SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

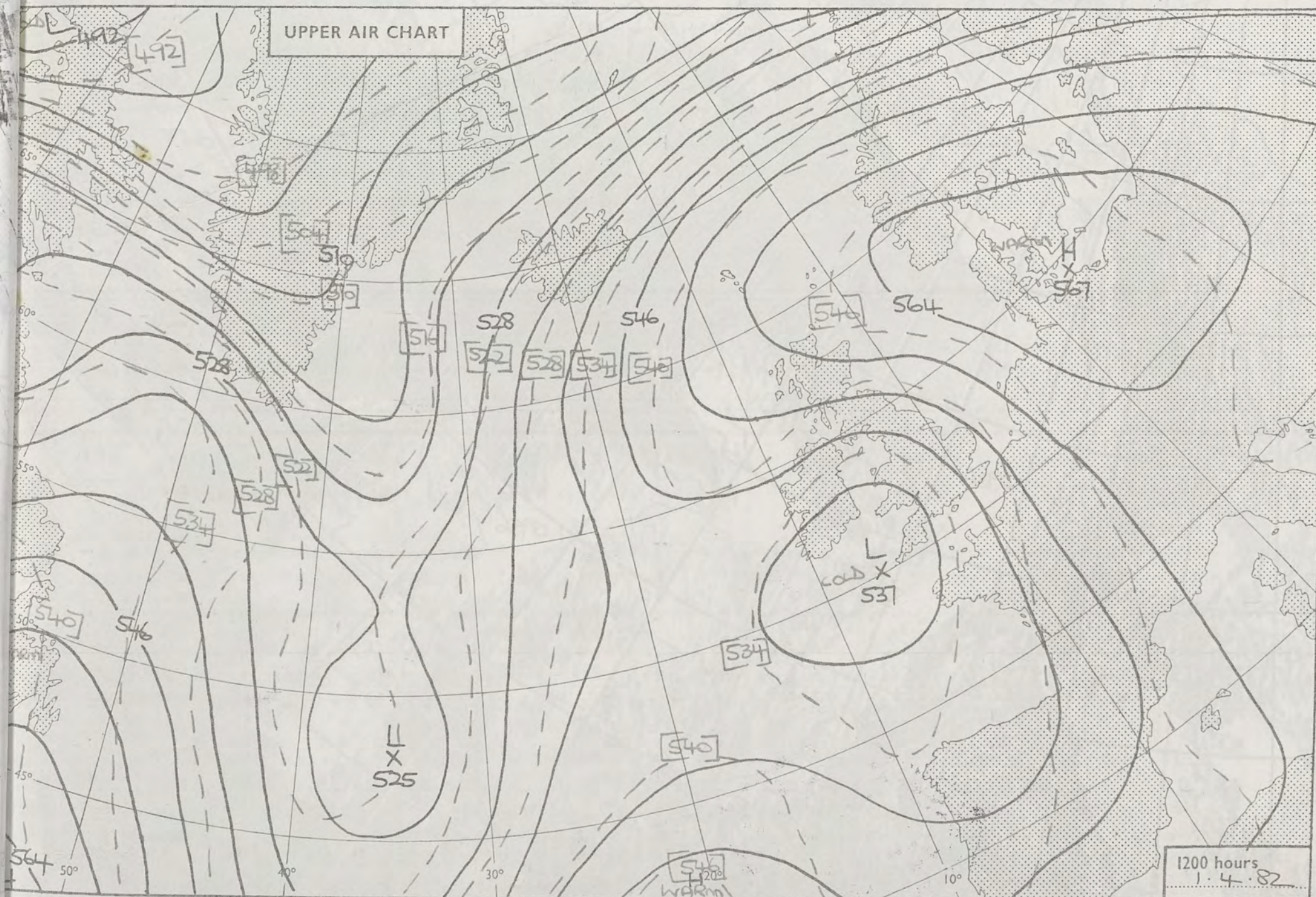
In Scotland the day was mostly cloudy, with rain in southern Scotland during the first half of the day, and in western areas during the afternoon and evening. In Northern Ireland there was light rain at times during the day, but by evening the weather was dry with clearing skies. In England and Wales, an area of rain spread from the south coast to affect most of southern England by dawn. As the day went on, the rain moved north and west with sleet in places, followed by dry sunny weather in many southern and eastern parts. The rain became lighter as it moved north, so that amounts of rain were quite small in northern England. Over the whole country, the winds were mostly easterly, strong at times near the east coast, veering towards southeast by the end of the day.

SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

Southeast England, East Anglia and Lincolnshire were rather cloudy and some rain spread northwards across these parts overnight but clearer weather reached southeast England by dawn and all parts by mid-morning. Thereafter it was mostly dry with bright or sunny intervals. Wales together with northern, central and southwestern areas of England, apart from a few showers, were mainly dry with sunny periods and some parts were quite sunny. Northern Ireland and southwest Scotland were dry and sunny. Central, eastern and southeastern regions of Scotland, after a little rain in places at first were dry with sunny periods. Northeast Scotland was also dry at first with sunny intervals but there was some rain in places during the afternoon and evening, turning showery later. Northwest Scotland was cloudy with some rain at times but with clear intervals and a few showers later. Temperatures were well up to normal.

SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

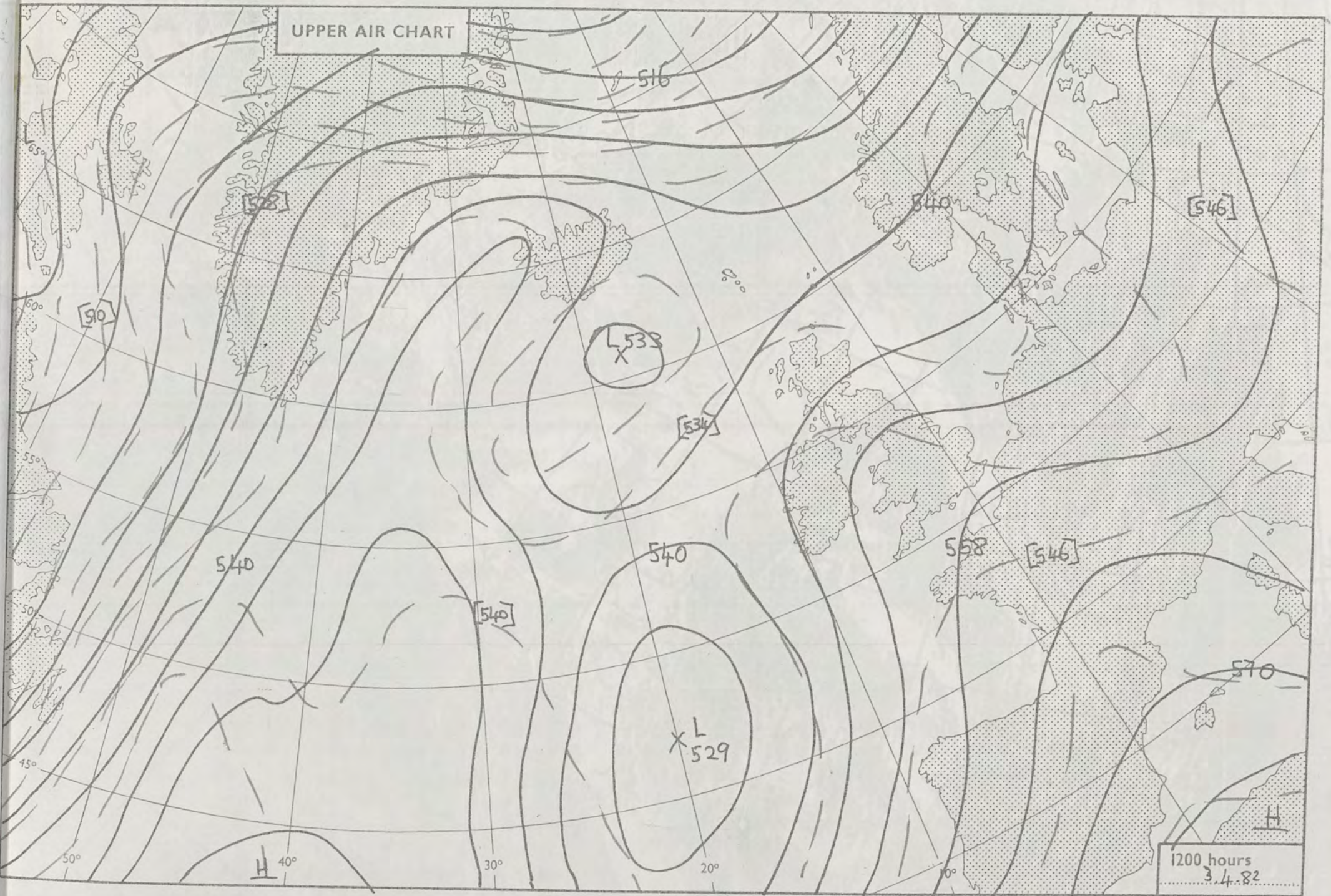
Most eastern and northern districts had a warm and quite sunny day, after the clearance of a few early fog patches. Cloud increased later, with some rain in northern England and Scotland in the evening.

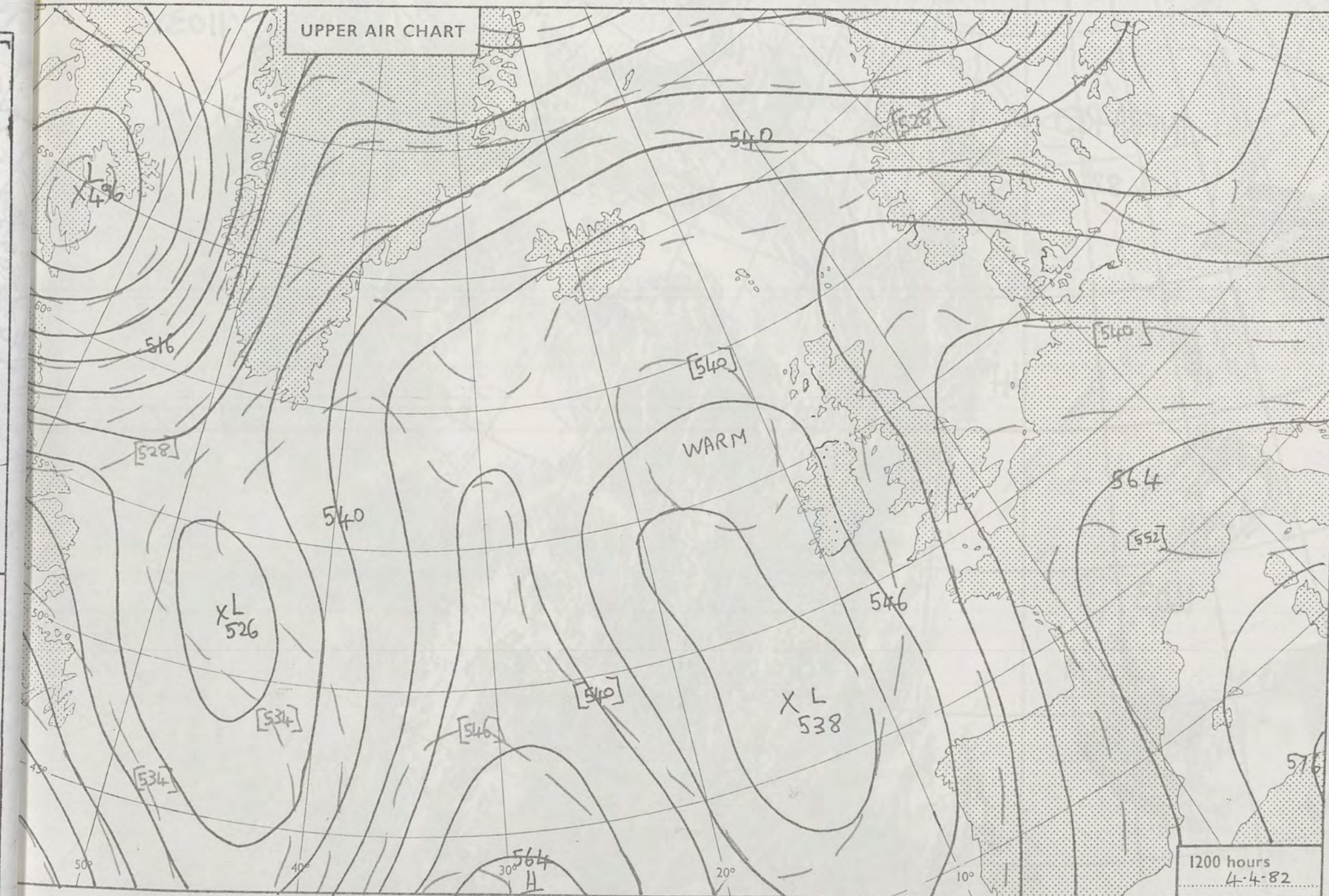
SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

Most western areas had a cloudy night with outbreaks of rain, heavy in places. Eastern areas were dry and misty. During the day outbreaks of rain persisted in Wales and the far south-west but the rest of England was mostly dry with some sunshine prolonged in the southeast. It became warm in most places but coastal areas stayed cooler and a few were misty. Scotland and Northern Ireland had further rain at first but this moved away north and Northern Ireland became bright and dry early in the day and the far west of Scotland by afternoon. Eastern and central Scotland remained cloudy with a little rain, and Northern Ireland had some further rain in the evening.

