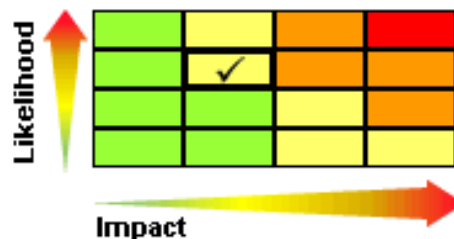
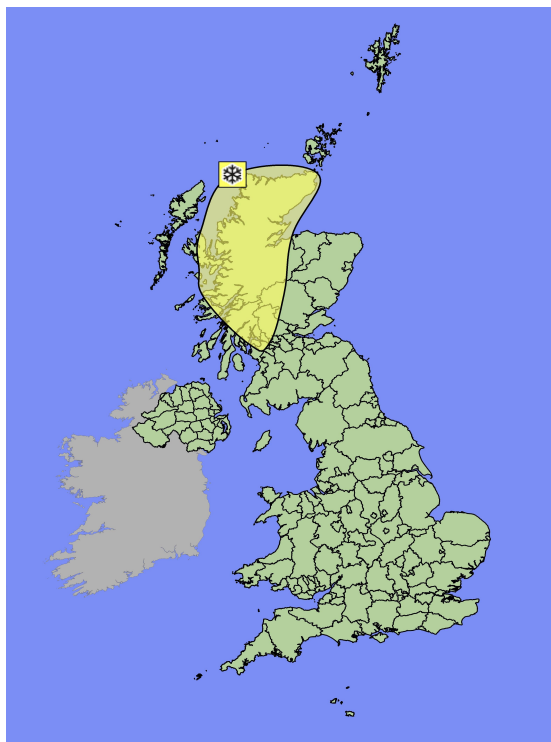




National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

An increasingly cold northwesterly flow becoming established across Scotland on Sunday will bring frequent wintry showers southwards across Scotland. Although high ground is most likely to catch significant accumulations of snow, some low lying areas are at risk of seeing the first snow cover of the winter so far.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Alert of Snow**

Valid from **21:00 on Sun, 04th Dec 2011** until **23:59 on Mon, 05th Dec 2011**

Showers will turn increasingly wintry during Sunday afternoon and evening across Scotland and will last through Monday. Localised accumulations of around 1-3cm snow are possible to low levels on Sunday night and particularly into Monday morning, with 10cm or more on high ground. Icy stretches are likely to form on untreated surfaces. The public should be aware that this could lead to travel disruption.
