BRITISH RAINFALL.

THE observations of rainfall in the British Isles not having hitherto been properly classified, the Author has undertaken their collection and arrangement, but finds the number of observations so large, and the care requisite to verify them so great, that no time can be fixed for *their* publication. As however he felt that *some* reliable information ought to be circulated as soon as possible, he prepared an abstract of the fall in 1860, and had it privately printed last year. This summary was in such request that he resolved to publish one annually in future, and for the convenience of those who could not obtain the previous table, to reprint the amounts for 1860, along with those for 1861, in this the first of the series.

Accuracy, in such a publication as the present, being of the first importance, it may be desirable to state that the rainfall has in almost every instance been forwarded in monthly, as well as annual depths, by the persons whose names are given as "Authorities;" and that where any discrepancy has been detected, it has been referred to them for explanation or correction. From these returns the tables have been compiled with such care that it is hoped they are almost, if not quite, accurate; the proofs have not only been read in the usual way, but also with the original MSS. of the observers.

Considerable hesitation has been felt respecting the classification of the Stations, mere East and West division being inadequate when the number of places is so great. The groups of Counties arranged for Registration purposes by the Registrars-General of England and Scotland, have been adopted as, on the whole, perhaps least open to objection; the stations in each county being in the order of their latitude from South to North. As there are no registration districts in Ireland, the arrangement in that country is entirely according to latitude.

The Writer has been frequently urged to give the number of rainy days, but such extraordinary differences of opinion exist as to what constitutes a rainy day, that he cannot consider it advisable until some uniformity is established.

The collection of old observations being still in progress, any information respecting rain registers, past or present, will be esteemed a favour.

A few words of a personal nature must close these remarks. It is obvious that these tables could not have been compiled without the cordial co-operation of the observers, their unceasing regularity in recording the observations, and their kindness in forwarding them to the Author. He thanks the contributors heartily for their aid, and trusts that these pages (the product of his leisure hours) will so far meet their approval that he may rely on their assistance in the future.

ON THE RAINFALL OF THE YEARS 1860 AND 1861.

In the following brief remarks, the mean of the ten years, 1850 to 1859, has been adopted as a standard of reference; the fall in those years being within about 5 per cent. of the average during the last half-century; and a larger number of the existing stations being complete for that period than for any other.

The year 1860 was very wet, at the majority of stations about 25 per cent. above the mean. The excess was, however, unequally distributed, for in the North and North-West of Scotland it was scarcely 3 per cent., while on the East coast of England it was more than 40 per cent.

At Bishopwearmouth the mean is 16·91 inches; in 1852 (a very wet year) the fall was 22·39 in., and in 1860, 24·71 in.; at Patrington the corresponding values are 20·65 in., 24·43 in., and 28·58 in.; 1860 being as much above 1852, as 1852 was above the mean.

In 1861, England as a whole, was below the average, and Scotland above it. The English localities most noticeable for excess in 1860 were, to a certain extent, those most deficient in 1861, but the drought was greatest rather to the south of where the excess had been in the previous year; the maximum deficiency (34 per cent.) was at Empingham. From latitude 54° northwards, along the West Coast, the year was even wetter than 1860, being in places more than 40 per cent. above the mean. The fall at Seathwaite was greater than has been recorded since Dr. Miller started the observations sixteen years ago; the average is 126·98 in., the fall in 1861 was 182·58 in. It is worthy of note that the enormous quantity of 35·41 in. was measured in November; this being, like the annual total, hitherto unequalled. The fall in Scotland was above the average, owing to excessive autumnal rains. In that country as in the North-Western counties of England, both 1860 and 1861 have been wetter than usual.

Taking the two years together, the fall has been in Scotland about 13, in England 17, and for the Kingdom generally about 15 per cent. greater than the average of the previous ten years.
