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**SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER**  
After a widespread frost, moderate or severe in parts of Scotland and Cumbria, it was a rather cold day, particularly in eastern counties of Britain but most places were dry and much of England and Wales had a sunny day. In eastern counties though, from Humberside to Kent and inland to London it was cloudier with a few showers along the coast. Extreme southwestern parts of England and Wales remained cloudy with a little occasional drizzle. Northern Ireland, the far north and west coast of Scotland remained cloudy with some occasional light rain or drizzle. Eastern and Central areas of Scotland were dry with a little sunshine in places.

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**SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER**  
After some frost overnight it was generally a little warmer but cloudier in most areas, particularly in the north and west where there was light drizzle here and there. Thicker cloud also spread south along the east coast of England and brought light rain and drizzle to parts of East Anglia and Kent. There were breaks in the cloud and some sunshine in places with good shelter to the north and west particularly in the east and southeast of Scotland, north-east England, parts of the Midlands and southern England. In the Southern Uplands of Scotland fog, which formed last night, took most of the day to clear.

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**SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER**  
Northern and western Scotland were cloudy with rain and drizzle and some coastal and hill fog. Southern and eastern Scotland and Northern Ireland were mainly cloudy and mostly dry but with rain and drizzle in many places during the evening. Wales and England were mainly cloudy though sheltered parts of southwest England had some sunshine. There was some light rain or drizzle in places especially near western coasts and hills with some coastal and hill fog and a few fog patches in the Midlands early in the day. Northern areas were quite windy and all areas were mild.

**SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER**  
Rain and drizzle over much of Scotland and Northern Ireland at first moved southwards across the rest of the country during the day, reaching North Wales, the North Midlands, and Norfolk by dawn and most of southern England by mid-morning. Brighter, colder weather with some showers spread to Scotland and Northern Ireland by dawn and all remaining parts by early afternoon. There were some showers, locally wintry over the Scottish mountains and in northeast Scotland. Winds were strong near north-facing coasts.

**SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER**  
Much of Britain had a dry night, but there were some showers, particularly in those areas with the sea not far to the north or northwest of them. During the day there was a lot of cloud over the British Isles and very little sunshine, with the brightest areas in southern England. Many places stayed dry, but there were showers. In the far north some fell as snow, and in the evening Shetland had a spell of persistent snow. Late in the afternoon rain reached the Isles of Scilly and then spread to South Wales, southwest England and the Channel Islands during the evening. It was rather cold in most places.

**SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER**

Some eastern and northeastern areas had a frost early in the day, but generally it was fairly cloudy overnight with some showery rain - and snow in Shetland. Northeast Scotland had a cold, bright day with hail and snow showers. It was also quite bright over parts of England, especially the south, but most of the British Isles had a rather cold, mostly cloudy day with some showery outbreaks of rain. 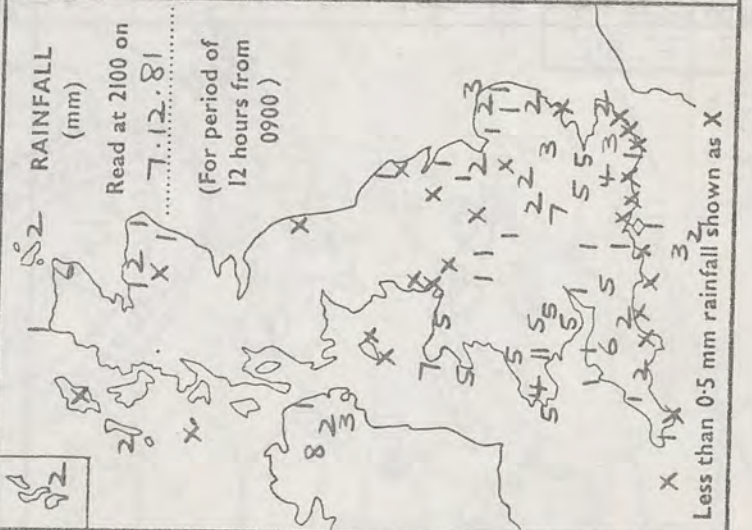
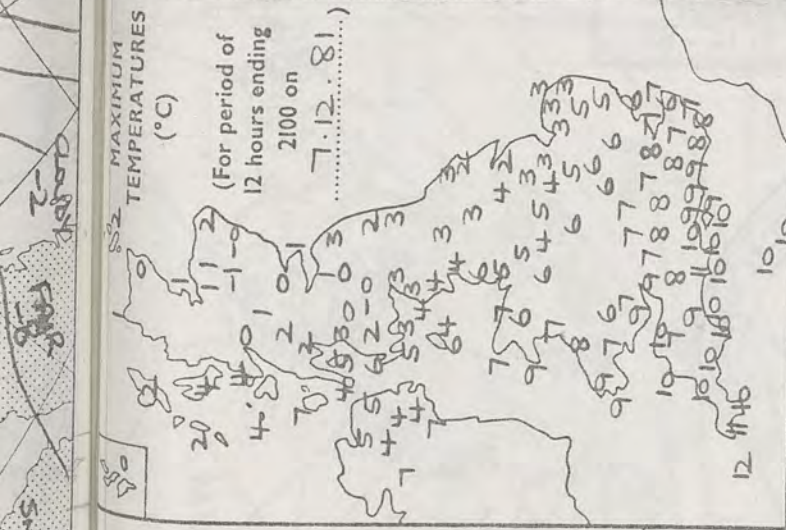






