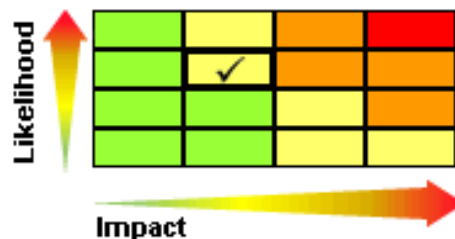
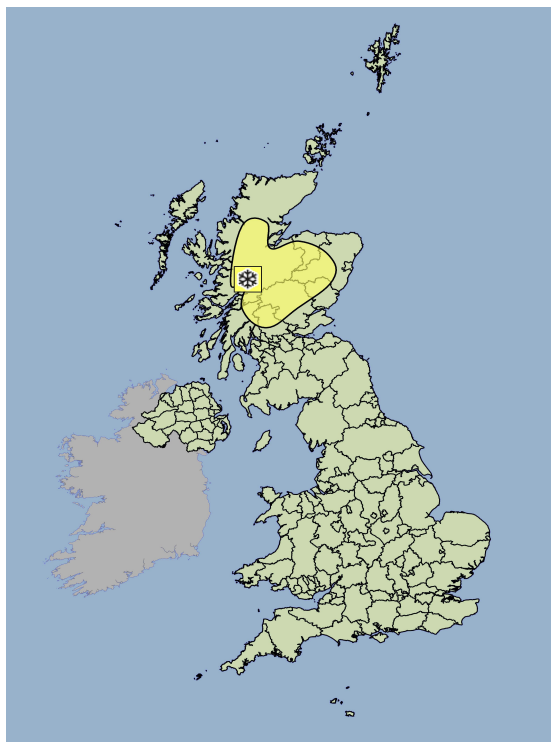


## National Severe Weather Warning Service



### Chief Forecasters Assessment

Milder air across southern Britain looks like making another, more successful attempt, to push north later in the weekend. The warm front bringing this change will be spreading north during Sunday and the first part of Sunday night. However, it looks like stalling for a while over the northern half of Scotland, allowing longer for snowfall to accumulate. At the same time, a minor wave running along the frontal boundary, has the potential to pep up intensities, so some disruptive snow becomes more likely for a time.

The development is rather complex, so updates to the warning are very likely.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Snow**

Valid from **21:00 on Sun, 13th Dec 2015** until **11:00 on Mon, 14th Dec 2015**

A band of rain, moving into southern Scotland on Sunday will be preceded by a short spell of snow. However as it continues northwards overnight and into Monday, a longer spell of snow is likely, especially on higher ground. Accumulations of 2-5 cm are expected above 150m, with perhaps around 10 cm on ground above 300-400m. On low ground, 1 or 2cm could accumulate locally. The snow will become lighter and increasingly confined to higher hills during Monday.

Please be aware of the possibility of localised disruption to travel.
