




Yellow warning

Heavy rain will arrive later on Wednesday, with possible transport disruption.

What to expect

- Spray and flooding on roads probably making journey times longer
- Bus and train services may be affected with journey times taking longer
- Flooding of a few homes and businesses is possible

Further details

Heavy rain will move in from the west through Wednesday afternoon and evening, becoming persistent in places during the evening. 20 to 30 mm may fall within 3-4 hours in a few locations.

Rain may also turn to snow over the higher routes in south Wales towards midnight, perhaps with a few cm accumulating.
