


National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment
 An increasingly cold northwesterly flow will become established across Scotland on Sunday and bring frequent wintry showers southwards across western Scotland. 4-10 cm is likely above about 300 m, with 2-4 cm above about 100 m, lower lying areas at risk of seeing the first snow cover of the winter so far, though rain or sleet more is more likely in coastal districts.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Alert of Snow**

Valid from **21:00 on Sun, 04th Dec 2011** until **23:59 on Mon, 05th Dec 2011**

Showers will turn increasingly wintry during Sunday afternoon and evening across Scotland and will last through Monday. Localised accumulations of around 1-3 cm snow are likely at low level inland areas on Sunday night and particularly into Monday morning, with 10-15 cm or more expected above about 400 m. Icy stretches are likely to form on untreated surfaces. The public should be aware that this could lead to travel disruption.