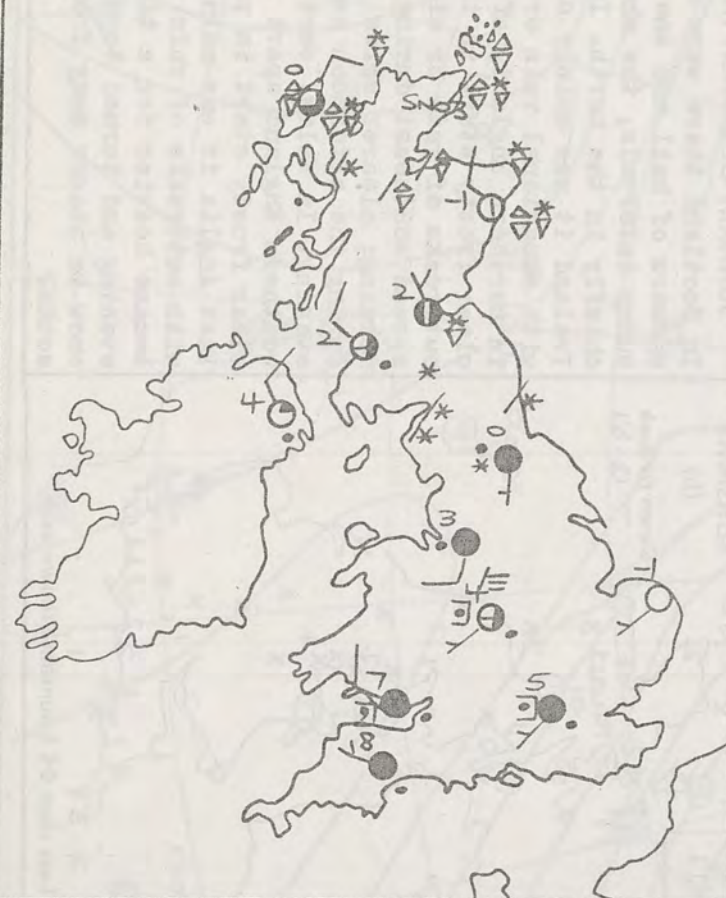
**SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER**

In Scotland there were scattered showers of hail and snow and sunny intervals, the showers chiefly in the north. In Northern Ireland it was mainly cloudy with occasional rain or sleet. In northern England, after a clear frosty start in the east outbreaks of rain or sleet spread southeast during the morning; clearer skies followed during the afternoon and evening. In Wales, central and southern England apart from a clear frosty start in parts of East Anglia it was mainly cloudy with outbreaks of rain which became heavier for a time in the evening and turned to sleet or snow in places away from the south.

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**SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER**  
In southern Britain rain and sleet turned to snow in the early hours especially in the South Midlands, and most of southeast and central southern England but close to Channel coasts and in southwestern counties it was mostly rain. Brighter dry weather spread from the northwest to reach east Kent by mid-afternoon. In southwest England there was rain in places in the evening. In all northern regions after a frosty night, there was a good deal of dry sunny weather but with occasional snow showers in coastal regions and in northern Scotland heavy and frequent snow showers. It was very cold.

