


National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment
 An Atlantic frontal system will push east across the UK on Sunday night and during Monday, bringing widespread rain which should become lighter and patchier later on Monday morning. Highest rainfall accumulations are likely to be in western parts, and current saturated ground conditions and high river levels in parts of Devon and Cornwall means that there is potential for some minor disruption due to river flooding here.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **00:05 on Mon, 11th Nov 2013** until **12:00 on Mon, 11th Nov 2013**

Rain spreading eastwards across the UK during Sunday night will become persistent and locally heavy in some areas during Monday before clearing later in the day.

The public should be aware of the potential for localised flooding across Devon and Cornwall on Monday.
