


National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

An occluded front will move southeast across northern and central parts of the UK this afternoon and into East Anglia by early evening. Sleet and snow is likely near the leading edge away from western coasts, although turning more generally to rain before clearing.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Snow**

Valid from **11:00 on Tue, 05th Feb 2013** until **19:00 on Tue, 05th Feb 2013**

An area of rain, sleet and snow accompanied by strong westerly winds is expected to move southeastwards across northern and eastern England during the afternoon and early evening, turning to rain in most areas before clearing.

Accumulations of snow will vary from 0-2 cm slushy deposits below 200 metres, with locally 2-5 cm above 200 metres, and 5-10 cm above 300 metres in Pennine areas during the first part of the afternoon.

The public should be aware of the potential for some disruption to travel, particularly on higher level routes.