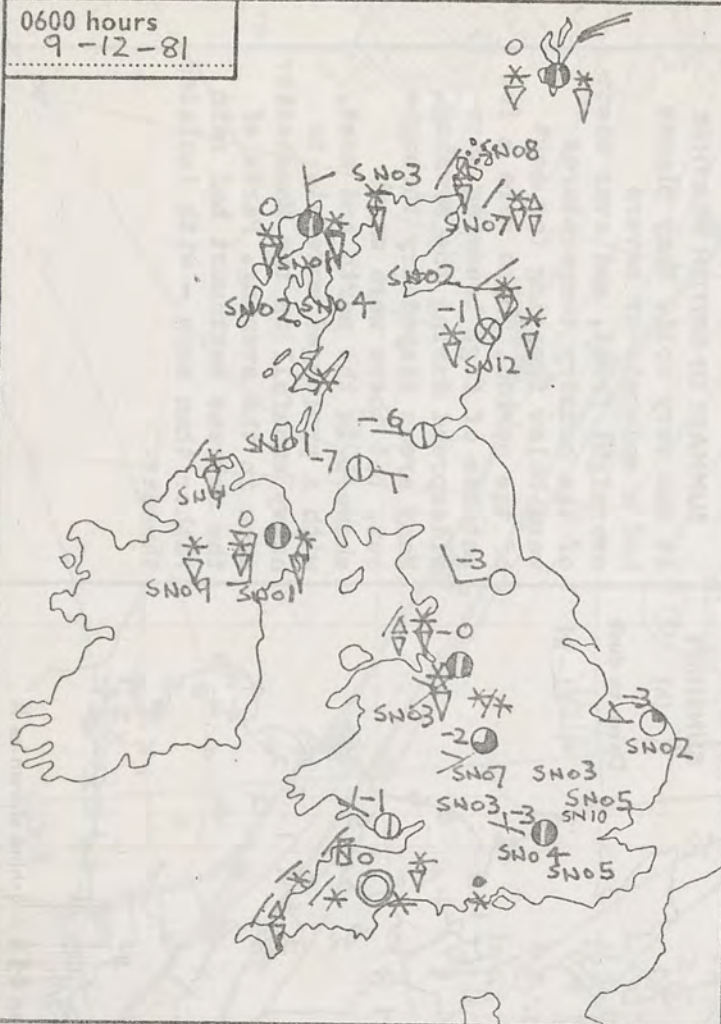




**SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER**  
It was very cold. Many places had a moderate or severe overnight frost, and over most of the country temperatures were below freezing for most of the period. There were a few patches of fog, becoming more widespread during the evening. Many areas stayed dry throughout, but there were snow showers in the north and west, with a prolonged moderate to heavy snowfall in the Manchester area in the evening. Parts of the extreme southwest had rain rather than snow - with isolated thunder.

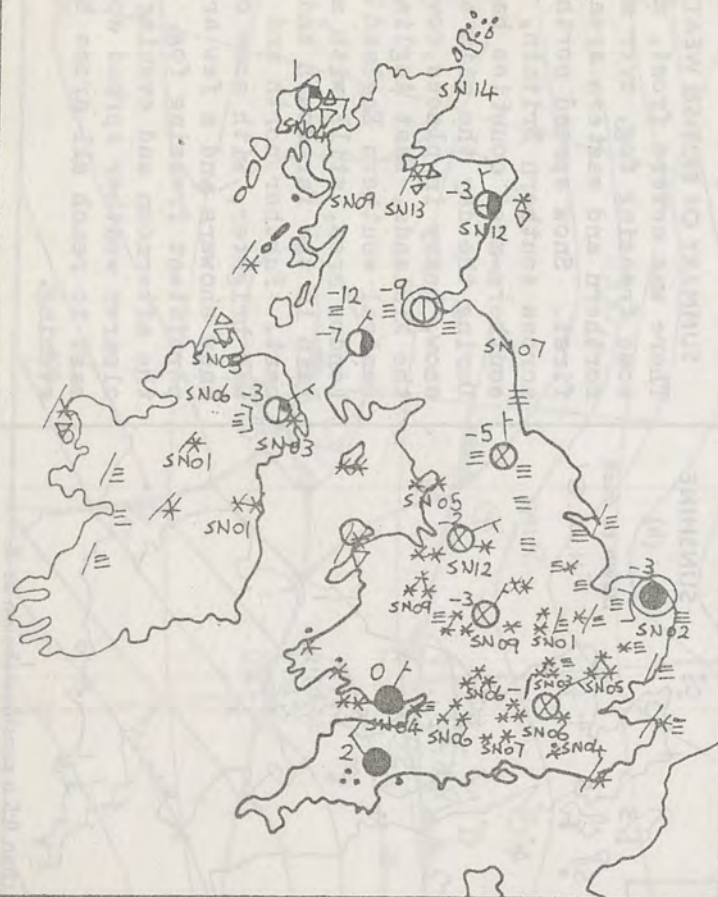


**SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER**

There was severe frost, and some freezing fog, over many northern and eastern areas at first. Snow spread northeast across southern Britain, though southern-most counties had rain. During the day the main area of snow, heavy in places, covered the Midlands, East Anglia, central southern England and the London area, still with mostly rain in the far south and southeast. Further north and west it was brighter, with some coastal snow showers and a few areas of persistent freezing fog. During the afternoon and evening, the clearer weather spread southeast to reach all areas by late evening.



