



National Severe Weather Warning Service

Chief Forecasters Assessment

A vigorous depression will slowly cross the area, bringing with it a fairly prolonged spell of rain. At this stage there remains some doubt about its location, though it looks likely that parts of southwest Scotland will see more than 40 mm through the period of the warning.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **00:00 on Fri, 22nd Jun 2012** until **12:00 on Sat, 23rd Jun 2012**

A period of heavy and persistent rain is expected to affect southwest Scotland through Friday and early Saturday. The rain is then expected to clear away later on Saturday. The public should be aware of standing water and spray on roads and the possibility of localised flooding.
