



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

A plume of warm, moist air is expected to move northeastwards across northern England and Scotland through the course of Thursday, with areas of thundery rain becoming more widespread. Over Scotland 20-30 mm is expected in many parts within the warning area, and locally over 50 mm - much of this within a period of 3-6 hours. Over northern England, some areas will receive 15-30 mm of rain, whilst there is a risk of a few places having 20-30 mm within an hour from thunderstorms during the afternoon and early evening.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **06:00 on Thu, 28th Jun 2012** until **23:59 on Thu, 28th Jun 2012**

After heavy rain in parts of southern Scotland overnight, further areas of thundery rain will move north across northern England and Scotland during Thursday. The rain is expected to become heavy and persistent during the afternoon and evening across southern and eastern Scotland, whilst at the same time isolated thunderstorms are expected to develop across the north Midlands and northern England. The public should be aware that localised surface water flooding may occur.
