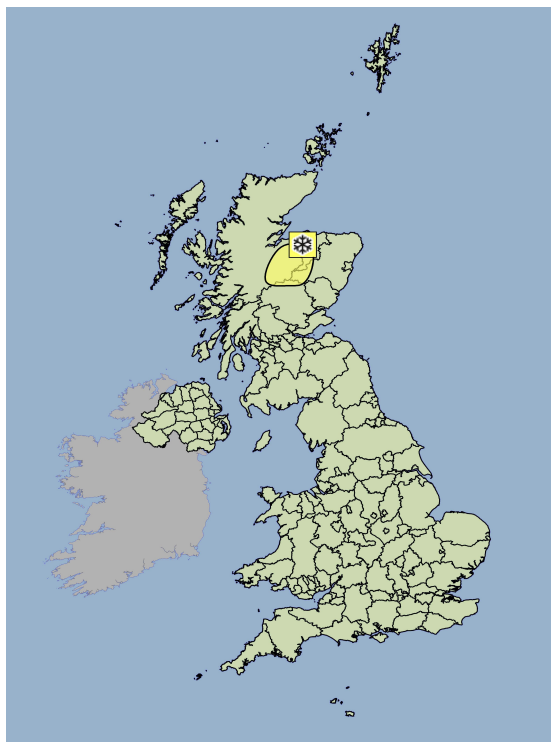




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

Frequent and at times heavy showers will be driven across northern Scotland by strong northerly winds. The showers will fall as snow at times, chiefly above 200 metres, with an increasing risk of snow accumulating on roads during the evening.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Snow**

Valid from **10:00 on Wed, 20th Nov 2013** until **23:59 on Wed, 20th Nov 2013**

Showers during Wednesday are likely to fall as snow above 200-300 metres in northern Scotland, with some temporary accumulations of 1-3 cm of snow on roads above 250 metres during daylight hours, but 2-5 cm is possible this evening with 5-10 cm above 400-500 metres. The snow showers will be accompanied by strong northerly winds.

The public should be aware of the potential for difficult driving conditions and some minor travel disruption.
