


National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

An area of low pressure will develop just to the northwest of Ireland on Sunday evening as warm air from the south and cold air from the north come together. This will push a band of heavy rain across Scotland during Sunday night and Monday with the largest accumulations over the higher ground of Perth and Kinross, Angus and Aberdeenshire. 20-40 mm is expected quite widely with isolated totals of 60 mm likely in the hills. This will lead to standing water and surface water flooding in places.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **04:00 on Mon, 06th Oct 2014** until **23:45 on Mon, 06th Oct 2014**

An area of heavy rain, accompanied by strong to gale force winds, will move eastwards across Scotland on Sunday night and Monday. The rain will continue into Monday evening in the northeast though winds will ease, while drier weather will spread into the west of the warning area. The public should be aware of the risk of surface water flooding and some disruption to travel, especially where drainage is reduced by fallen leaves. Some minor river flooding is also possible in the east of the warning area.
