Here is the weather forecast for the inshore waters of Great Britain and Northern Ireland valid for the following 24 hours.

General Situation: high pressure centred over Northern Ireland 1037.

From Cape Wrath to Duncansby Head including Orkney.

Wind: northwest backing southwest 4 or 5, occasionally 6 at first.  
showers.

Visibility: good.

Shetland.

Wind: northwest backing west 4 or 5, occasionally 6.  
showers.

Visibility: good.

From Duncansby Head to Whitby.

Wind: northwesterly backing westerly 4 or 5, occasionally 6 or 7 at first in north.  
showers.

Visibility: good.

From Whitby to North Foreland.

Wind: northwest 5 or 6, decreasing 4 later.  
showers.

Visibility: good.

From North Foreland to St. Catherine's Point.

Wind: northeast 4 or 5.  
fair.

Visibility: good.

From St. Catherine's Point to Lands End.

Wind: northeast 4, occasionally 5 at first.  
fair.

Visibility: good.

From Lands End to Colwyn Bay.

Wind: east 4, occasionally 5 at first.  
showers.

Visibility: good.

From Colwyn Bay to Mull of Kintyre including Lough Foyle to Carlingford Lough.

Wind: north becoming variable 3 or 4.  
fair.

Visibility: good.

From Mull of Kintyre to Cape Wrath.

Wind: variable 3 or 4, becoming southwesterly 4 or 5 in north.  
showers.

Visibility: good.
