


National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

A deeply unstable southwesterly airstream is covering Wales. Bands of heavy and at times, thundery showers are expected to move northeastwards across Wales and may become prolonged, particularly in the south and west. 10-15 mm of rain is likely to fall in less than an hour in places, with locally 20-30 mm possible in 3 hours or less. The showers should largely die out from the west in the early hours of Friday.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **18:00 on Thu, 16th Oct 2014** until **03:00 on Fri, 17th Oct 2014**

Showers are likely to become heavy and prolonged at times across parts of Wales on Thursday evening into the early hours of Friday. Although some areas may largely miss the showers, some locally torrential downpours could occur. The public should be aware of the risk of some locally difficult traveling conditions due to surface water. In addition lightning may prove an additional hazard and perhaps also gusty winds.