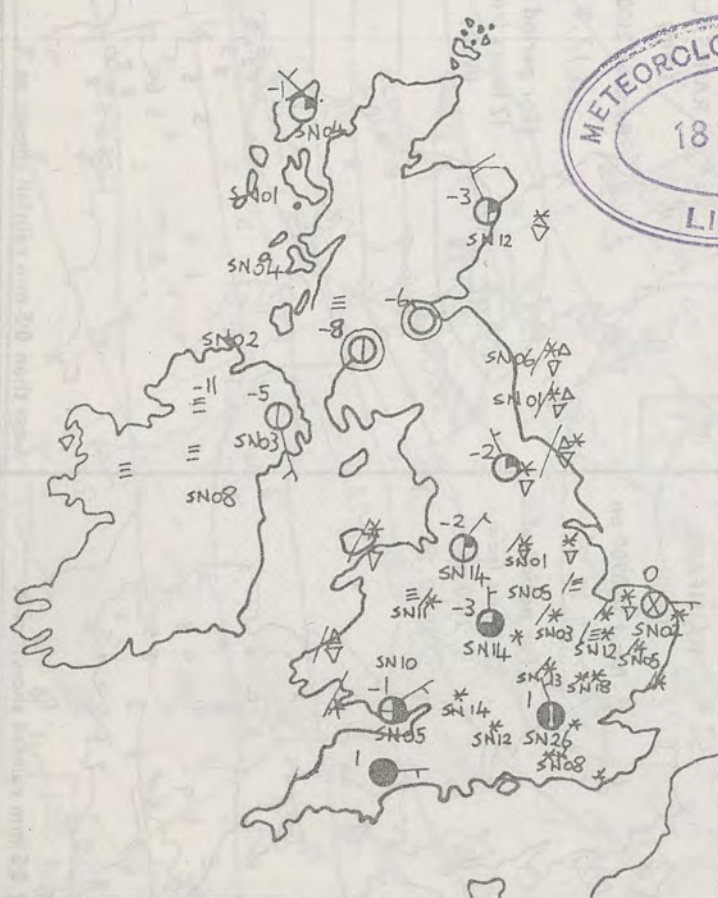

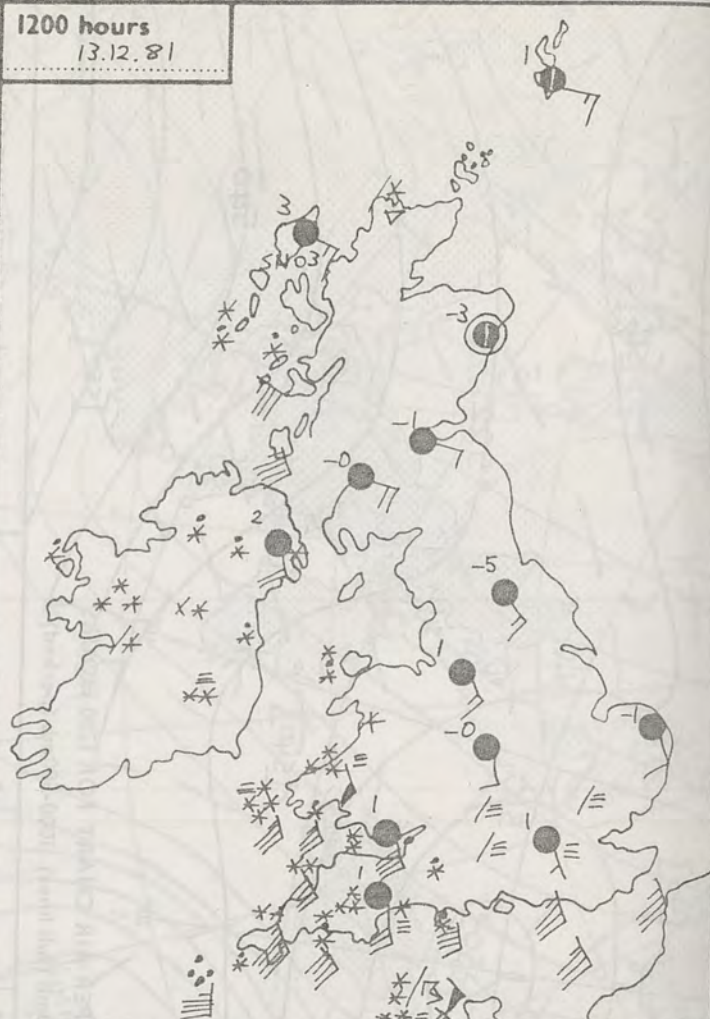
**SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER**  
After a very severe frost in many places temperatures rose rapidly as southeasterly winds developed during the morning. The winds reached severe gale force in the southwest and became strong elsewhere as periods of snow spread from the west during the day, giving blizzard conditions in places. The snow reached all but extreme northeast Scotland by late evening. During the afternoon, milder weather reached southwest England and spread quickly east to many southern parts of England and Wales during the evening, so that in the south the snow turned to rain with a steady thaw, and flooding in the southwest.

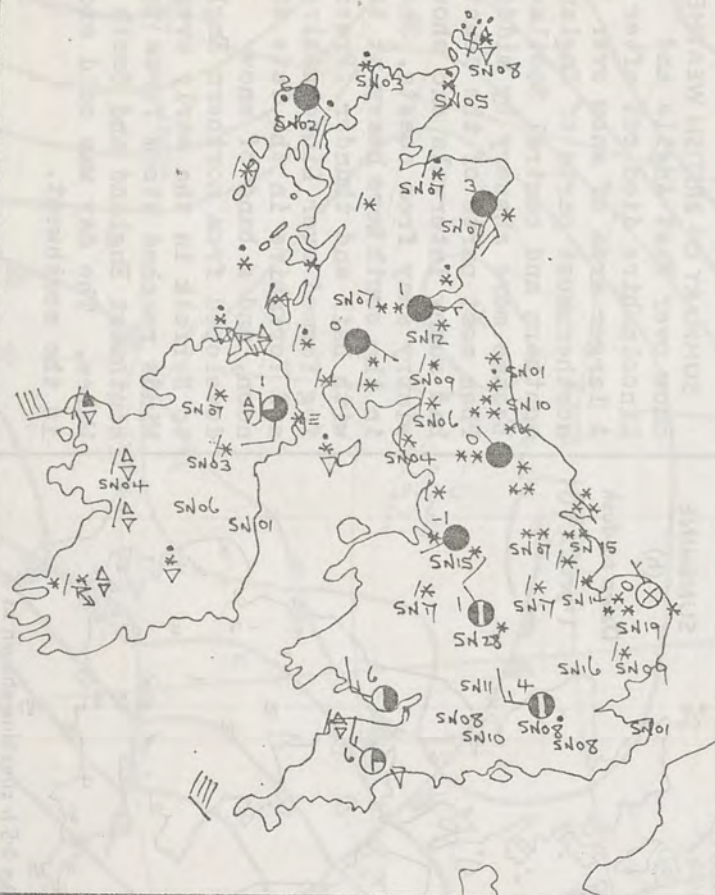




**SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER**  
Snow over East Anglia and Lincolnshire died out after dawn. A larger area of snow over northernmost parts of England, southern and central Scotland became more showery by midday. Then most parts of the country had sunny intervals and showers, wintry away from coasts. Showers in the south were heavy at times with hail and thunder. Freezing fog formed over Lincolnshire and Yorkshire in the late afternoon, and a band of snow developed from northern England to Norfolk in the early evening. Winds reached storm force in southwest England and South Wales. The day was cold except in the southwest.

**SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER**  
In southern counties of England and Wales there were scattered rain showers overnight. The day was cloudy and in southwest England rain persisted much of the day. Rain spread to most regions bordering the Channel later with sleet in places. Over the rest of the UK the night was mainly dry and in the Midlands and eastern England rain, sleet and snow ceased in the early hours. Freezing fog patches formed in northeast England and southern Scotland. During the day it remained dry with sunny intervals in most places but there were isolated wintry showers. **SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER**  
In the Channel Islands and Cornwall there were outbreaks of rain occasionally heavy with thunder. During the evening rain spread to other southern counties and away from southern coasts there was snow. Elsewhere it was predominantly dry with only isolated wintry showers, mainly in eastern England. In western Scotland there were isolated thunderstorms. 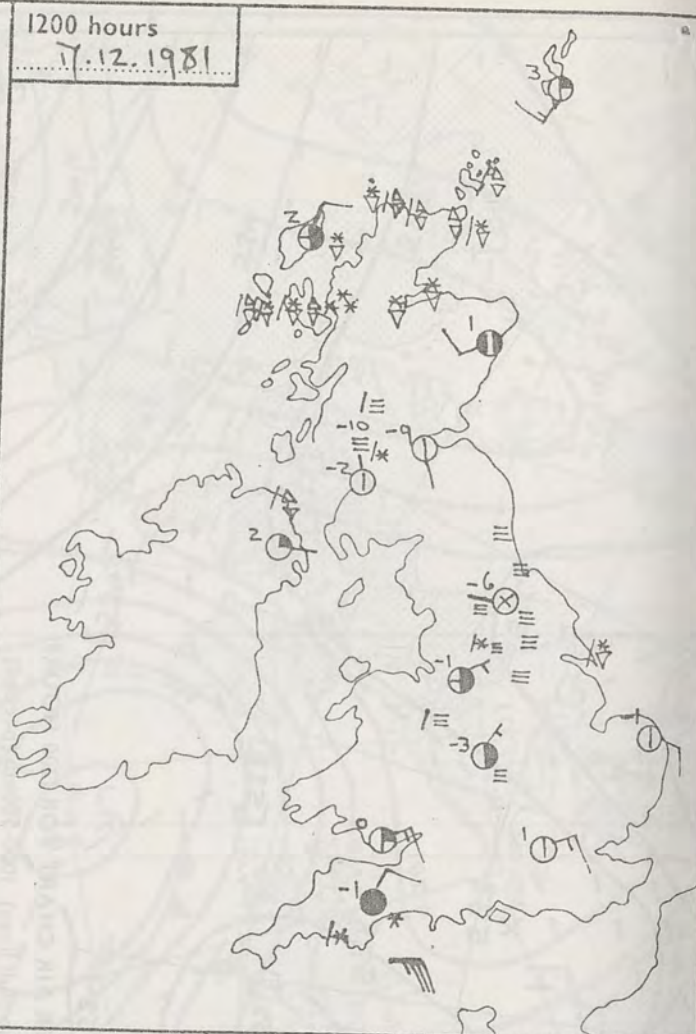
Rain with some snow inland moved east from South Devon to the Isle of Wight and had cleared by dawn. Elsewhere, apart from wintry showers in northern Scotland, it was another night of severe frost with widespread fog from the Midlands to East Anglia across northeast England to central Scotland. 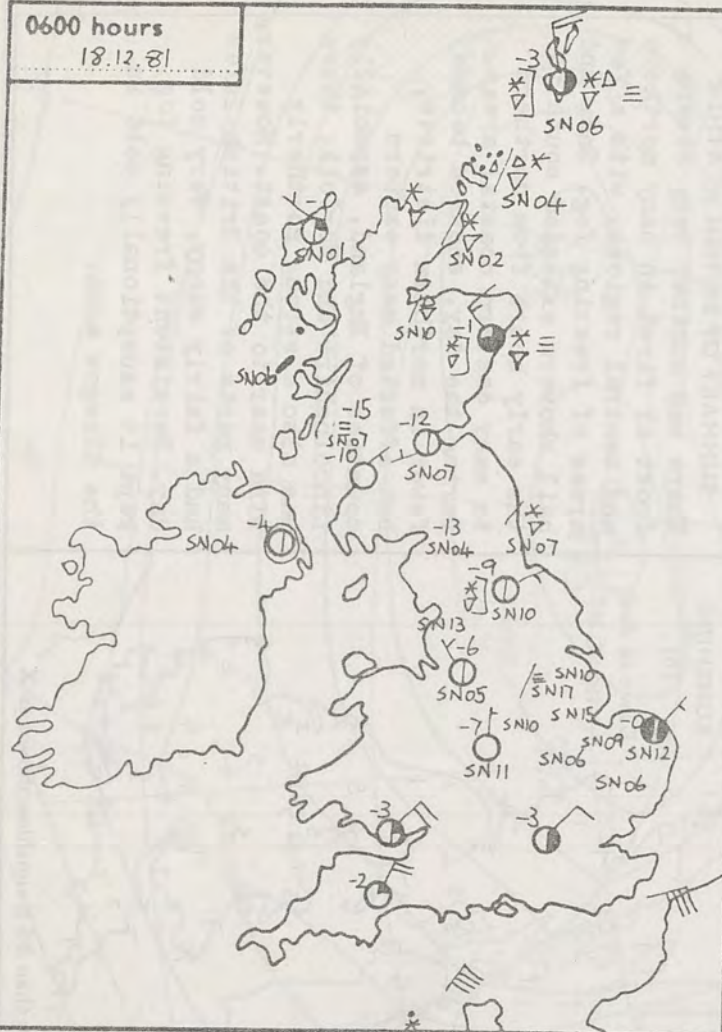




**SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER**  
There was another very severe frost at first in many northern and central regions, with a few areas of freezing fog. Snow and hail showers extended south in the early hours from northern to many eastern coastal areas. During the day, showers became fewer in northern districts, but affected many eastern counties of England, especially Lincolnshire and Norfolk; there was also a strong northerly wind near to the coast. However, many parts of the British Isles had a fairly sunny, very cold day. Persistent freezing fog kept it exceptionally cold in the Glasgow area.

# **SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER**

After another severe frost overnight, the day was very cold and mostly sunny in eastern and central England, but became rather less cold and cloudy elsewhere as freshening southerly winds brought air of Atlantic origin across most places. The winds reached storm force in parts of the southwest in the evening. Rain spread to most western coastal regions during the afternoon and evening, turning to snow as it gradually spread inland to other western and northern areas by midnight. Amounts of snow were not great, but there was considerable drifting of old snow.



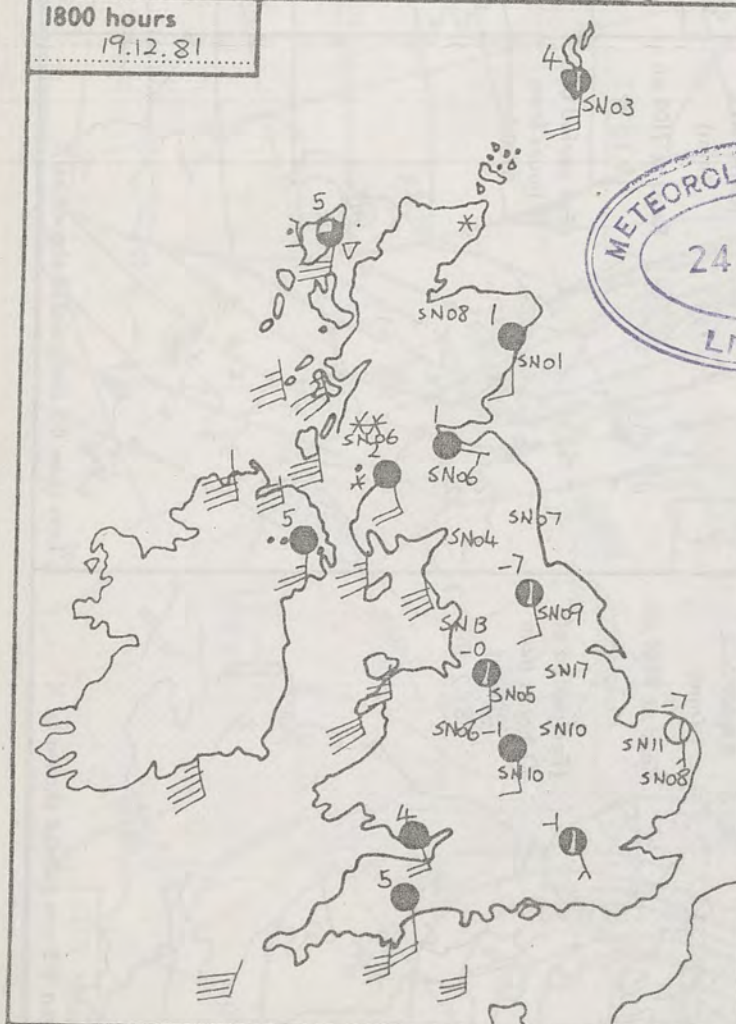

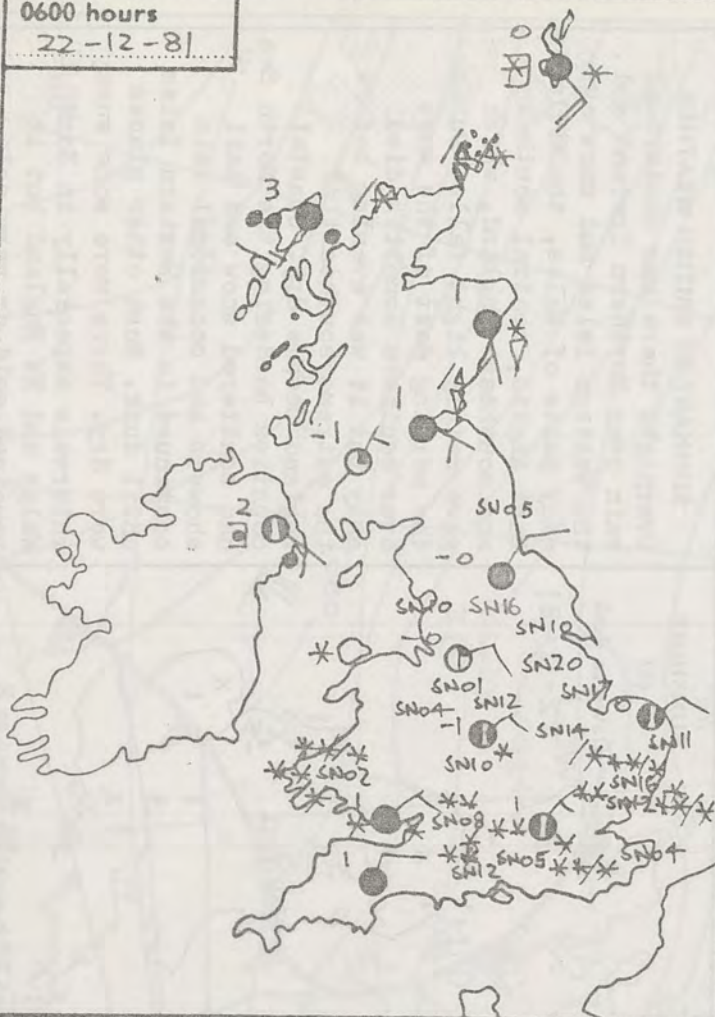


**SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER**

Overnight there was occasional rain over Northern Ireland and the Western Isles and snow over many parts of Wales, the Midlands East Anglia, central southern and southeast England, which gave mainly light falls. **SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER**

Many places had a severe frost at first, and there were areas of freezing fog, especially over central England. **SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER**  
After a severe frost at first, many places were sunny. However, there were areas of persistent freezing fog, especially over central and eastern England and parts of central Scotland. Freezing fog, dense in places, persisted until late in the day over much of the north-eastern corner of England. Elsewhere, after a widespread severe frost in the east, temperatures mostly rose a little higher than recently as southerly winds freshened; there were gales in parts of the west later. It was mostly cloudy; there were a few light wintry showers in the north, and some rain over Northern Ireland and the far southwest of Britain, especially in the evening.



