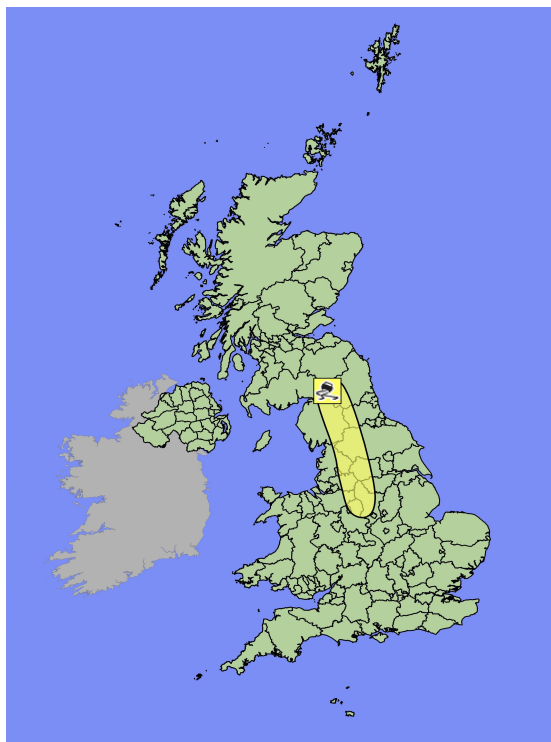




## National Severe Weather Warning Service



### Chief Forecasters Assessment

Fresh snowfall is likely to be confined to levels above about 200m, though all levels are prone to icy stretches.

There should be some easing of the situation as we go further into Tuesday, but a tricky, wintry start in some places again.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Alert of Ice**

Valid from **00:00 on Tue, 06th Dec 2011** until **11:00 on Tue, 06th Dec 2011**

Wintry showers will tend to ease, although with a few more centimetres of snow still possible over high ground as we move into Tuesday morning. Additionally, icy stretches are likely to develop on untreated surfaces where wintry showers have fallen.

The public should be aware of potential disruption to transport networks.
