### SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

Northern Ireland and Western parts of Scotland had clear spells during the night and some places had a ground frost. Southern and Eastern Scotland by contrast were cloudy with some rain at times, but much of the rain died away by the morning. England and Wales were also cloudy with mist, fog and drizzle in places. Apart from the far NW of the British Isles it was a mild night.

During the day, Western Scotland and Northern Ireland were dry with some sunshine and the Channel Islands also had a sunny day. Remaining areas were cloudy, with drizzle in parts of England and Wales. A number of places were misty with any morning fog lifting very slowly.

Overnight most of the country was cloudy but clear breaks over parts of Scotland allowed frost in places. The rest of the British Isles were generally cloudy with widespread mist and a few localised fog patches. Most areas stayed dry but there was the odd light patch of drizzle over parts of Northern England, Northern Ireland and some Southern counties of England. Most places had a mild night.

It was mostly dull and cloudy by day over the British Isles but Scotland did see some brighter breaks at times. Most areas were dry but there were a few scattered showers over West Scotland, with some light and patchy outbreaks of drizzle over other areas of the country. In the brighter spots over Scotland temperatures were above the average, elsewhere temperatures were near normal for the time of year.

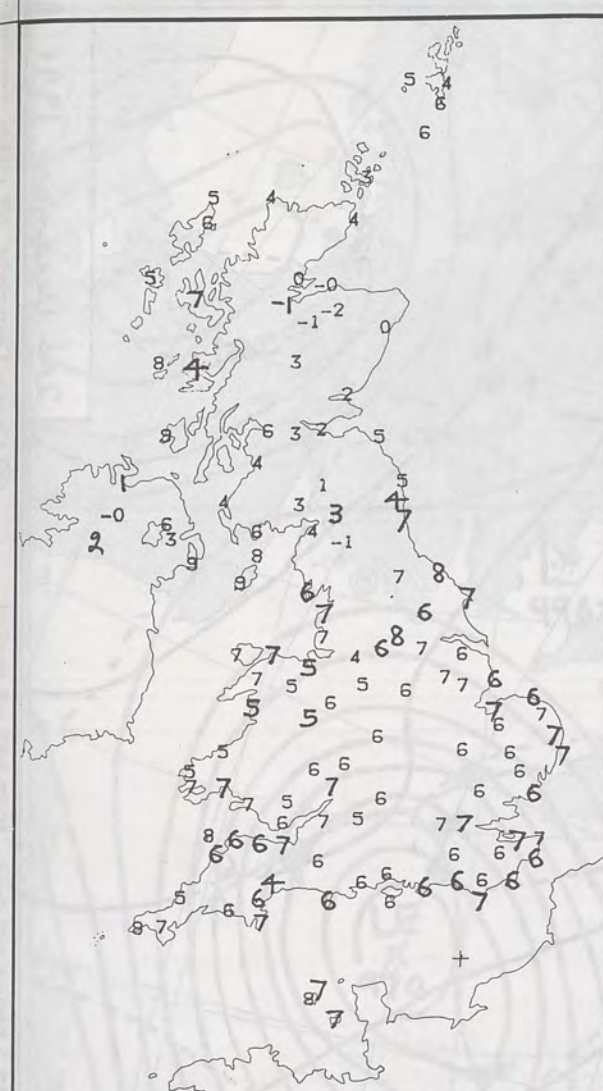

# SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

Overnight much of the British Isles was cloudy and mainly dry. There were some breaks in the cloud chiefly over eastern parts of Scotland. The extreme north of Scotland had some drizzle from time to time. Later in the night fog developed over the Borders.

