The winds on the south and southeast coasts are northeasterly, over Ireland southwesterly, moderate to fresh; elsewhere variable, slight. A <sup>little</sup> ~~small~~ amount of rain has fallen in the southwest of England. Temperatures have fallen decreased in the south, about 15° as much as 18° at L'Orient.