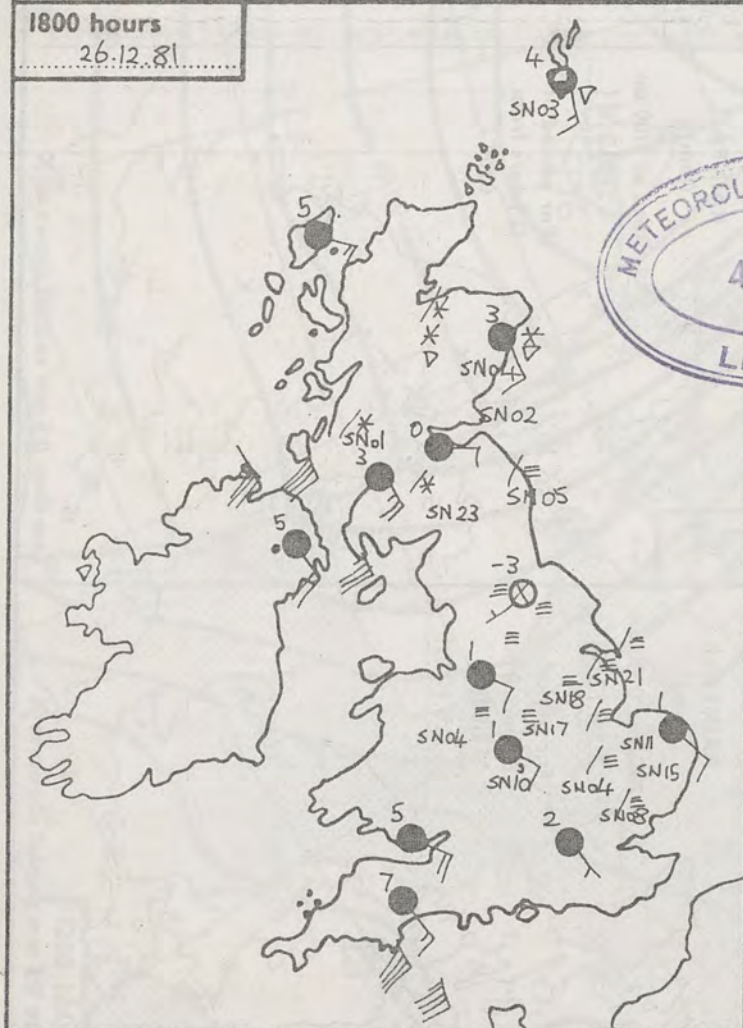

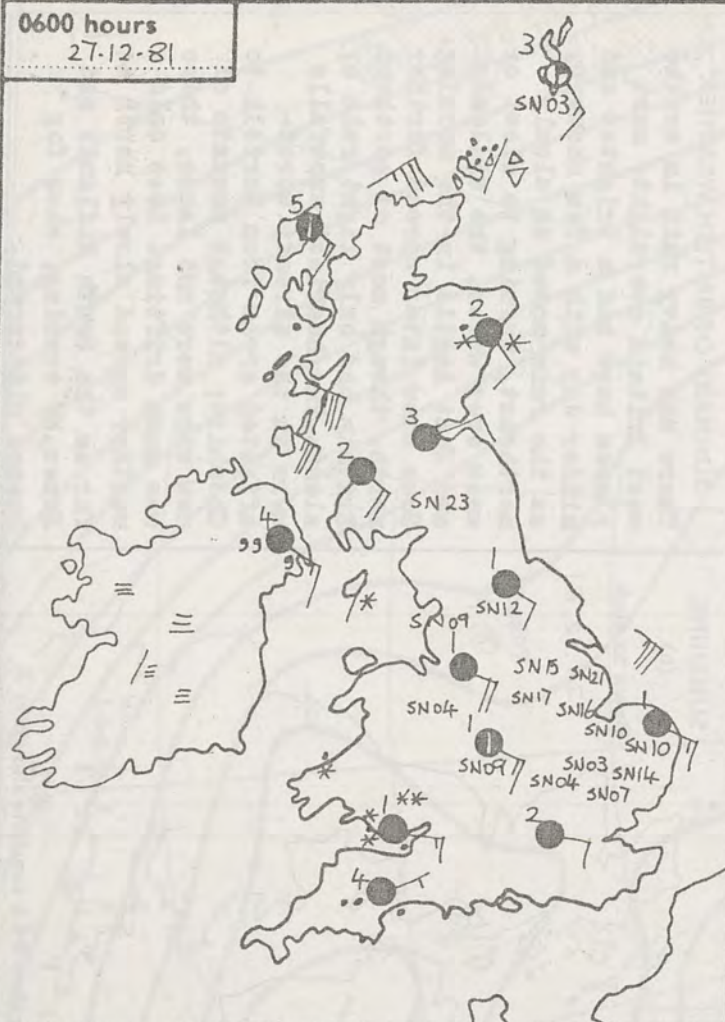




**SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER**  
There was heavy rain in south-west Britain overnight; most places here had a brighter and milder day with a few showers, as the rain moved on slowly northeast, turning to sleet or snow over Wales, the Midlands and East Anglia in the morning. Some snow later