



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment
 There remains some uncertainty about the extent and intensity of the snow showers but it looks as if most of them will be in the north on Friday but with an increasing risk of snow showers across northwest England and north Wales on Saturday.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Alert of Snow**
 Valid from **00:00 on Fri, 09th Dec 2011** until **23:59 on Sat, 10th Dec 2011**

A cold north northwesterly airstream will become established across the UK. Snow showers are likely to affect many parts, giving accumulations to low levels in the north. Accumulations will tend to be confined to higher ground across north Wales and much of northwest England. Untreated surfaces will also become icy at times.