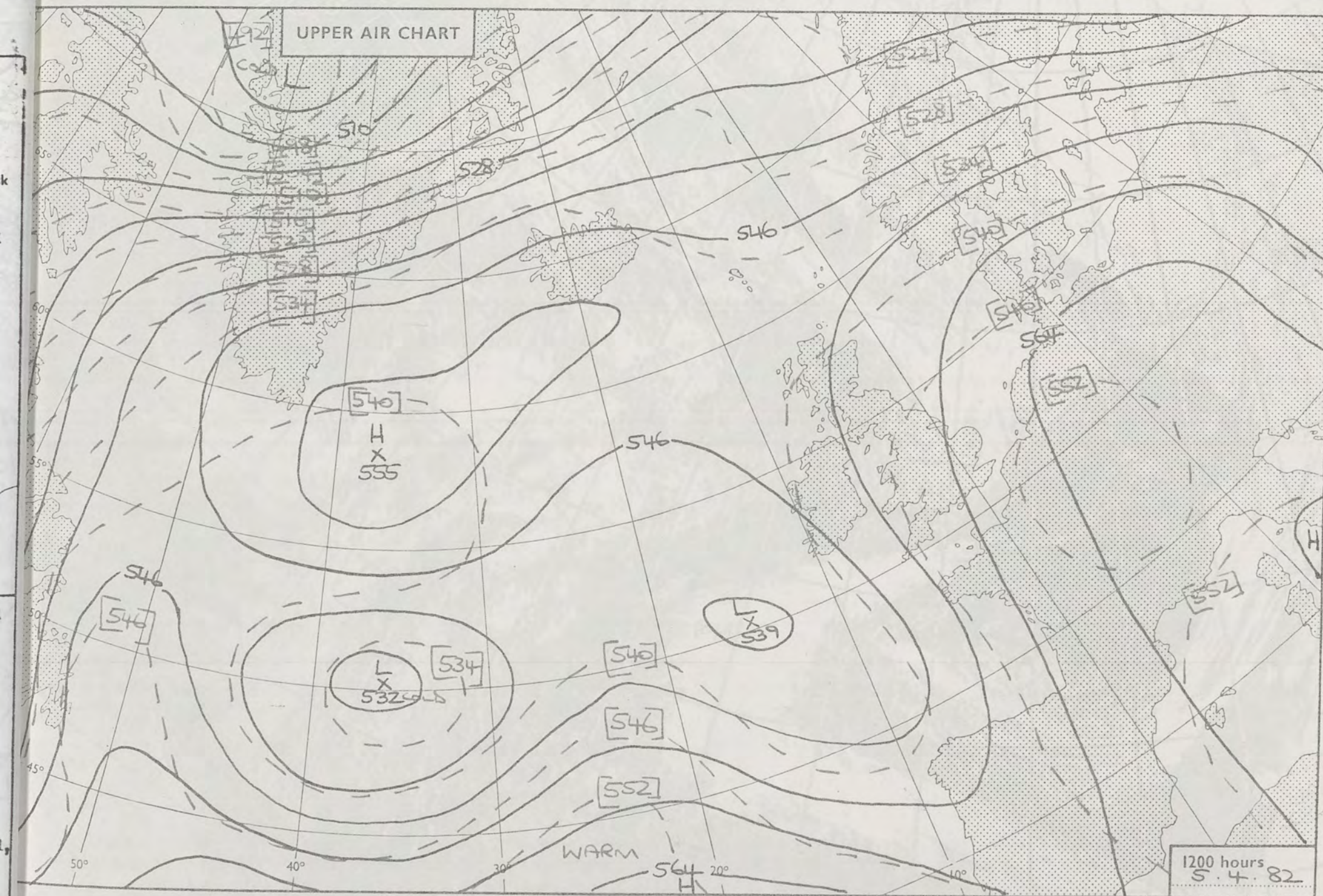
SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

Overnight, rain moved north from North Wales, northwest England and Northern Ireland to much of Scotland but most of England and Wales were dry with some fog chiefly in the southwest. After a dry start with some sunshine outbreaks of rain spread from the south during the morning to the south and southwest of England, from mid-Hampshire westwards, and continued north across Wales and much of the Midlands to reach northern England in the late afternoon and evening. The east and southeast of England remained dry through the day and became very warm with a good deal of sunshine but rain and thunderstorms spread over central southern England during the evening with rain into parts of London and the southeast. Northern Ireland and Scotland had some rain at first but it became mainly dry with some sunny intervals in most places in the afternoon. Near the east coast of Scotland and England it was rather misty throughout with some patchy fog.

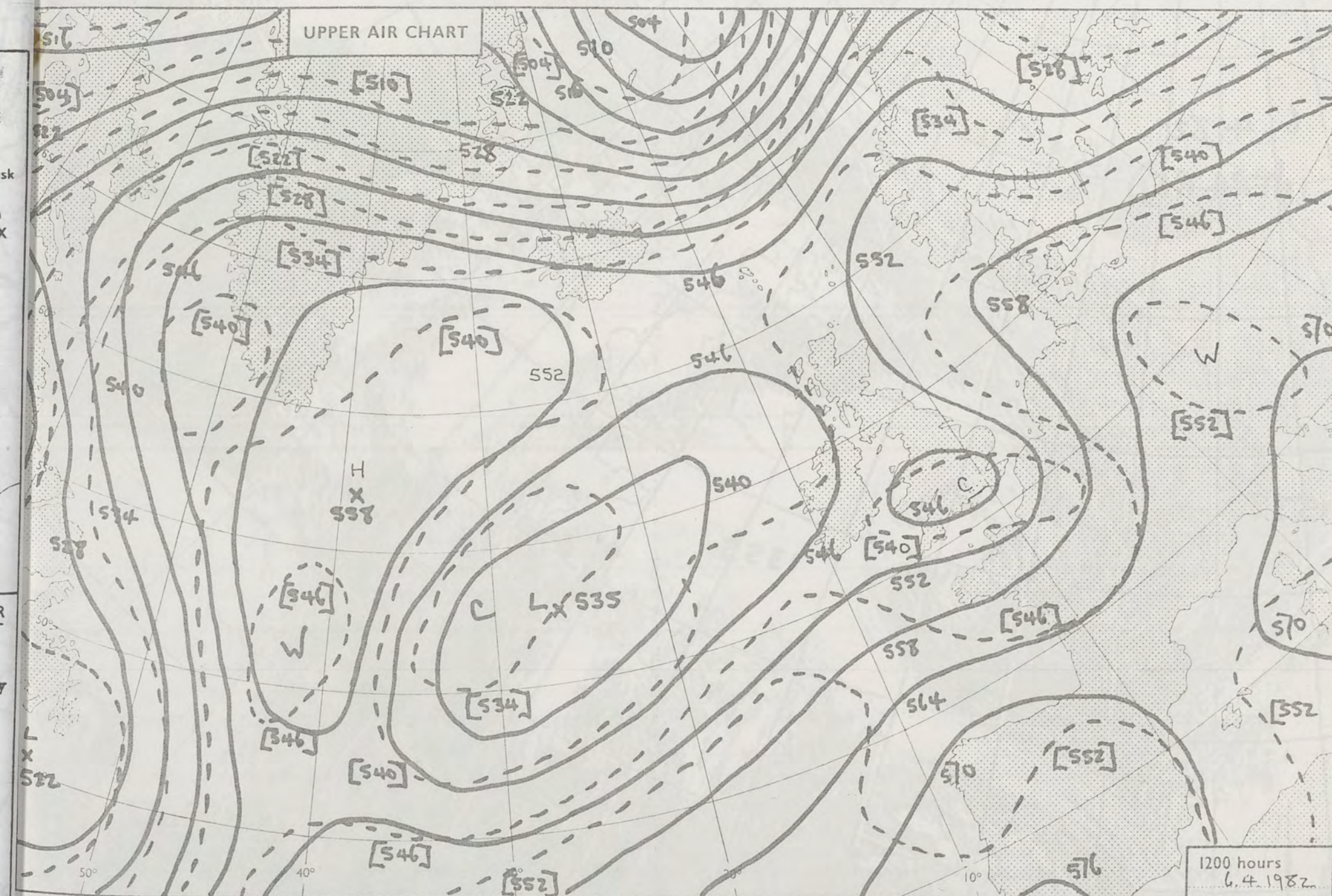
SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

