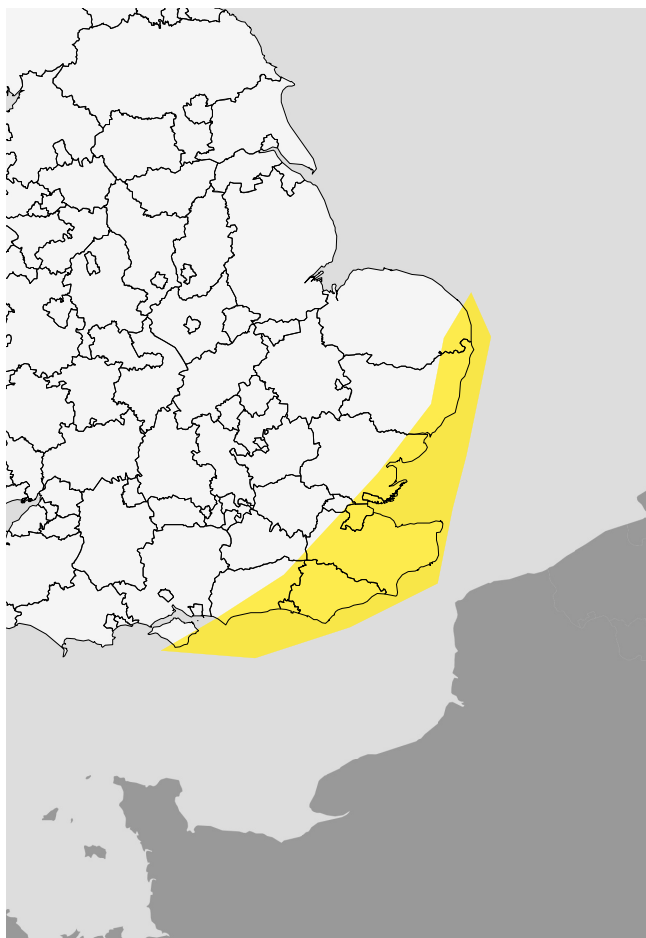




Yellow warning

A very windy day for the south and east of England Saturday with the chance of some disruption.

What to expect

- There is a small chance of injuries and danger to life from flying debris as well as from large waves with beach material being thrown onto sea fronts, coastal roads and properties.
- There is a slight chance of some damage to trees and buildings, such as tiles blown from roofs
- There is a small chance of longer journey times or cancellations as road, rail, air and ferry services are affected
- There is a small chance that some roads and bridges could close
- There is a slight chance that power cuts may occur, with the potential to affect other services, such as mobile phone coverage

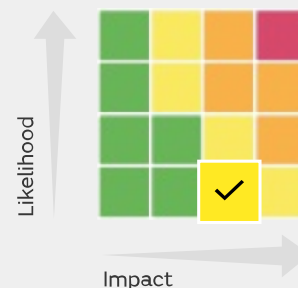
An area of low pressure will continue to bring a spell of strong winds and heavy rain to southern England on Saturday.

Gusts of 45-55 mph are likely inland with gusts of 60-70 mph around and just inland of south coasts and over hills.

Winds will continue to slowly ease from the west during the rest of the afternoon.

Reason for update

The strongest winds are now clearing from the west across south Wales, southern England and East Anglia. The area of the warning has now been reduced to the far south, southeast and east of England with the end time brought forward by 2 hours.
