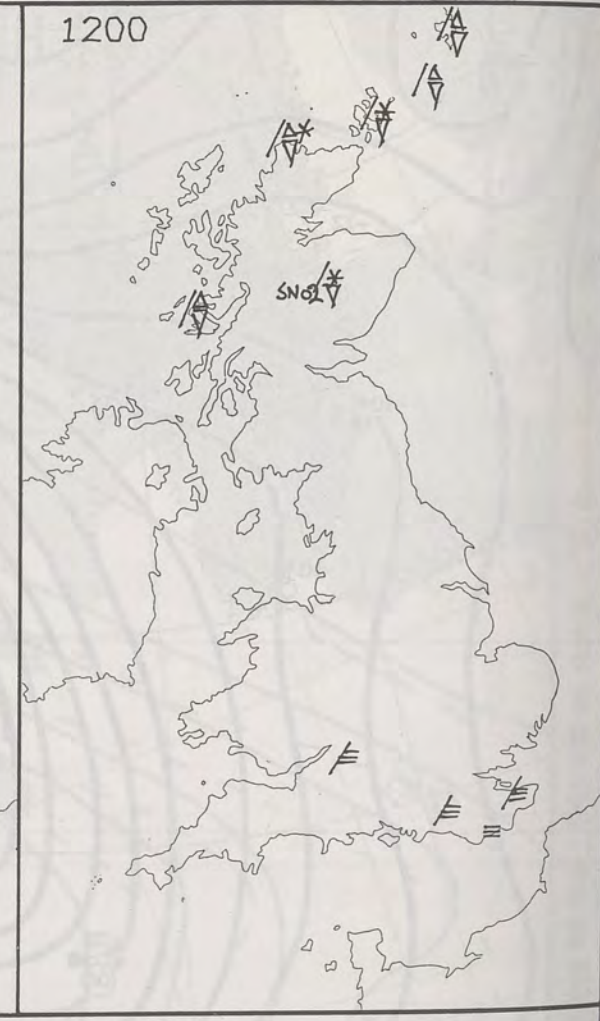

Temperatures were near or a little above average across all parts.

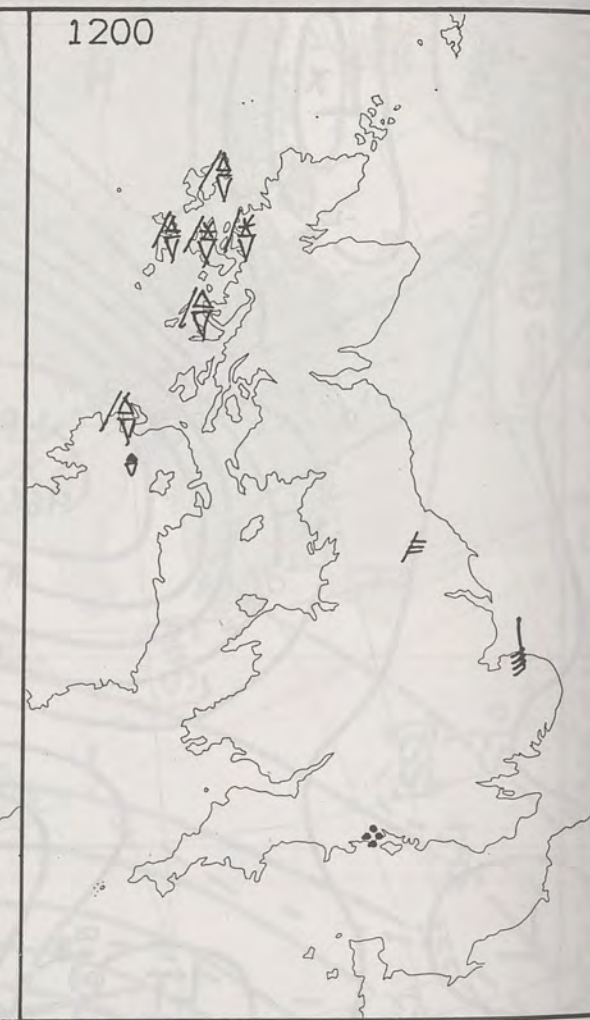

Many places had a frost early on but wet and windy weather spread from the west overnight and during the morning there was a lot of heavy rain and in Scotland and northeast England sleet and snow for a while before it turned to rain. The south to southeast wind reached gale force in many places and up to storm force especially on coasts and hills. Many places reported gusts over 70 knots.