Overnight it was generally cloudy and misty with out-breaks of rain and some patchy fog. In the early morning a more extensive area of rain spread quickly northeast across southern areas of England and Wales but slowed down over the Midlands, Lincolnshire and East Anglia with rain persisting into the evening. Southern areas then turned showery with some heavy showers but with a few brighter intervals especially in the southwest before further rain spread northeast later in the afternoon and evening. Northern Ireland, northern England and Scotland were rather cloudy and misty with fog patches on eastern coasts but with a good deal of dry weather and a few sunny intervals as rain over southern Scotland in the morning moved north in the afternoon. Fog reformed over much of Scotland during the evening especially on the east coast. Temperatures were near or above average in most places but below average in eastern Scotland.

SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

Overnight, rain spread quickly from the southwest across all parts of Northern Ireland, England, Wales and southern Scotland. After daybreak brighter showery weather soon reached Northern Ireland. This brighter weather spread quickly across southern Scotland, all northern and western parts of England, Wales and southeast England during the afternoon. In the Channel Islands and around western coasts there was fog at times. Showers were most frequent and heaviest in the north. In Humberside and north Lincolnshire there was thunder in the afternoon. Southwesterly winds were strong especially around southern and western coasts. Central and northern Scotland were dry at first with thick fog which remained until late afternoon. There were out-breaks of rain and strengthening northerly winds which brought colder weather. Later in the day there were wintry showers in northern Scotland. Temperatures were near or above average in most places but below average in N and NE Scotland.

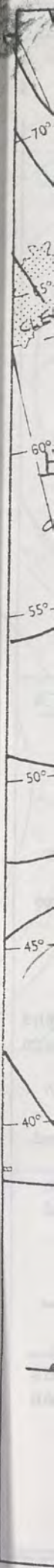
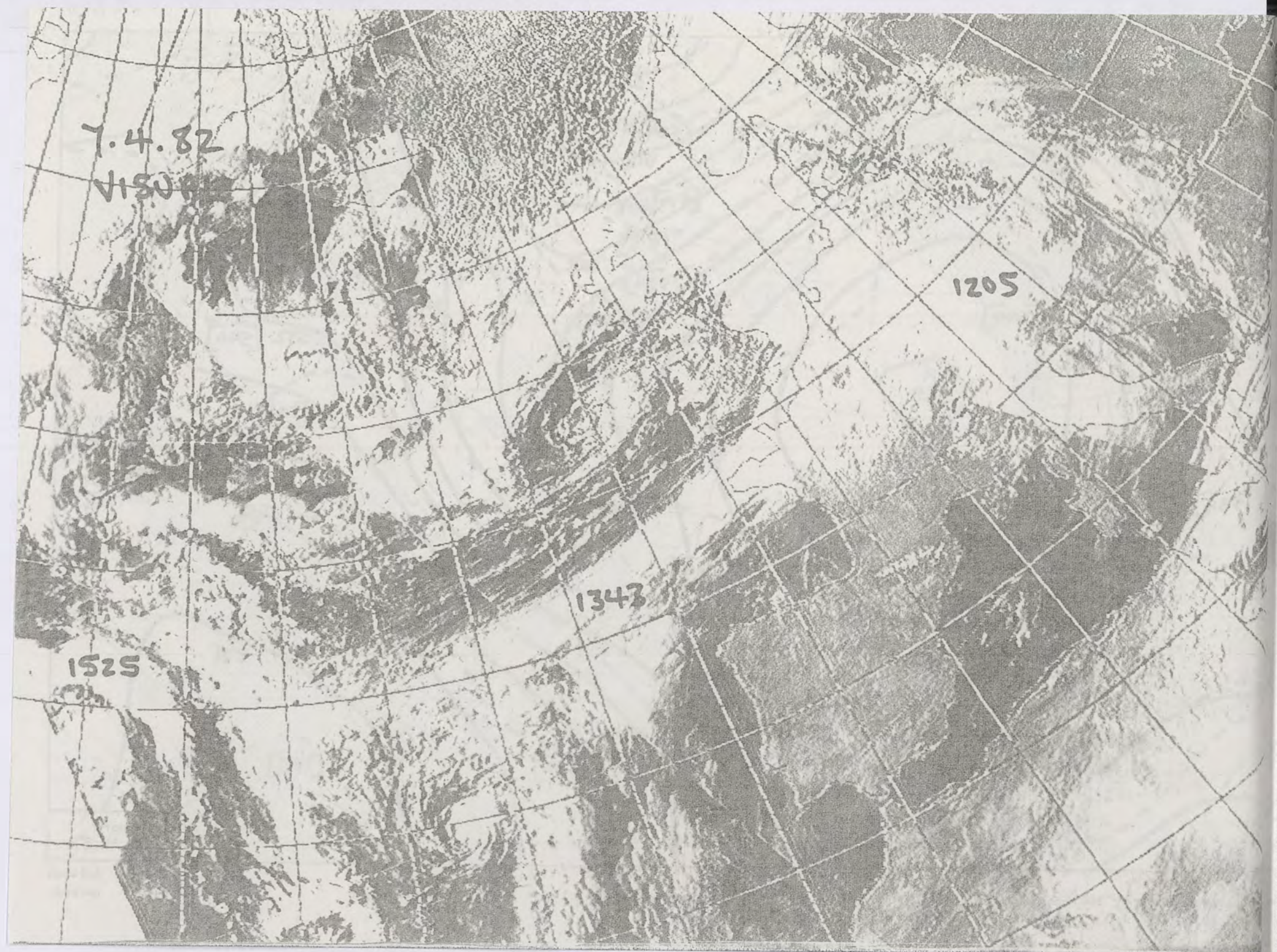

