Atmospherical pressure has increased over the British Islands since yesterday — especially in the south-west. Temperature has risen generally, and the winds are principally south-westerly — light to moderate. Weather is clear on the east coast but cloudy elsewhere; and some rain has fallen in the north and west.
