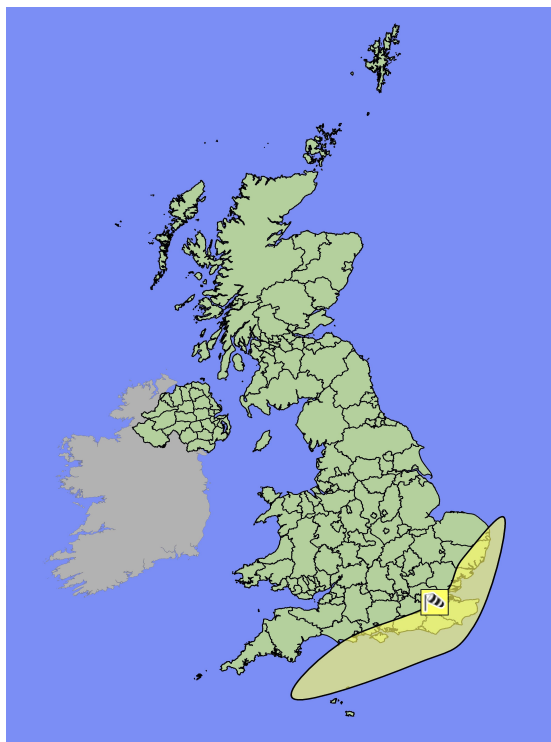

Chief Forecasters Assessment

60 to 70 mph gusts are likely to be largely confined to coastal areas and a few miles inland. Such winds may cause some problems, especially given that the most recent winters have seen relatively few gales across this area.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Alert of Wind**

Valid from **20:00 on Mon, 12th Dec 2011** until **05:00 on Tue, 13th Dec 2011**

Gusts to severe gale force seem likely late on Monday evening, into the early hours of Tuesday, easing from the west thereafter. The wind will be accompanied by heavy rainfall.

The public is advised that some travel disruption may result.
