



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

An area of warm, moist air left behind as the frontal rain band clears is expected to destabilise and become the focus for heavy showers, perhaps organised into long lived bands, There is the risk of 20 mm in the hour, or 40 mm in two hours very locally, though as ever in this sort of situation, some places may well see very little.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **15:00 on Thu, 21st Jun 2012** until **23:59 on Thu, 21st Jun 2012**

Heavy, thundery showers on Thursday afternoon and evening could give torrential downpours. The public are advised to be aware of the risk of flash flooding.