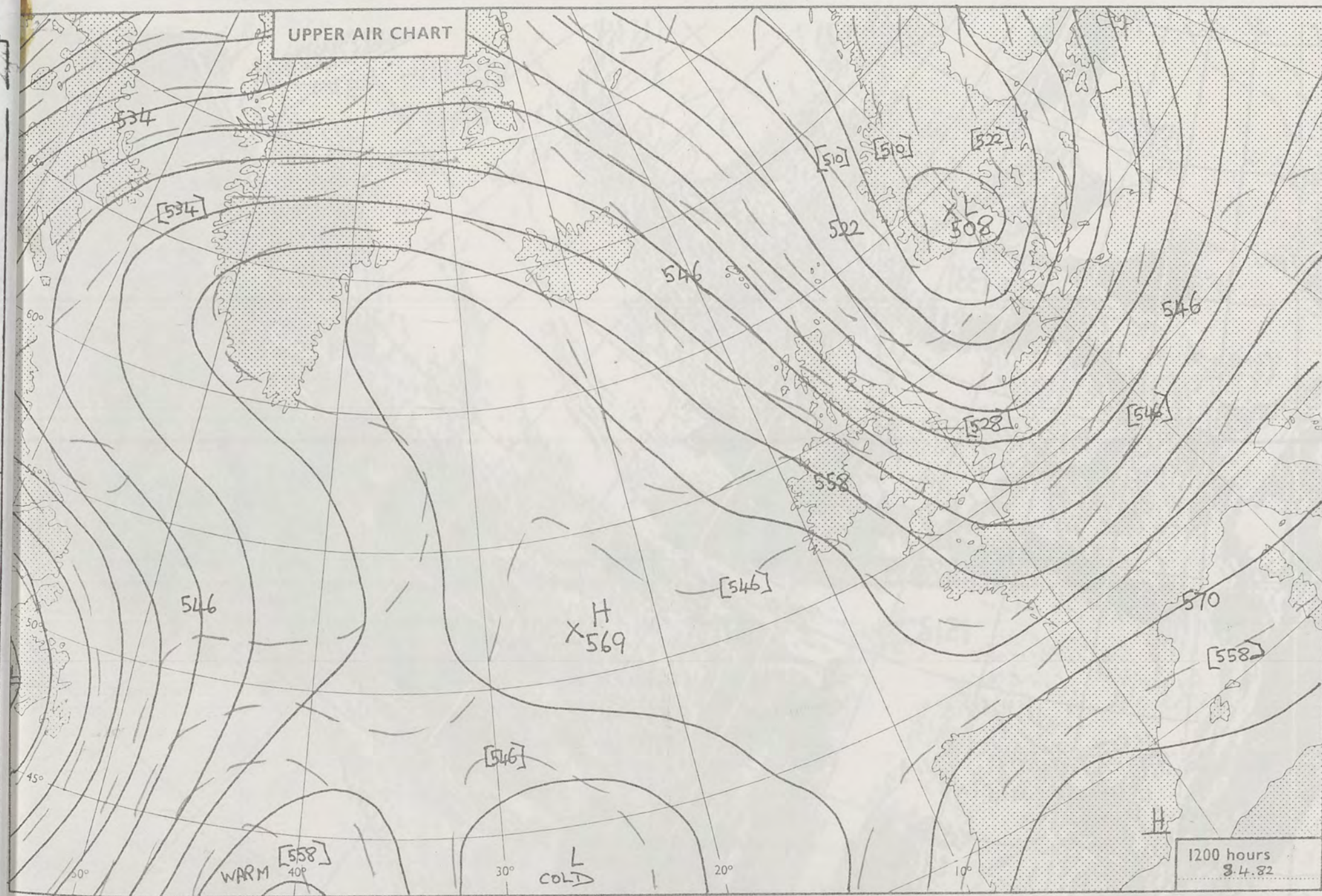
SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

In England and Wales there were outbreaks of rain over-night but in southwestern regions it was mainly dry. Rain cleared from southeast England during the morning as cold brighter weather spread from the north, then there was a mixture of sunshine and showers. In eastern England showers were quite frequent with hail, sleet and snow mixed in them. In Wales and the western half of England showers were light and isolated with a good deal of sunshine in most places. In Northern Ireland and southwest Scotland there were scattered light showers and sunny periods. In northern and eastern Scotland there were frequent showers of hail and snow, heavy in places, especially in the Northern Isles, but in south-east Scotland showers were isolated and there were long sunny periods. Northerly winds reached gale force at times on exposed northern and eastern headlands.

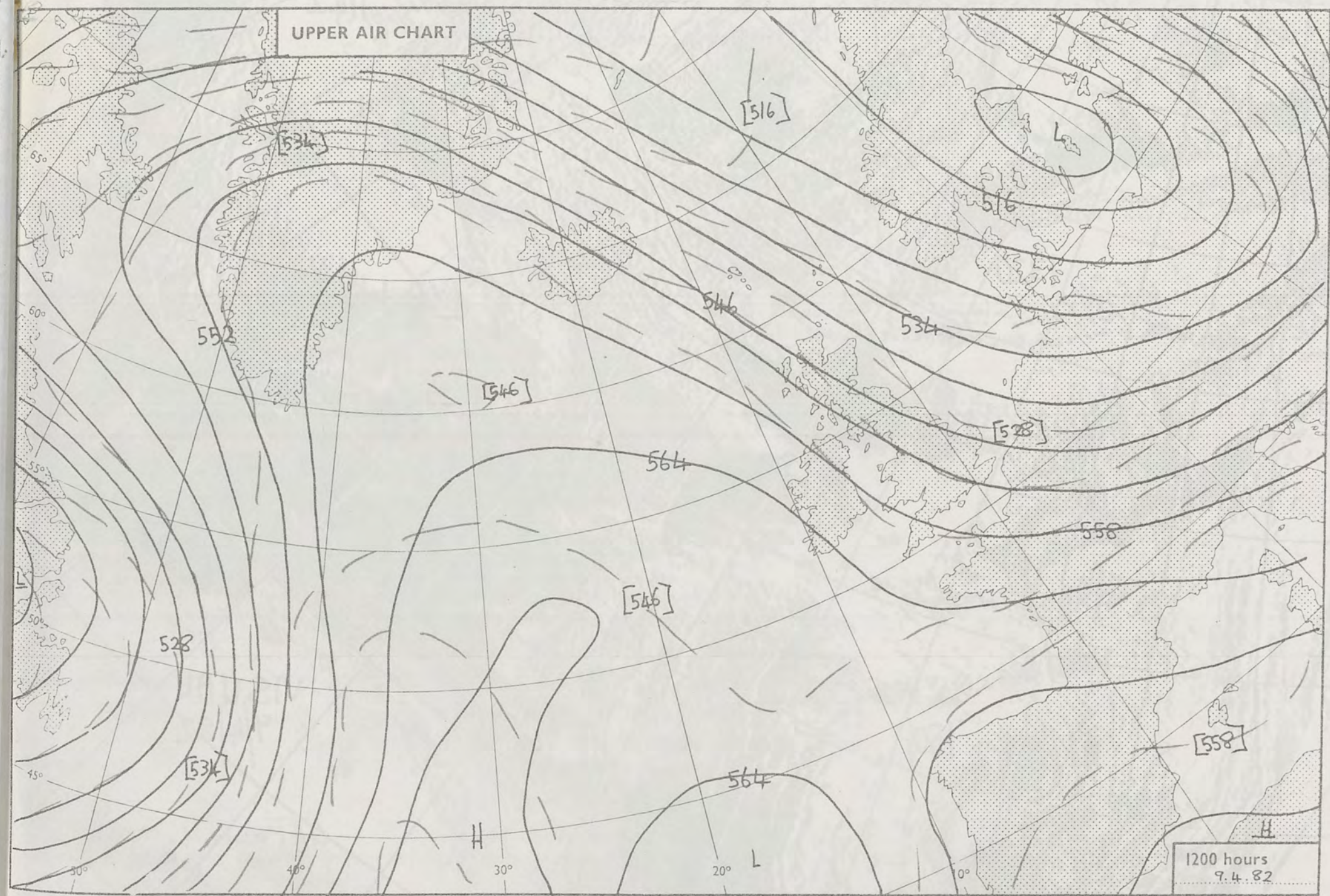


SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

Scotland and Northern Ireland were cloudy for most of the day with occasional showers, and over higher ground, there were some snow flurries. Although dry and clear overnight, the cloudy weather had reached northern England and North Wales by dawn. During the morning and early afternoon, the cloud spread southeastwards to the rest of central and eastern England after a sunny start to the day. There were some light showers in many of these areas during the afternoon and evening. Southwest England and South Wales remained dry and mainly sunny. During the evening there was a period of more persistent rain in northeast Scotland. It was mostly quite cold.

SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

England and Wales were mostly cloudy overnight with a few light showers. Brighter weather reached much of northern England during the early morning and then moved slowly southwards. Most places had some sunny intervals but further scattered showers affected eastern counties with some hail. The brighter weather reached all but the extreme southwest by evening.

For much of Scotland and Northern Ireland there were some sunny intervals and scattered showers. In western Scotland many places remained dry with longer periods of sunshine. Northern and eastern Scotland had more frequent showers with snow and hail in places. It was cold in the northeast, and mostly rather cold elsewhere.

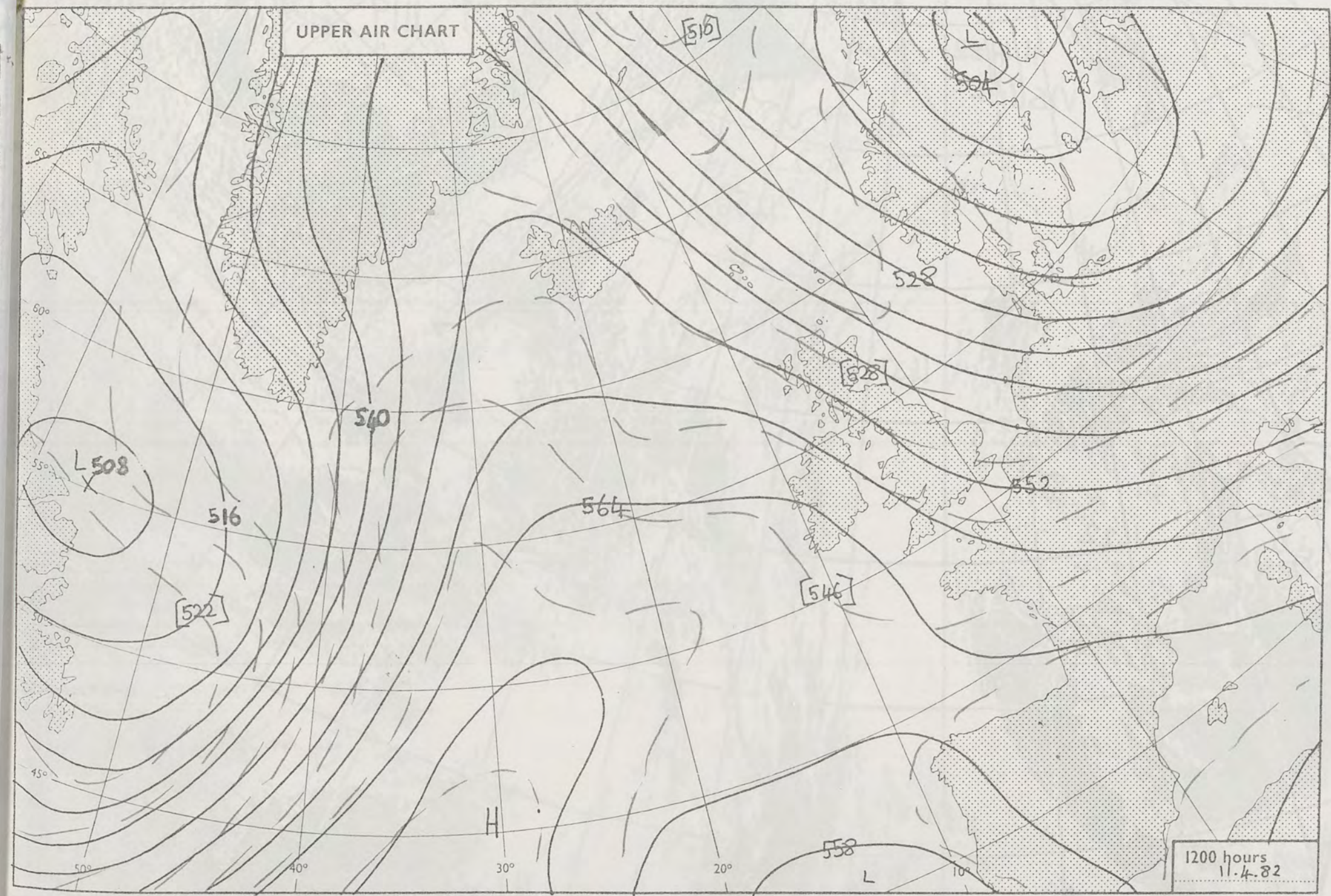


SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

Cold northerly winds kept temperatures below normal nearly everywhere. In the east of England and Scotland cloud spread inland from the North Sea overnight and although most places had at least an hour or two of sunshine during the day it was generally rather cloudy in the east. There were also a few showers in eastern areas - few and far between in eastern England and southeast Scotland but more frequent in northeast Scotland; some of the showers fell as snow or hail. In sheltered southern, central and western areas cloud was generally well broken giving a good deal of sunshine and most places stayed dry.

