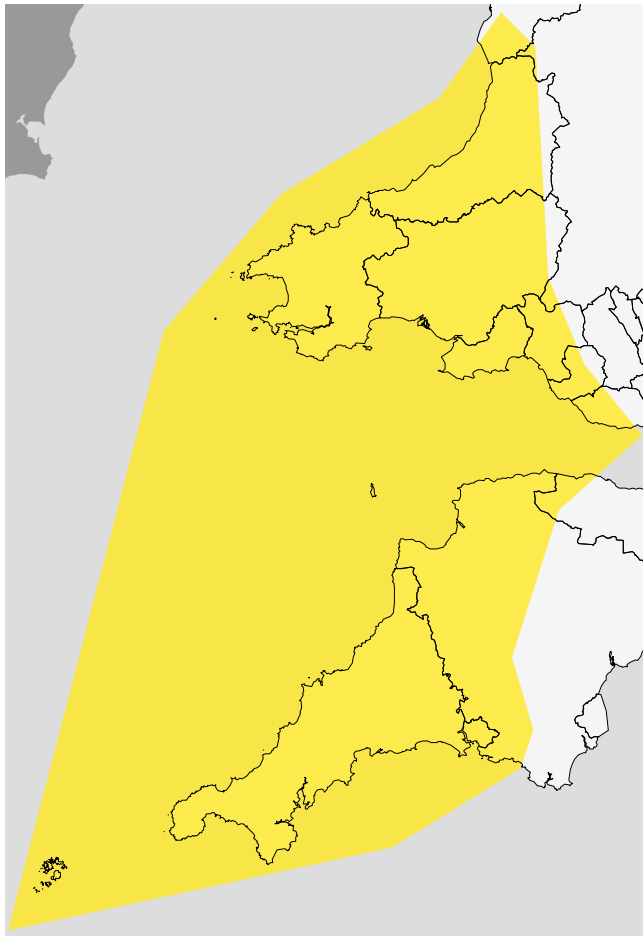


**Yellow warning**

**Strong easterly winds may lead to some disruption.****What to expect**

- Some short term loss of power and other services, such as mobile phone coverage, is possible
- It's likely that some coastal routes, sea fronts and coastal communities may be affected by spray and/or large waves

Further details

Strong easterly winds will develop across southwest England and parts of Wales during Monday evening and overnight before gradually easing through Tuesday morning.

Winds will gust to around 50 mph at times, especially over and to the lee of high ground. The strongest winds are expected to the west of Dartmoor and across parts of west Cornwall where gusts of 55-60 mph are likely which may lead to some disruption.
