


Asia	Northeast India, Nepal, northern Bangladesh, Bhutan and northern Myanmar	Following recent extreme rainfall across the hills and mountains in this region, further heavy monsoon rainfall is expected through the coming week, particularly towards the end of the week and into the weekend. Across low lying areas totals of 100-200mm are widely expected, with the hills and mountains again likely to see 500-1000mm. One or two places here could even have 1500mm (a metre and a half) of rain. This compares to the typical average at this time of year of 400-500mm across low lying regions, and 1000mm per month over the mountain sites.		
ECMWF Meteogram for one of the worst affected places (near 27N, 91E) showing the extremely large daily rainfall values – peaking over the weekend, then gradually easing a little next week.		Recent rainfall has brought significant flooding across the region, although levels in the larger low lying rivers are now slowly retreating, this additional rain will see levels rise once again in the coming week or two.
