		<p>It was a mainly dry night across the U.K., although showers did persist across northern Scotland. Showers fed through the Cheshire Gap, turning heavy and thundery. Variable amounts of cloud covered the country, with some clear spells at times.</p> <p>A moderate to locally fresh northerly airflow made it a cooler night than of late.</p> <p>Through the day, the scattered showers continued, but it stayed largely dry with some sunny spells. In the south-west and southern Wales there was a lot of sunshine, and only isolated light showers.</p> <p>Across the rest of England, Wales and Northern Ireland scattered showers continued to develop, with some across central and northern England turning thundery at times.</p> <p>Scotland saw some breezier and cloudier conditions, with showers merging into longer spells of rain at times, especially in the east, whilst western areas saw drier weather.</p>

0600 GMT 02 SEPTEMBER 2015 SIG WEATHER	1200 GMT 02 SEPTEMBER 2015 SIG WEATHER	<p>Summary of UK Weather for Wednesday 02 September 2015. It was a mostly dry night, with clear skies predominantly in the south of the country. Further north, a scattering of showers affected eastern parts of Scotland and north-east England. Showers spread through the Wirral, turning heavy for a time. Some isolated mist and fog patches formed in the south, where skies cleared and temperatures fell. As the sun rose, the mist and fog quickly burnt off, giving a bright start in the south, but a rather cloudy start further north. Showery rain continued to affect north-east Wales through the morning, meanwhile the rest of England and Wales saw a day of sunshine and showers. These turned heavy and thundery in places during the afternoon. More in the way of cloud covered Scotland and Northern Ireland, with a few light showers moving in on the strong northerly wind. Through the evening the showers across England and Wales gradually receded to the coast, allowing some clearer spells to develop. Meanwhile, it remained windy across Scotland, with a few showers. Temperatures were generally below average for the time of year.</p>

There were some showery outbreaks of rain for eastern England and parts of the Wirral, accompanied with strong winds. Towns and cities mostly stayed in double figures Celsius, though it was significantly colder than this in the countryside. Most places went on to stay cloudy all day, with only limited bright or sunny breaks - mostly in the west. Thicker cloud affected eastern parts, with outbreaks of rain moving steadily south throughout, heavy at times over the Norfolk coast. Many other parts of the country were dry, with only isolated light showers developing. It was generally breezy, particularly around coasts, with some gusty winds in the far north, and along the east coast.</p>

It was a mostly cloudy night with a few showers, chiefly around eastern coastal areas of England and Scotland. There were some breaks in the cloud, though most of these were focused around Irish Sea coasts. The winds fell quite light inland, though they remained stronger around coasts, especially in the east. There was a good deal of cloud around through the day, particularly across eastern coastal areas, where there were a few showers during the morning. There were some decent sunny spells around, and these were most prevalent across Wales and western parts of England. A weak weather front did push south across Scotland through the afternoon, bringing thicker cloud and some patchy rain and drizzle. This cloud and increasingly patchy rain then extended into Northern Ireland and northern England through the evening. To the south of this, it was a largely dry evening, with variable cloud cover. During the early hours, there were clear skies across southern parts of England and Wales. It was cloudier elsewhere, with patchy light rain and drizzle. This moved southwards overnight, reaching the far south by dawn. Some clearer spells followed into Scotland, Northern Ireland and northern England, allowing it to turn chilly in places. The thicker cloud and patchy light rain cleared away from the far south of England during the morning. A cool northerly airflow then brought variable amounts of cloud to most areas, giving some bright or sunny spells. The best of the sunshine was confined to western Scotland, Northern Ireland, Wales and the West Country during the afternoon. Meanwhile a few light showers fed down the North Sea, chiefly into Norfolk and Suffolk. The cloud was thick enough to produce some patchy light rain and drizzle at times, particularly down the North Sea coast.</p> <p>Meanwhile, clearer skies towards the west through Wales allowed temperatures to fall into low single figures Celsius, with patchy mist and fog in places.</p> <p>A few light showers ran along the English Channel into the south coast of Devon around dawn.</p> <p>It remained largely cloudy across many parts, and breezy around the coast, with just a few sunny spells. Mist and fog formed quite widely across north-eastern and southern England into the early hours, but it was cloudier for Northern Ireland, Wales and south-western England. Temperatures fell into low single figures Celsius under the clearer skies. The early low cloud gradually lifted and broke up to leave another fine, albeit breezy, day across much of the country, with a good deal of sunshine. However, thicker cloud continued to affect parts of eastern Scotland, where a few drizzly showers continued. Up the western coast winds reached 40 knots.


Temperatures generally stayed in double figures Celsius.

Clearer skies allowed temperatures to dip, with a very localised air frost in some parts.


Through the day outbreaks of heavy rain and showers continued across southern parts of the U.K., especially south-west England and south Wales.

Heavy, thundery showers affected the south-east Midlands into Lincolnshire, with hourly rainfall totals in excess of 10 mm at times.

Elsewhere it was drier, but there were a few sharp showers, along with some persistent rain across the far north of Scotland.

It was a windy day for many southern areas, with a maximum gust of 63 knots at Needles, Isle of Wight.

During the evening heavy rain continued across parts of south-west England and south Wales, with a few showers further north. It stayed windy across southern England too, with winds strengthening across the south-east.


It was a dry night everywhere, with clear skies for many, and just a little patchy cloud in places. Along the south coast, and around the north-west of Scotland it remained windy through the night.