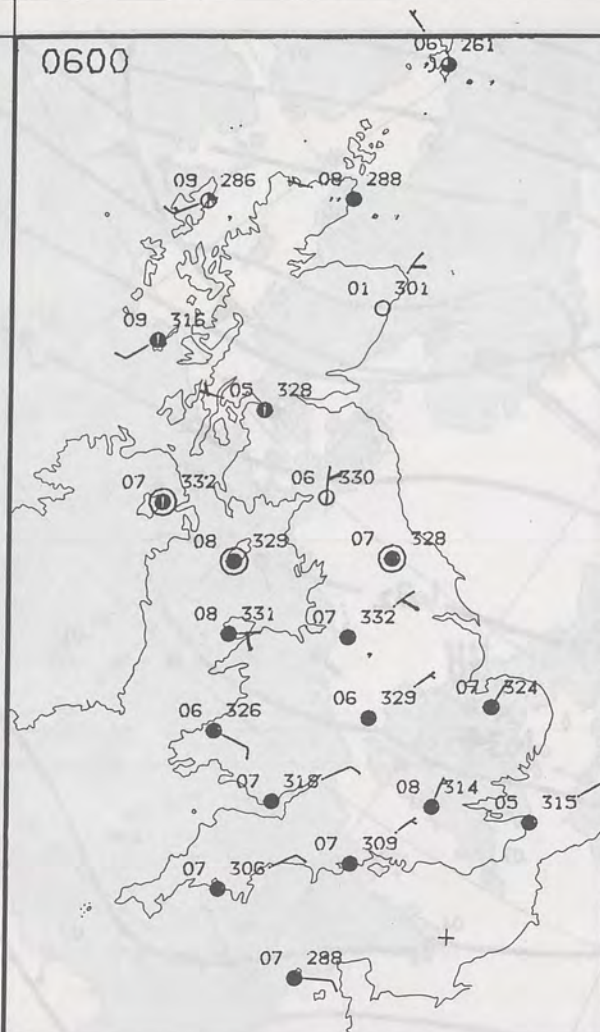

Temperatures were a little above normal over Scotland, but below over extreme SE and Western parts of England. Elsewhere temperatures were near normal.

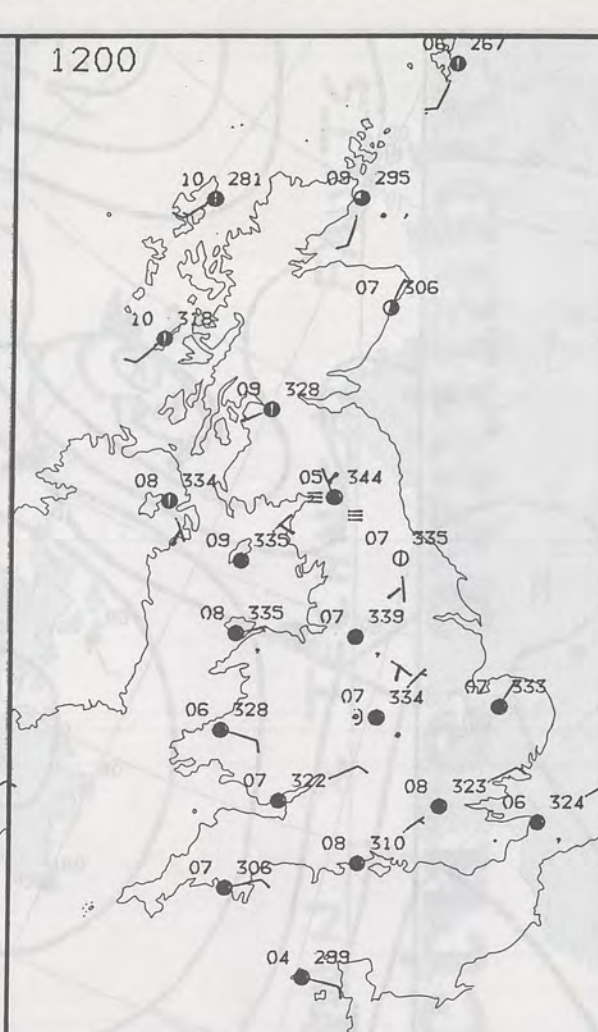

During the day Southern Scotland was dry and bright, indeed quite sunny at times, but the north was more cloudy with a little rain and drizzle.

