


# National Severe Weather Warning Service



### Chief Forecasters Assessment

A deepening area of low pressure is expected to develop over the Atlantic early on Wednesday and then track towards the Faeroe Islands through the day, This will bring the risk of severe southerly gales for the far northwest of Scotland with a sharp wind veer into the west on the passage of an active frontal system during the mid afternoon.

The timing of the deepening of this low pressure system is critical for the wind speeds that could occur, so further updates to the warning are possible over the next 24 hours.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Wind**

Valid from **10:00 on Wed, 11th Mar 2015** until **16:00 on Wed, 11th Mar 2015**

Another spell of severe gales will reach the Western Isles and far northwest of mainland Scotland late Wednesday morning, before easing again later in the afternoon. Gusts of 60-70 mph are likely, with isolated 75 mph gusts for the most exposed locations.

The public are advised of the possibility of disruption to transport.
