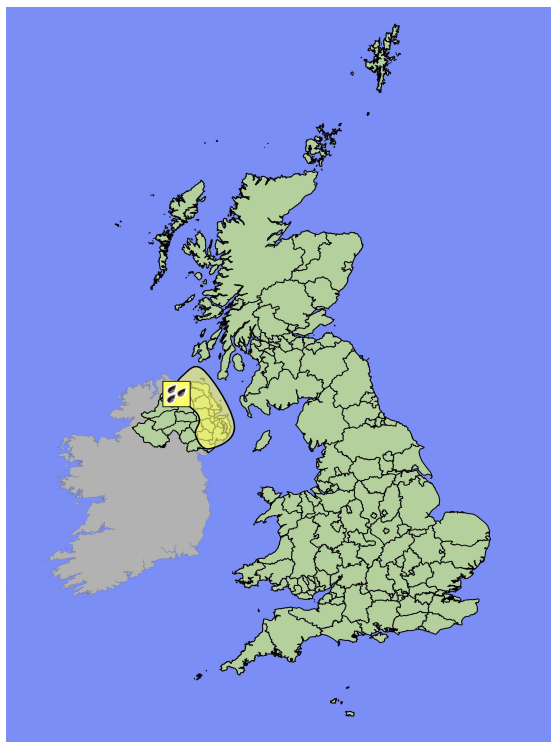




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

A vigorous depression developing over the UK will bring spells of rain to many regions before easing away later on Friday or early Saturday. The heaviest rain for Northern Ireland is expected during Friday morning and afternoon, especially over northern and eastern parts where 15-25mm will fall quite widely and locally over higher ground in excess of 50mm may fall.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **03:00 on Fri, 22nd Jun 2012** until **23:00 on Fri, 22nd Jun 2012**

Increasingly persistent rain developing overnight will become heavy at times during Friday morning and afternoon. The public should be aware of standing water and spray on roads and the possibility of localised flooding.
