



An area of low pressure and its associated fronts will continue to track north across the UK through Saturday. The heaviest rainfall is expected to occur on the western flank of the low, with southwest Scotland and northeastern parts of Northern Ireland looking most at risk from widespread 20 to 40 mm of rain, and locally perhaps exceeding 50 mm in 12 hours.
