SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

Southern counties of England and Wales had outbreaks of rain and drizzle overnight. There were fog patches along southern and southwestern coasts and these persisted for much of the day. The rain spread to Northern Ireland, Wales, the Midlands and East Anglia by dawn and to the rest of northern Britain during the day. There was some heavy rain in the north. England and Wales became mostly dry and rather warm, though rain and drizzle returned to some western parts in the evening, as north-western Britain cleared up.

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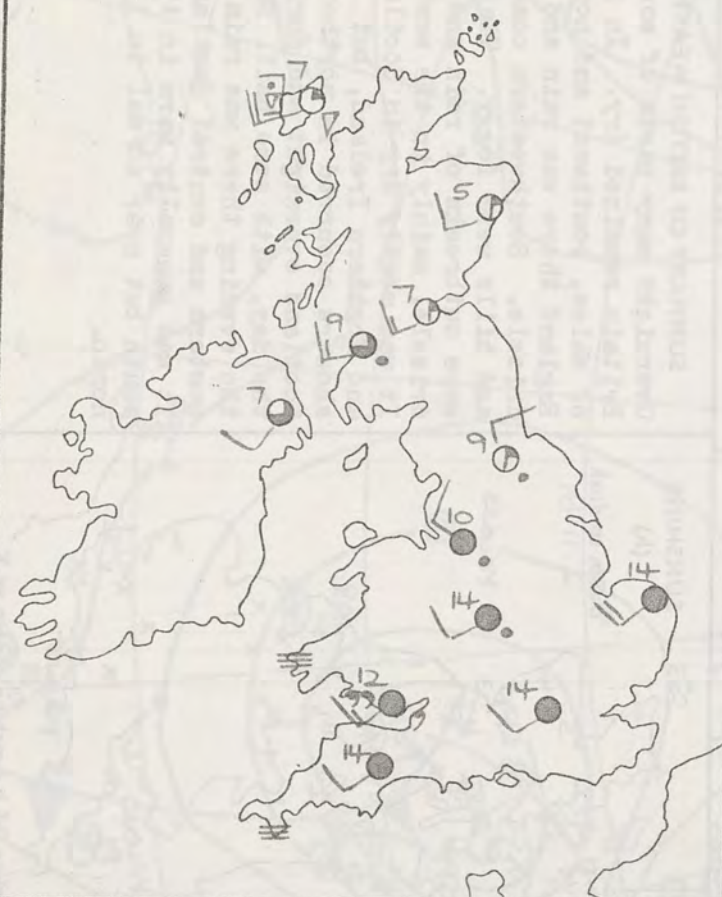
SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER
Overnight many parts of southern Britain remained dry. In parts of Wales, southwest and northern England there was rain and drizzle. Southwestern coasts and hills were foggy. 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SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER
Wales, the Midlands, East Anglia and southern England after rain overnight, were rather cloudy with only a few sunny intervals but the south coast and the Channel Islands were cloudy with occasional rain or fog. Northern Ireland, northern England, southern and eastern Scotland were mainly dry with sunny periods. Northern and western Scotland had sunny intervals and scattered showers some of hail with strong to gale force westerly winds especially near exposed coasts and hills. 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SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

Apart from a little rain here and there in North Wales and northern England during the morning, it was mainly dry in England and Wales and although many places had a cloudy day there was a clear area from West Devon through central southern England to London and East Anglia with a sunny day. SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

Scotland and Northern Ireland had rain overnight but drier weather had spread to most parts by mid morning with a few showers, chiefly in the north and west although northern Scotland had occasional rain until the early afternoon. Rain spread to northern England and North Wales later in the night but by mid afternoon most places were dry with bright spells and a few showers. SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER
In England and Wales it was dry overnight and there was a slight frost in parts of southern England. During the day it remained dry in most regions with sunny periods, the best of the sun in southeast England, but in northwestern counties scattered showers developed and one or two showers penetrated into the north Midlands. SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER
It was very windy particularly in the north where winds were up to, or in excess of, storm force at times. The highest gust reported was 76 knots (87mph) at Three in the early afternoon. Associated with these storms were pressure rises of around 7 millibars in one hour in NE Scotland in the late afternoon. Overnight there was rain or drizzle everywhere. 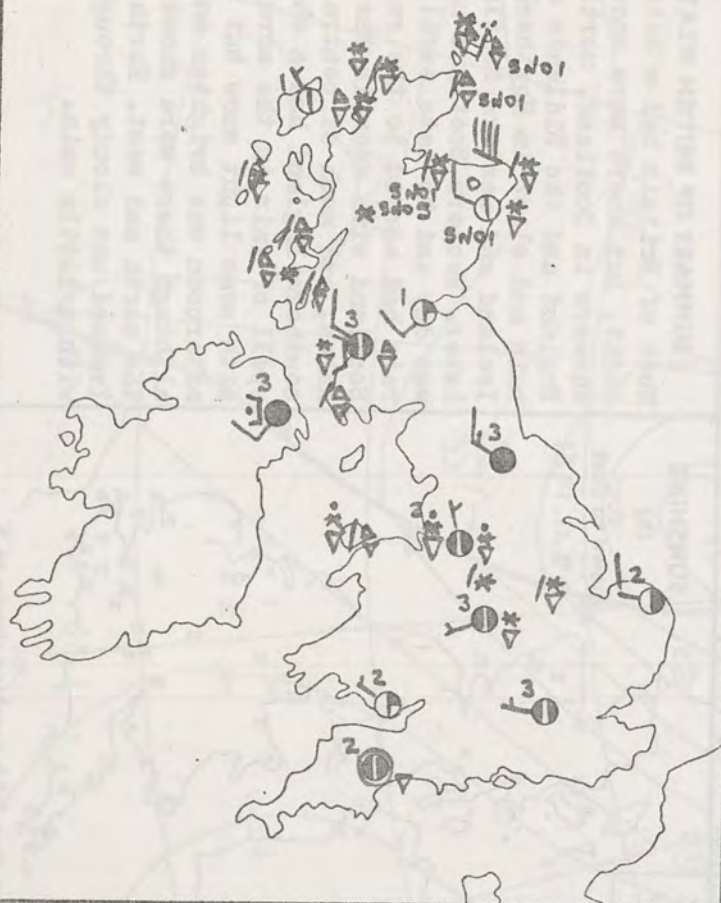




SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER
Southern, Central and eastern England were cloudy, mild and windy for much of the morning with outbreaks of rain - and isolated thunder near London. Clearer weather spread slowly from the northwest to all parts by mid afternoon.