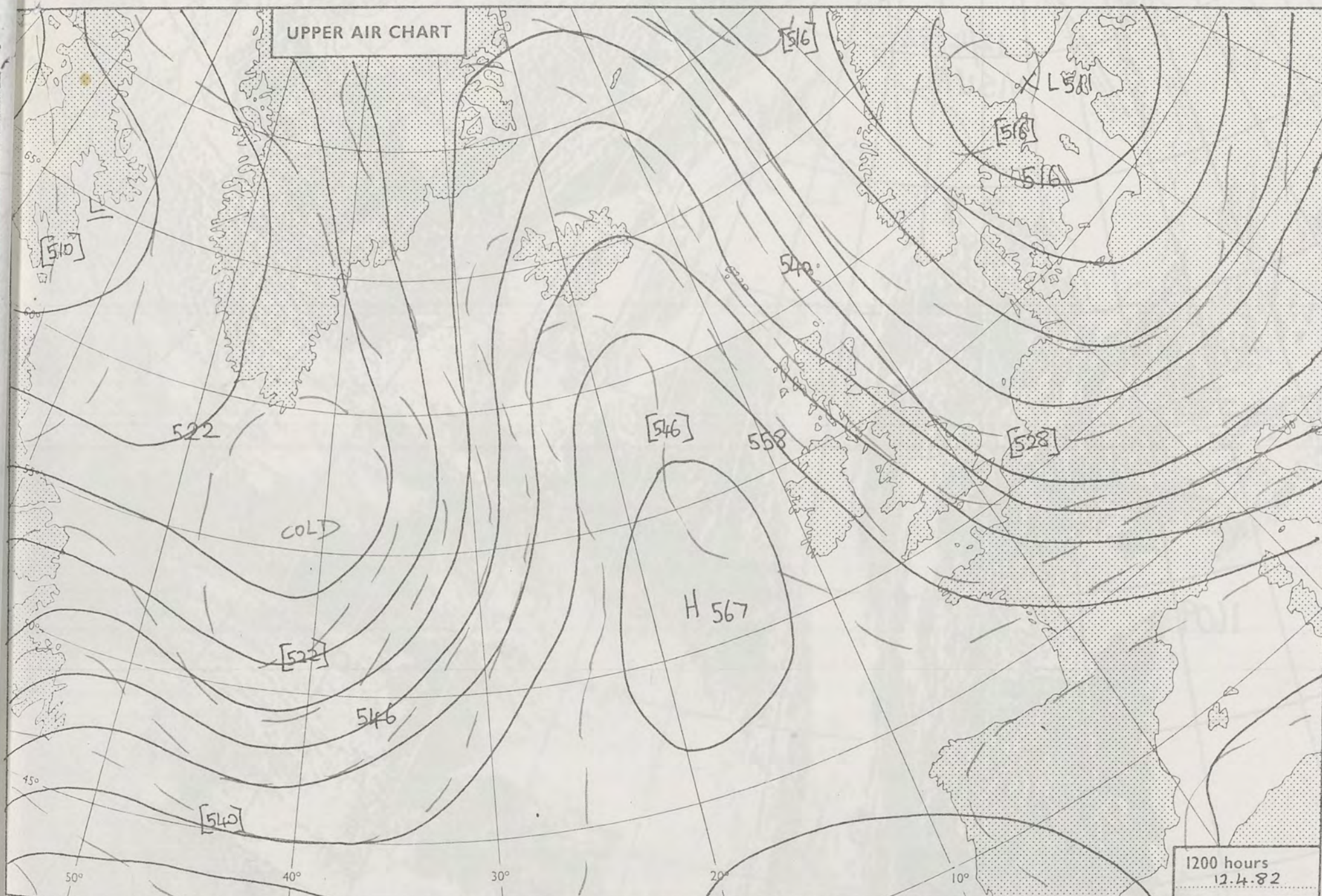


SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

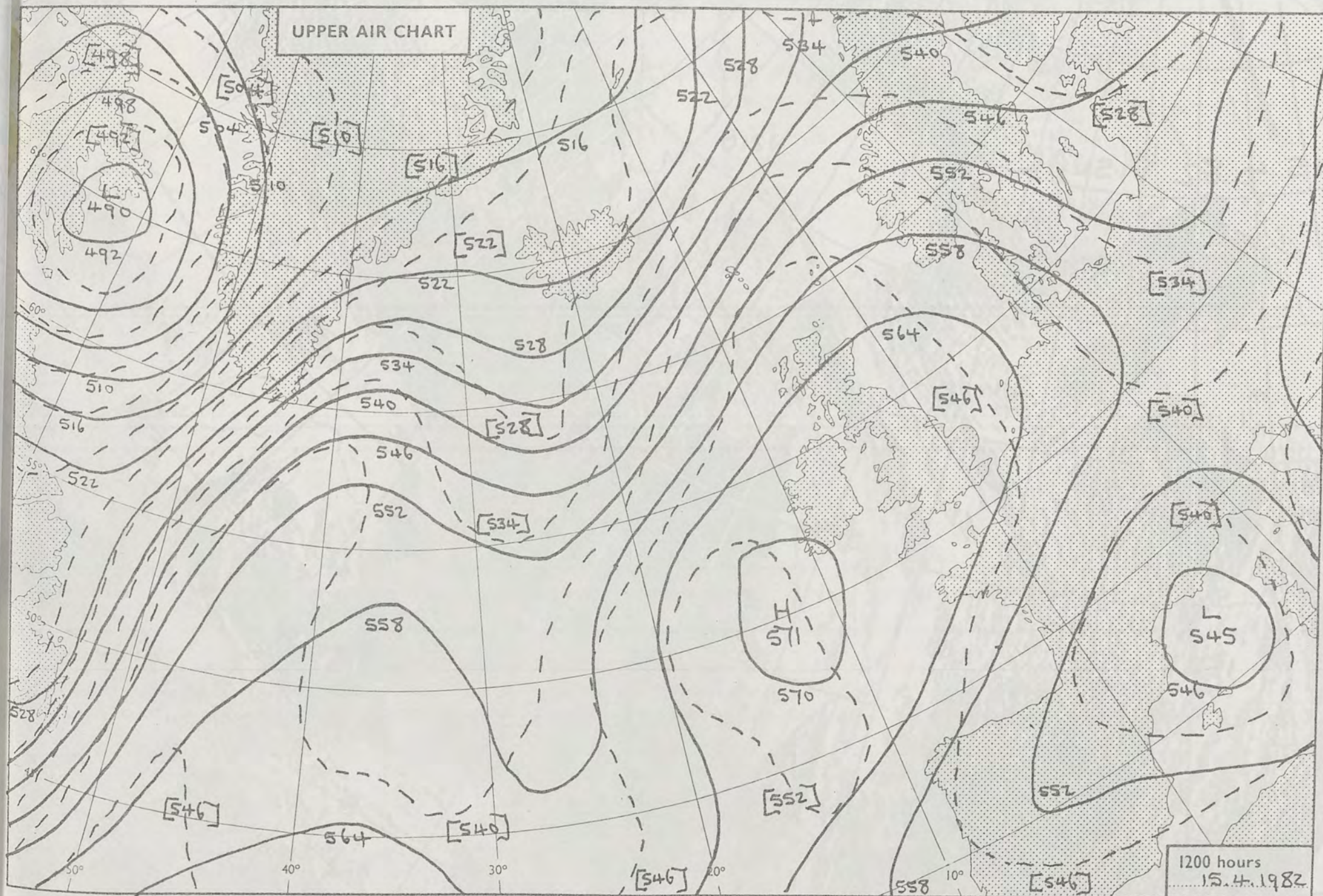
SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

However, parts of eastern Scotland and northeast England had sunny periods and in many places along the south coasts of England and Wales and in the Channel Islands it was quite a sunny day.

Accordingly parts of southern England, South Wales and a few places in eastern Scotland and northeast England had a warm afternoon.

SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

Overnight most of Scotland was cloudy. In the Northern Isles there was some light rain or drizzle. Northern Ireland, eastern and southern England were mostly cloudy. 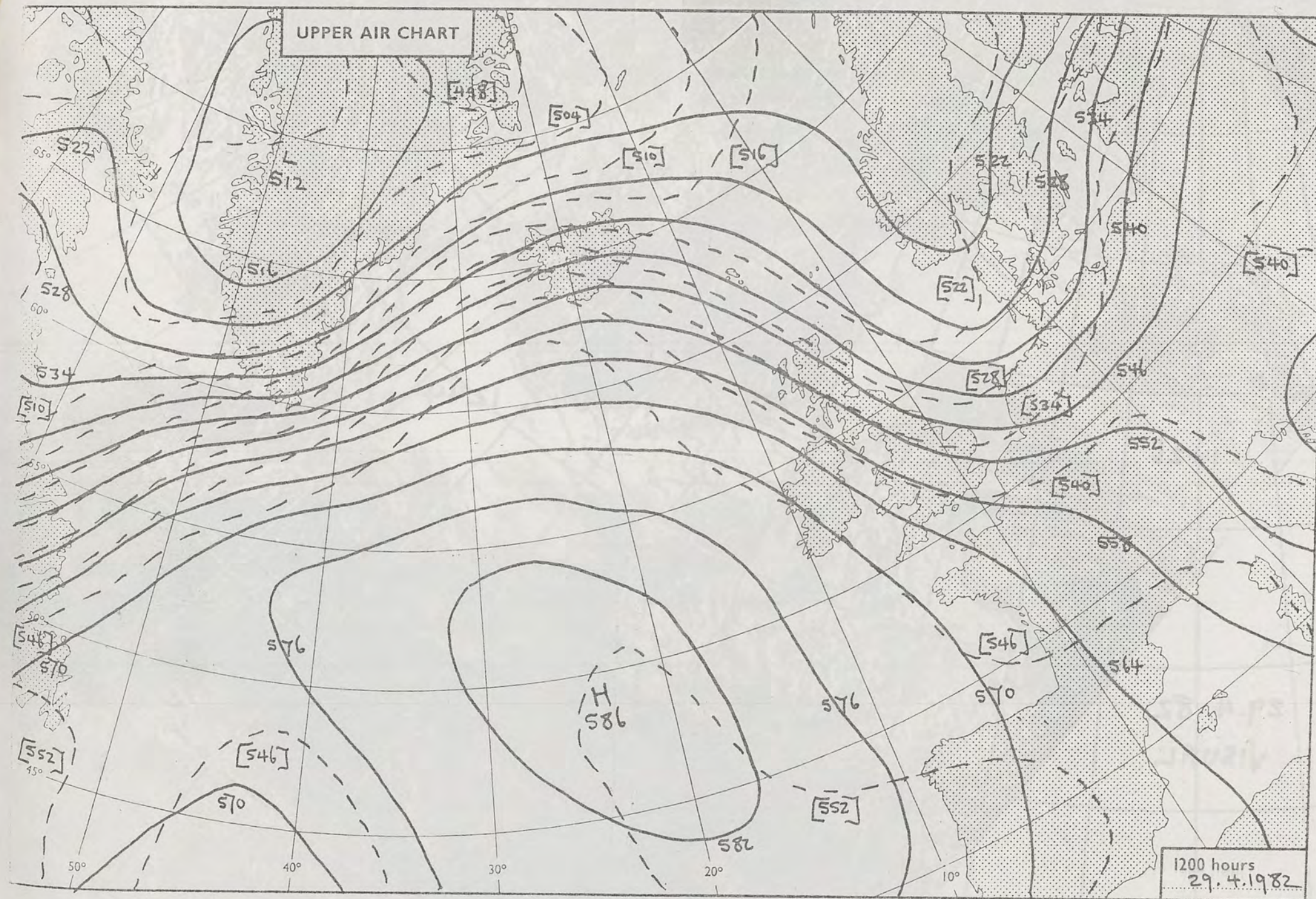
SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

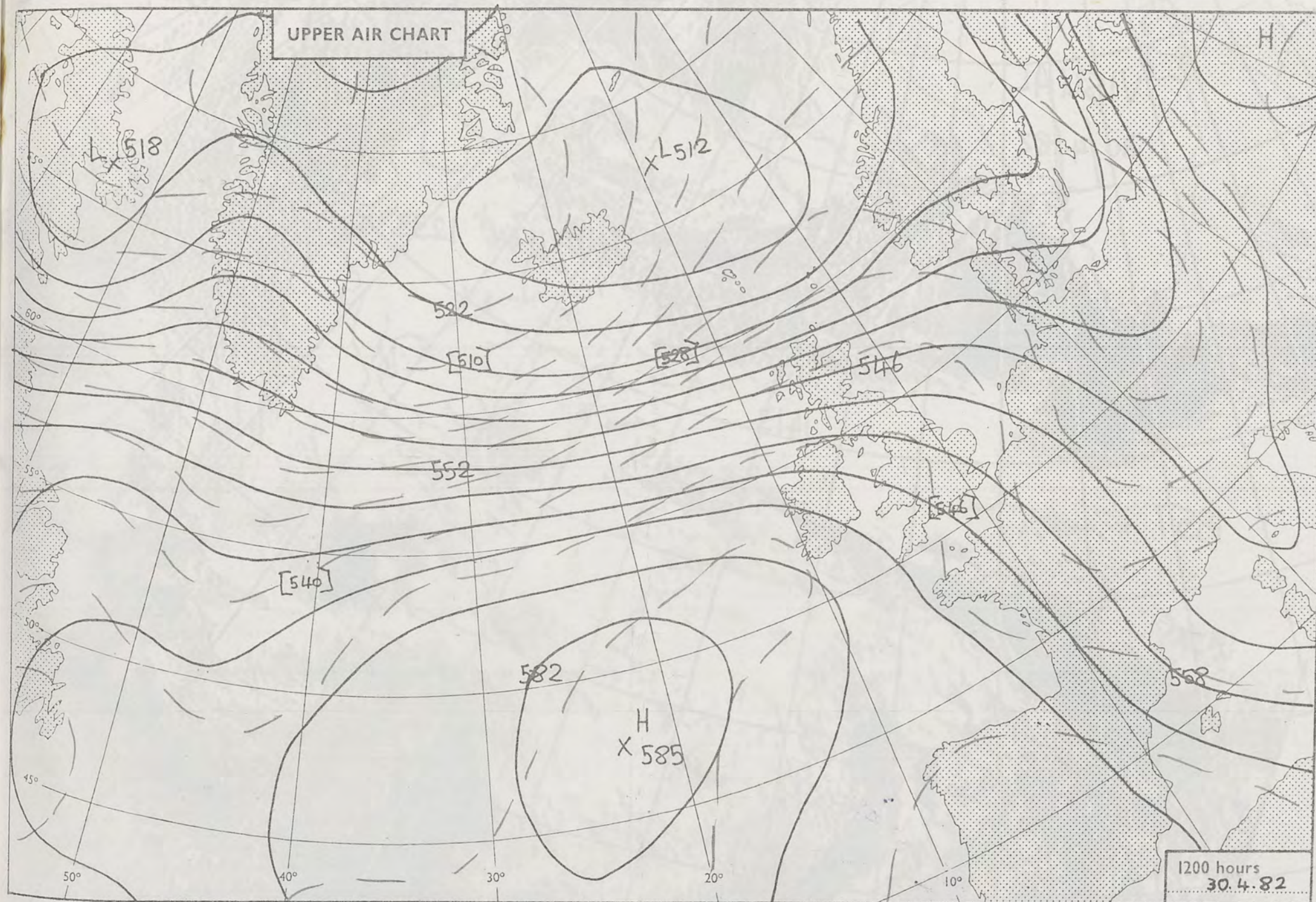


SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

Over Northern Ireland, Wales and much of England it was a cloudy night with some rain and drizzle in places, but in parts of eastern and southern England it was cold and clear for a time. In Scotland too it was cloudy and rain, sometimes heavy, spread from the west to most places overnight. In Shetland there was some snow.
