



National Severe Weather Warning Service



Chief Forecasters Assessment

Another active Atlantic frontal system is forecast to cross the UK during Sunday, linked to a very deep depression near northwest Britain. As its associated frontal band moves east it will bring a period of heavy rain and strong winds on Sunday.

Rainfall accumulations of 10 to 15 mm are expected quite widely, with up to 25mm on higher ground. Gales or severe gales will be an additional hazard for the north of Northern Ireland: please see separate warning.

The Met Office have issued a **Yellow Warning of Rain**

Valid from **04:00 on Sun, 26th Jan 2014** until **10:00 on Sun, 26th Jan 2014**

Another spell of wet and very windy weather will cross Northern Ireland from the west during Sunday morning.

The public should be aware of the potential for disruption due to localised flooding. This is a further update to the warning originally issued on Wednesday, removing the parts of Scotland initially included in the warning.