By daybreak the weather had cleared up in Northern Ireland and the extreme west of Scotland and this brighter weather with some sunshine reached all parts during the day. After brightening up some places stayed dry but there were showers, particularly in the north and west with showers of rain, hail, sleet and snow, and thunder in places.

Much of Britain turned mild for a while but then colder again in the brighter weather. Scotland and Northern Ireland however were mostly rather cold all day.

Gale force northwesterly winds affected southwestern parts of Britain in the evening, and a gust of 78 knots was reported from Gwennap Head (near Lands End) in the early evening.

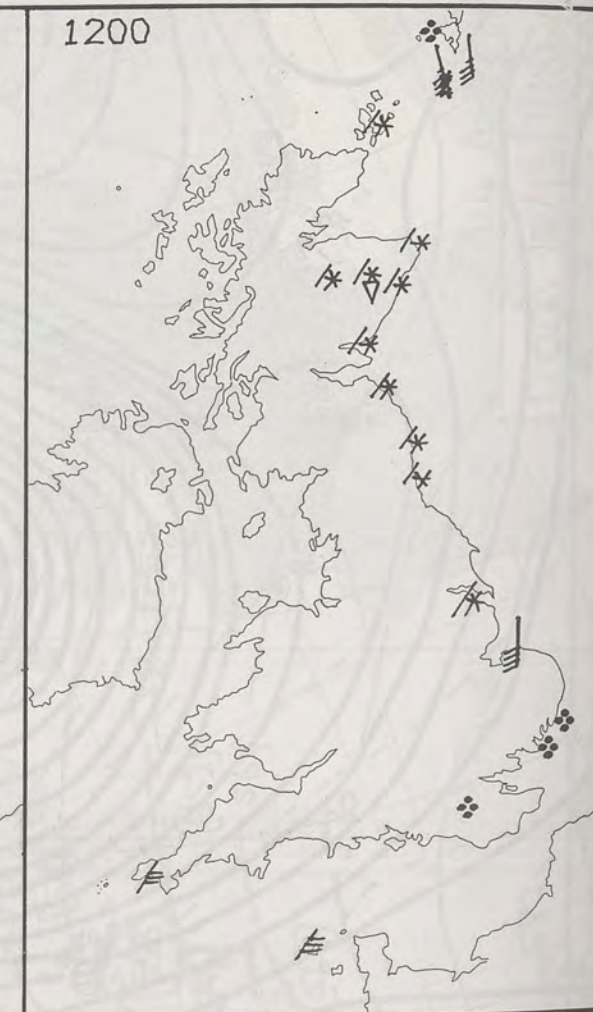

There were one or two heavy bursts of rain and over northern hills some sleet and snow. In southeastern England there were isolated thunderstorms in the evening. The rain gave way to showery weather in all parts with strong to gale force westerly winds in the evening, (a gust of 82 knots at Portland Bill). Some showers were of hail or snow in southwest and east England during the evening.

Showers of rain, sleet or hail continued throughout the day in exposed northern and western coastal regions, and where showers penetrated well inland, some snow showers were reported over hills. Eastern coastal regions of Scotland were affected overnight by an area of enhanced showery activity, which moved by dawn to northeast England and parts of Yorkshire, giving rise to heavy snow showers over the moors and other high ground. This area then spread inland somewhat, to affect many Midland, central southern and southeastern counties and parts of Wales as it travelled south, giving a mixture of rain, sleet and snow, though snow accumulations in southern Britain appear to have been insignificant.

Temperatures were near normal in the southwest of England, Wales, Northern Ireland and western Scotland, but below normal elsewhere and distinctly raw in some eastern and southeastern areas.

