



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

Light winds, clearing skies and low temperatures have led to the formation of some dense patches of freezing fog over the Central Belt of Scotland. Although the fog will slowly thin later this morning, given the time of year there is the risk that a few patches of fog could persist all day.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Fog**

Valid from **04:30 on Mon, 25th Nov 2013** until **10:00 on Mon, 25th Nov 2013**

Areas of dense freezing fog that have formed across the Central Belt of Scotland overnight will persist through this morning's rush hour giving visibilities of less than 100 metres in places. Although the fog will thin later this morning, there is the risk that some patches of fog may persist for much of today. The public should be aware that the fog may lead to some disruption to transport.

Road users are advised to take extra care, especially as visibilities may well change markedly over short distances.
