







NOTES ON THE INFORMATION CONTAINED IN THE BRITISH AND INTERNATIONAL SECTIONS OF THE DAILY WEATHER REPORT.

Millibars. Inches.



Pressure.—The distribution of barometric pressure at Mean Sea Level is shown by means of isobars which are drawn for intervals of 5 millibars. Values in millibars may be converted to mercury inches by the scale given in the margin.

Temperature.—Temperature is specified in degrees Fahrenheit. Temperatures are shown on the charts by means of figures written alongside the circles which indicate the positions of the stations.

Upper Air Temperature.—Temperature at different levels in the free atmosphere up to 20,000 feet is shown graphically on the Upper Air Supplement. On the diagram, heights are given both in feet and kilometres and temperatures in degrees Fahrenheit and Absolute. The lines marked "Anti-cyclonic," "Cyclonic," "Summer," and "Winter," indicate the normal fall of temperature with height or lapse rate under the conditions indicated. The oblique line marked "Adiabatic" shows the lapse rate for dry air ascending or descending under adiabatic conditions, i.e. without communication of heat from external sources. The lapse rate under these circumstances is very approximately 5.5° F. per 1,000 feet, or 10a per kilometre. A lapse rate greater than this value indicates instability of the atmosphere.

Cloud Types.—In the inset maps of the British Section and in the cloud maps of the Upper Air Supplement the amounts of different types of cloud are shown. The forms, Cumulus (Cu.), Nimbus (Nb.), Strato-cumulus (St.-cu.), Cumulo-nimbus (Cu.-nb.), and Stratus (St.) are set out on the chart of Lower Cloud. The forms, Alto-cumulus (A.-cu.), Alto-stratus (A.-st.), Cirrus (Ci.), Cirro-cumulus (Ci.-cu.), and Cirro-stratus (Ci.-st.) are given under Upper Cloud. The proportion of the sky covered with cloud of the different types is shown by numbers (tenths of the sky covered).

For description of Cloud Types reference may be made to "Meteorological Glossary," M.O. 225 ii, and "Cloud Forms," M.O. 233.


Weather.—In describing the distribution of weather over a district or during an interval of time, such as a day, descriptive adjectives are used with the following meanings, no reference to precipitation being implied.

- Fine—mainly b and bc of the Beaufort notation (*see previous page*).
- Fair or fair generally—mainly bc and c.
- Cloudy—combinations of bc, c and o, c predominating.
- Overcast—mainly c and o.
- Dull—overcast with low heavy cloud.
- Varying or variable cloud—combinations of b, bc, c, and o.

Wind.—All wind directions specified in the reports are true, not magnetic compass bearings. The arrows indicating wind direction are drawn to fly with the wind. Wind velocities are shown on the charts of the British Section and Upper Air Supplement in m.p.h. by the numbers placed within the small circles. In the International Section velocities are not shown. In both Sections the number of feathers on the arrows denotes wind force by Beaufort number.

Upper Winds.—The direction and velocity of the wind are given in the Upper Air Supplement for heights of 1,000 feet, 2,000 feet, 5,000 feet, 8,000 feet, 10,000 feet, 15,000 feet. The data are based on Pilot Balloon ascents made at Stations of the Royal Air Force and of the Meteorological Section, R.E., and also at the Observatories of the Office; supplemented by data from French Stations received by wireless from the Eiffel Tower.

In the forecasts of upper wind, direction is specified in points and in degrees from true north measured through East 90°, South 180°, West 270° to North 360°. (*See diagram in margin.*)

GENERAL INFERENCE from observations received up to 10 a.m.

There is a depression over Iceland spreading south-eastward, which will probably cause moderate or fresh westerly winds and mild, dull somewhat rainy weather over the whole country.






















NOTES ON THE WEATHER OF YESTERDAY.



































NOTES ON THE WEATHER OF YESTERDAY.

The weather was fine and good amounts of sunshine were reported generally, Yarmouth recording 14.2 hours.