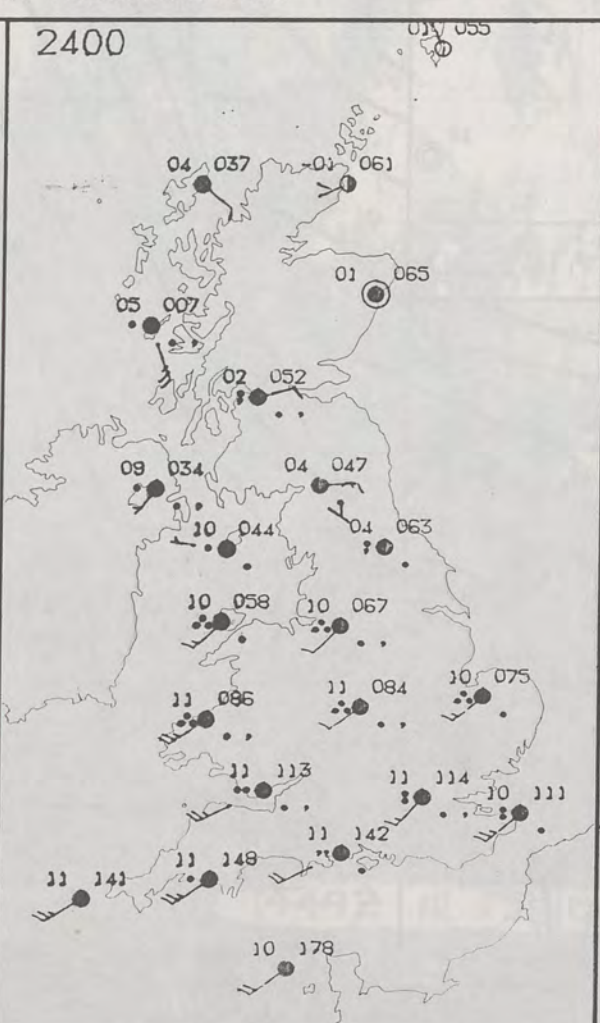
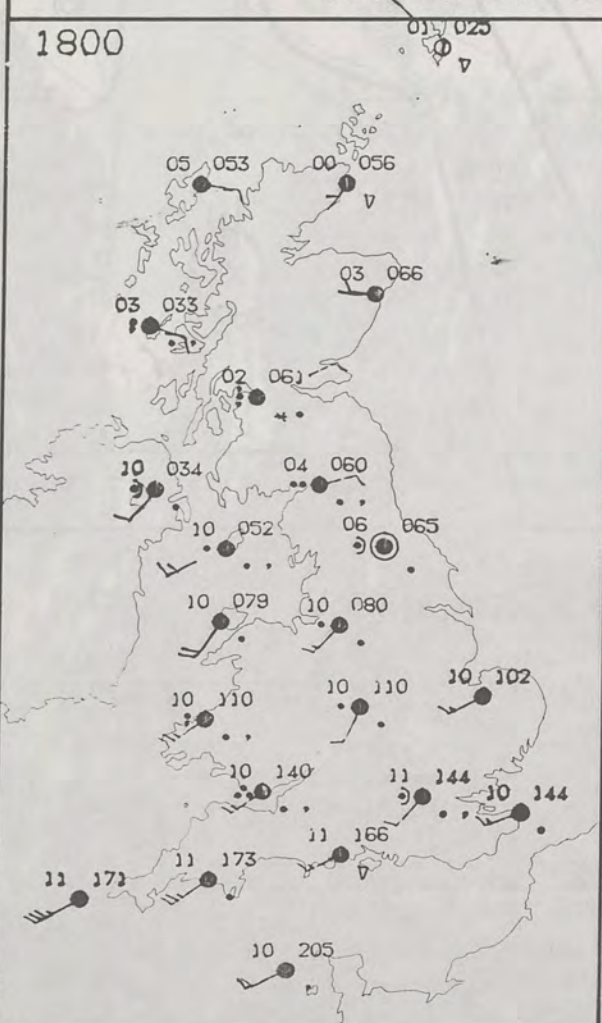
During the day, most of England, Wales and Northern Ireland stayed very mild with a good deal of cloud, and some patchy rain. This became heavier during the afternoon in Wales, and over many other areas during the evening. It was also wet near the Scottish border, and a sharp drop in temperature came slowly southwards into this area; at Aspatria (Cumbria) the temperature fell from 9° to 3° between 1800 and 2100. Scotland had a rather cold day with some rain or sleet, though it was mostly dry in the north.

At dawn, England, Wales and Northern Ireland, along with southernmost areas of Scotland were wet, with bursts of heavy rain and it was also windy in many southern and some western areas. Later in the morning, brighter, slightly less mild air swept across Northern Ireland and the far west of Wales and Cornwall. By dusk, most of England, Wales and Northern Ireland were in somewhat clearer, showery conditions, some of the showers were heavy. During the evening, more organised areas of heavy showery weather, with hail and thunder, crossed parts of southern and western Britain. Across Scotland, the rain area edged only very slowly north, with sleet and snow being reported on its northern flank. In the far north of Scotland, the weather stayed cold and showery, with a strong east wind, here too though, the weather turned cloudy with outbreaks of rain or sleet.

