


National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment
 Showers will be quite frequent overnight, falling as a mix of rain, sleet and hail at low levels, and snow mainly above about 300 metres above sea level. This combination, along with intermittent clearances, will make for localised problems with ice.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Ice**

Valid from **21:00 on Sat, 17th Nov 2012** until **10:00 on Sun, 18th Nov 2012**

Frequent showers will continue to affect Argyll, Lochaber and the central and west Highlands through Saturday evening and overnight into Sunday morning. Combined with intermittent sub-zero temperatures, this will lead to icy stretches on some surfaces. Additionally, a couple of cm of snowfall may affect the highest routes.

The public should be aware of these winter hazards, and take extra care.
