



## National Severe Weather Warning Service



### Chief Forecasters Assessment

Clear skies and light winds overnight will allow temperatures to fall quickly, providing favourable conditions for fog formation. However, the fog is likely to be patchy in nature and some locations within the highlighted area will remain clear. Visibility is likely to fall below 100m in places and where the fog is most dense it may well take until late morning to clear.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Fog**

Valid from **00:05 on Tue, 19th Feb 2013** until **11:00 on Tue, 19th Feb 2013**

Fog patches are expected to form on Monday night and into Tuesday morning. The fog may be locally dense and freezing and be slow to clear in the morning. Fog is more likely to form first across East Anglia, but may not form across the London area and other more southern counties until late in the night or first light on Tuesday.

The public should be aware of the potential for some minor disruption to transport.