Temperatures were considerably above normal at the start of the day in all southern and central areas, but fell back to just above normal with the arrival of the brighter weather. In the north, temperatures were around or below normal. A gust of 62 knots was reported from Mumbles (South Wales) around midday.

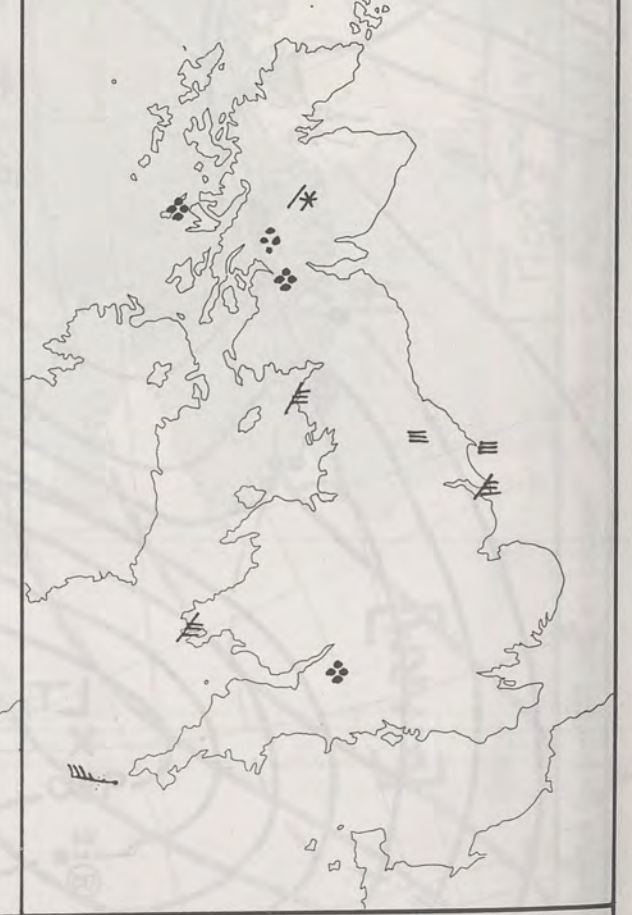

There was more rain in Scotland, some of it heavy, with snow on hills, but in northern Scotland the weather brightened up. In the evening northern Scotland was clear and frosty.

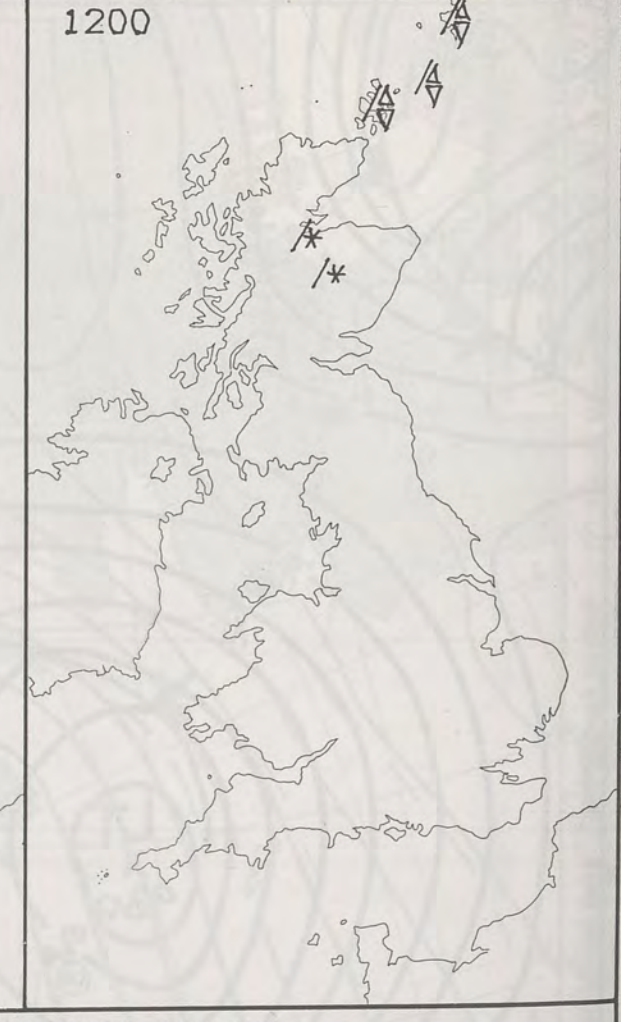