spread further north, though most of northern Britain had only light rain or sleet. The heaviest snowfalls were in the already worst-affected areas from Norfolk to Cheshire; although amounts of new snow were not large, there was much drifting. Less cold weather spread slowly north as far as the South Midlands and Essex by evening, when fog became widespread.



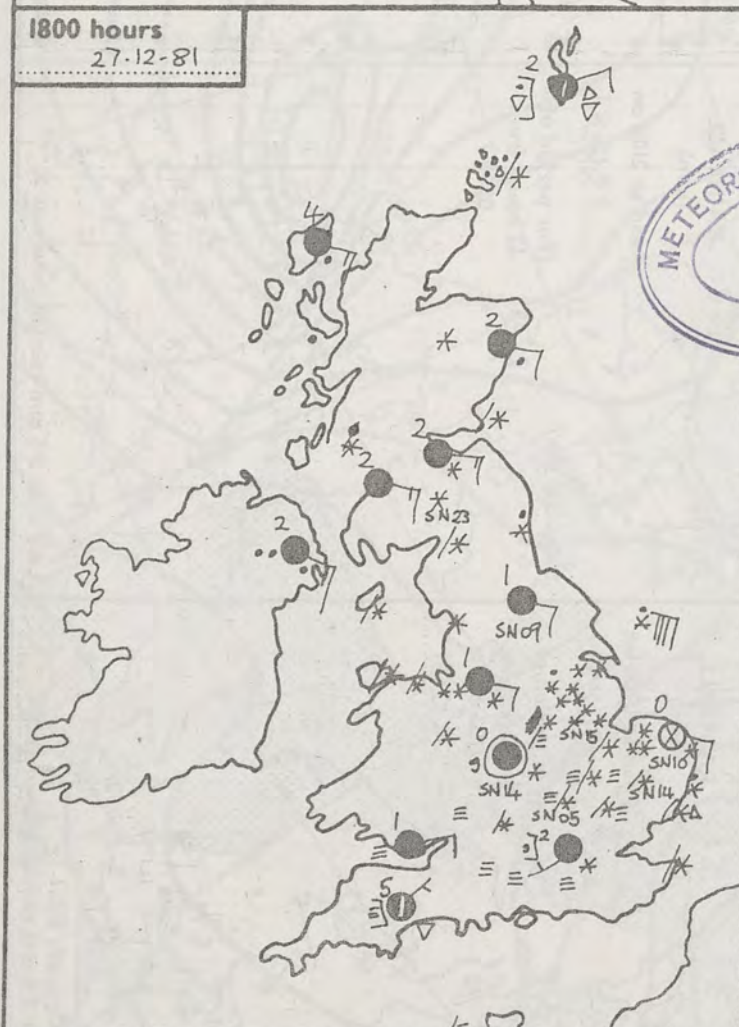
