



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

Strong winds around a deep depression centred to the east of Iceland are dragging cold air across the area. Whilst the strongest winds will ease this evening, heavy, thundery showers will turn increasingly wintry overnight.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Snow**

Valid from **18:00 on Sun, 14th Dec 2014** until **15:00 on Mon, 15th Dec 2014**

Frequent wintry showers, thundery at times, will affect the Northern Isles on Sunday night and through much of Monday. These showers will be squally and fall increasingly as hail or snow with some accumulations possible along with the risk of ice. The showers will be accompanied by strong and gusty westerly winds, especially across Orkney. The public should be aware of possible disruption to transport at times.
