There ^{has been} ~~is~~ however no very important decrease of temperature at present, ^{and} cloud, mist & fog are very general, with rain in some places, showing a considerable intermingling of the two principal currents and rendering changeable weather probable.

Remarks

The barometric pressure over the whole of northern Europe had increased considerably yesterday, varying from 29.8 inches to 30.1, with moderate and variable winds. The rapid rise of the barometer however, ~~being~~ accompanied ~~by~~ comparatively high temperatures and an evident intermingling of opposing currents of wind, seemed to indicate a probable recurrence of unsettled weather.

To-day the probability of the ~~ready~~ ^{increased} renewal of stormy weather is ~~still further confirmed~~ by a rather sudden diminution of pressure in the west of Ireland, with a change of wind to southwest.

The weather very unsettled and there is no apparent sign of ~~any~~ permanent improvement during the next few days. At Brest and L'Orient the wind, after having veered to the westward, has again backed to south and continues to blow a gale, with high sea. On the English and Irish coasts the winds this morning are comparatively moderate but there is every reason to expect that they will shortly again increase. On the Scotch coasts it is blowing heavily from southeast with increased temperatures. Over the Baltic and the greater part of northern Europe (yesterday) moderate easterly winds prevailed with a high barometer and fine weather.

have been repeated on the southern coasts.
The weather over the Baltic yesterday
affords a curious contrast to the

weather prevailing over the British
Isles:— The winds over the Baltic
~~were~~ being moderate from northeast
with fine weather, a very high
barometer, and great cold. At
Hagarsunda the ~~therm~~ temperature
had fallen below zero and at
St Petersburg and Moscow it was as
low as 19° Fahr.

Yesterday and last night there was a very heavy gale from the southward and westward with rain. Hail fell at a few places, and thunder and lightning was observed at Valentia. This morning the winds are more moderate but they will probably again increase in strength.

Temperatures have fallen considerably over the British Isles although in the south of France they have risen slightly.