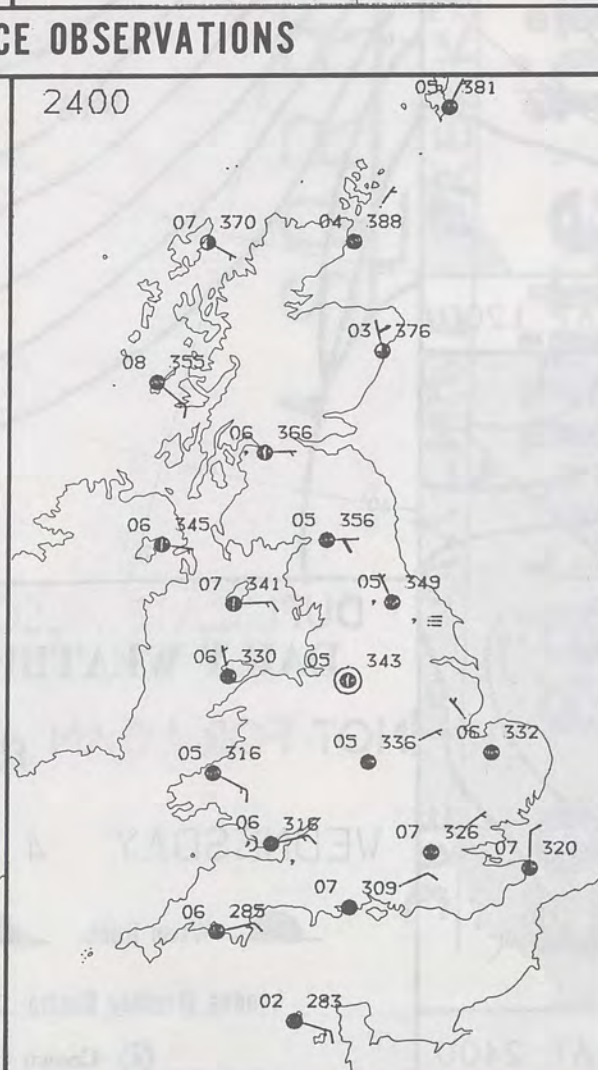
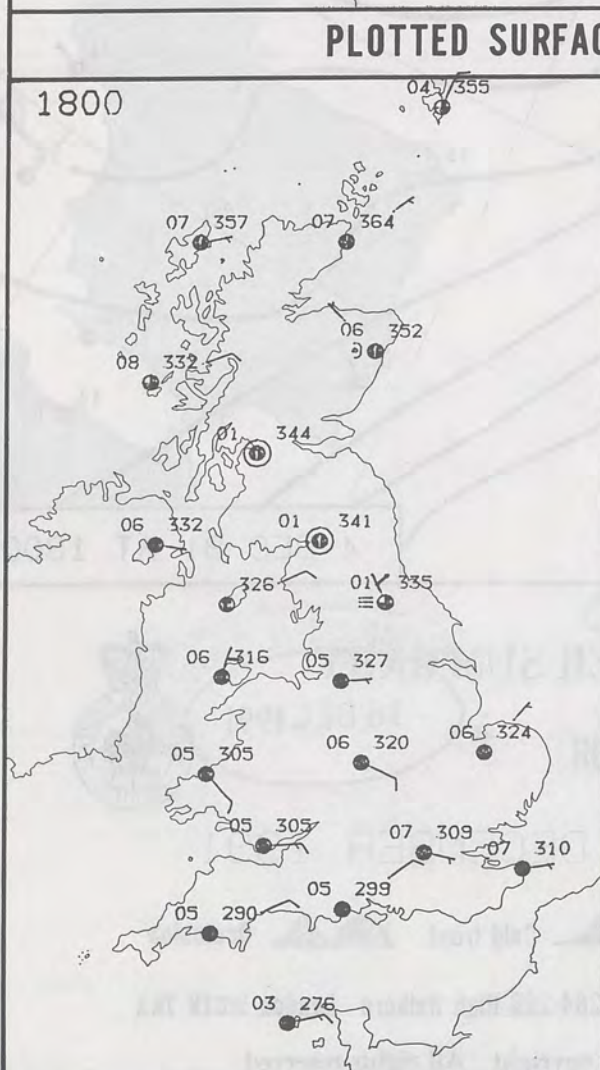

### SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

Overnight it was cold and clear over the Highlands and Grampians with widespread frost. A band of cloud over Southern Scotland and Northern Ireland kept temperatures above freezing in these areas. Over Wales, Northern Ireland and the rest of England broken cloud allowed mist and fog patches to form in many areas with frost in Central and SE parts of England. It was dry everywhere.

During the morning the mist and fog were slow to clear in some places, but most areas did brighten up with a good deal of sunshine across the British Isles by midday. Apart from one or two showers spreading across the Essex coast all areas were dry.

### SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

Overnight it was cold clear and dry over much of the British Isles with widespread mist, fog patches and frost. Northern Ireland and parts of NW Scotland were more cloudy and mainly frost free. The worst of the mist and fog were in Central and E and SE England.

There was a widespread, and locally severe frost overnight, although the far SW and NW escaped. Freezing fog affected many parts of Central and Eastern England, with some dense patches.

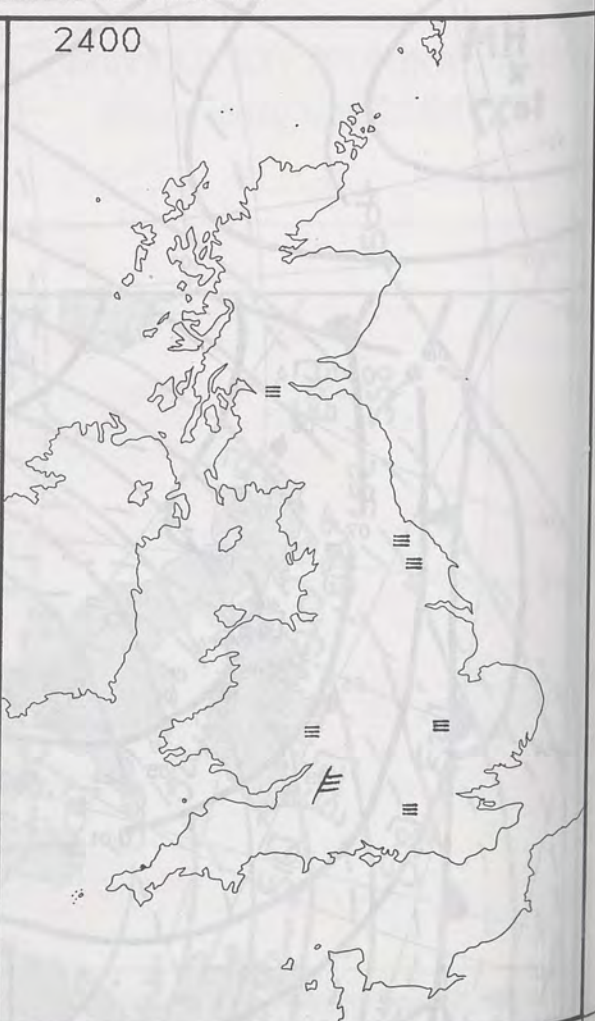

# SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

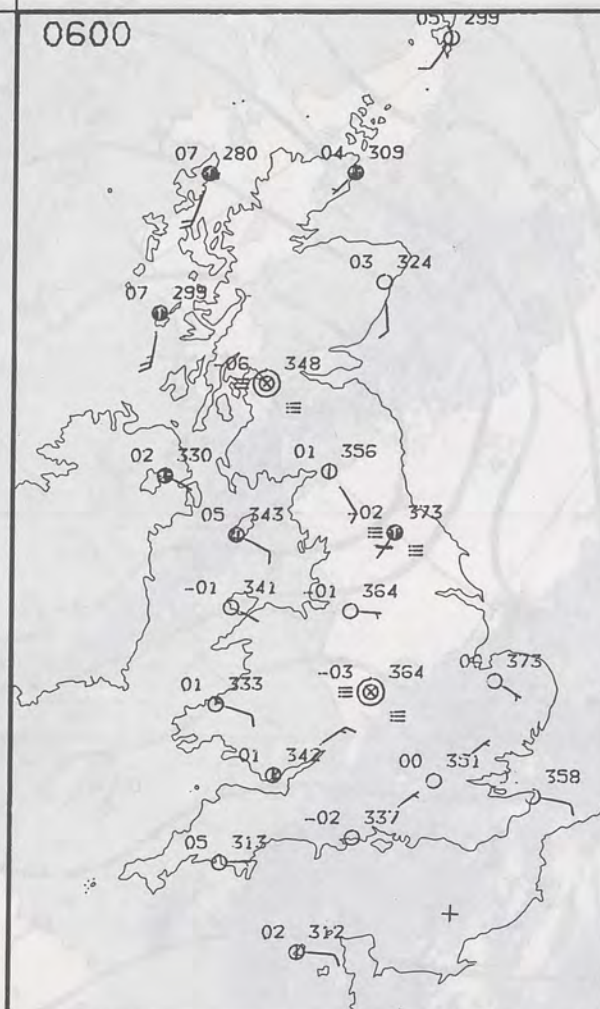

Temperatures were close to normal in parts of Western and Northern Britain but the bulk of the country had a cold day, and very cold in places that remained misty or foggy during the day.

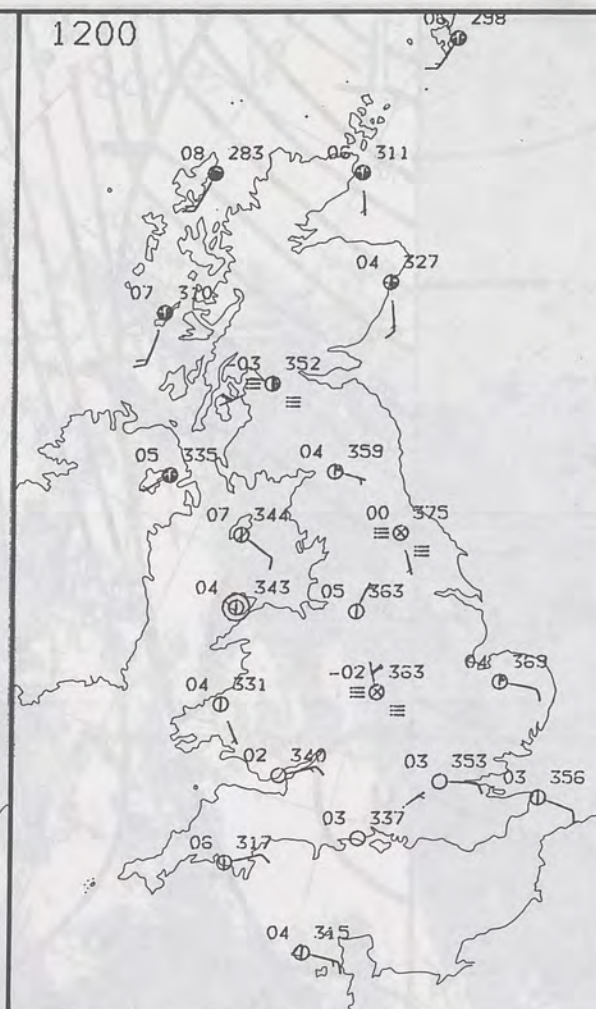

### SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

England and Wales had a dry clear night leading to a widespread, and often severe frost. Freezing fog patches occurred, mainly from the Midlands northwards. SW England was rather more cloudy and breezy but pockets of frost occurred here too. Northern Ireland was rather cloudy at times but there was a slight frost in places and a few fog patches. The Western and Northern isles of Scotland were mostly cloudy with a few spots of rain and drizzle but much of Scotland was clear with frost and freezing fog in places, especially along the Forth Clyde valley.

### SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

Overnight a strong showery NW,LY airstream covered much of the British Isles with gales in the north and west. England and Wales was mild with showers chiefly affecting western areas. Scotland and Northern Ireland had frequent squally showers, some heavy and wintry with hail and snow in places.

### SUMMARY OF BRITISH WEATHER

Overnight gale force winds affected many parts as a squally trough moved south across Scotland to be over Northern Ireland, the Borders and Northern parts of England by dawn. The rain in these areas was heavy and persistent. Over the rest of Scotland colder clearer conditions brought wintry showers. England and Wales had a generally mild and cloudy night with patchy light drizzle here and there.

During the morning the trough moved rapidly SE to be over central parts of England by midday. Scotland, Northern Ireland and Northern England had squally blustery showers falling as snow at times over high ground in the north, and were most frequent and heavy near Western and Northern coasts and hills. Other places were cloudy with rain at times locally heavy but more sporadic in the south. Gales persisted in many areas. The trough cleared the SE in the afternoon leaving the UK under a cold unstable NW,LY airflow. The winds died slowly and showers were confined to the NW of Britain, SE Britain having a mostly dry end to the day. Showers affected NW Britain in the evening falling locally as snow over Scotland. Much of England was dry and clear by mid evening. It was very mild at first but temperatures fell to near normal by evening.

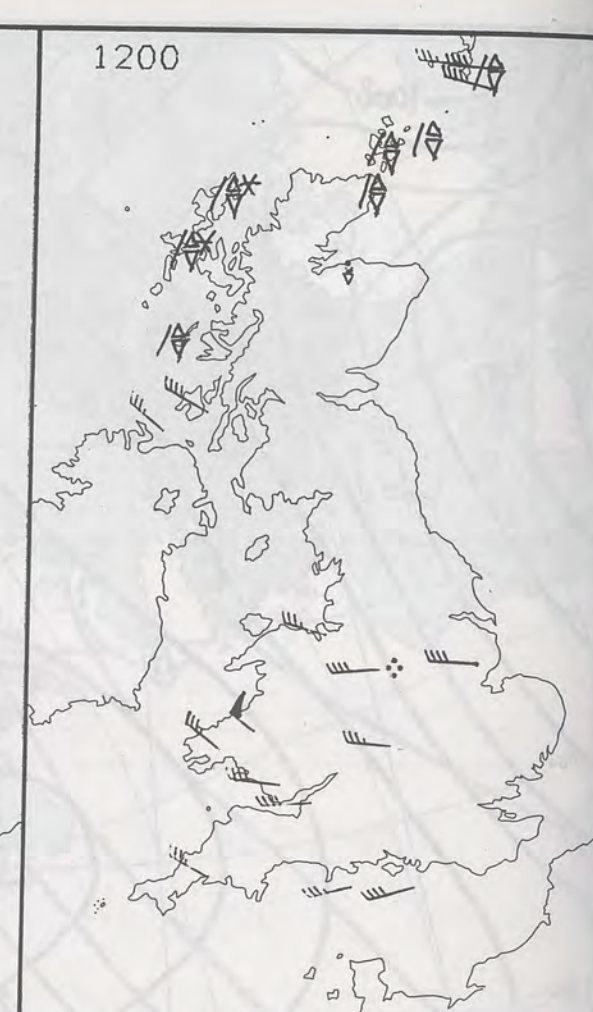

Eastern and Central parts of Scotland had brighter spells and some sunshine during the day, as did extreme SE England.

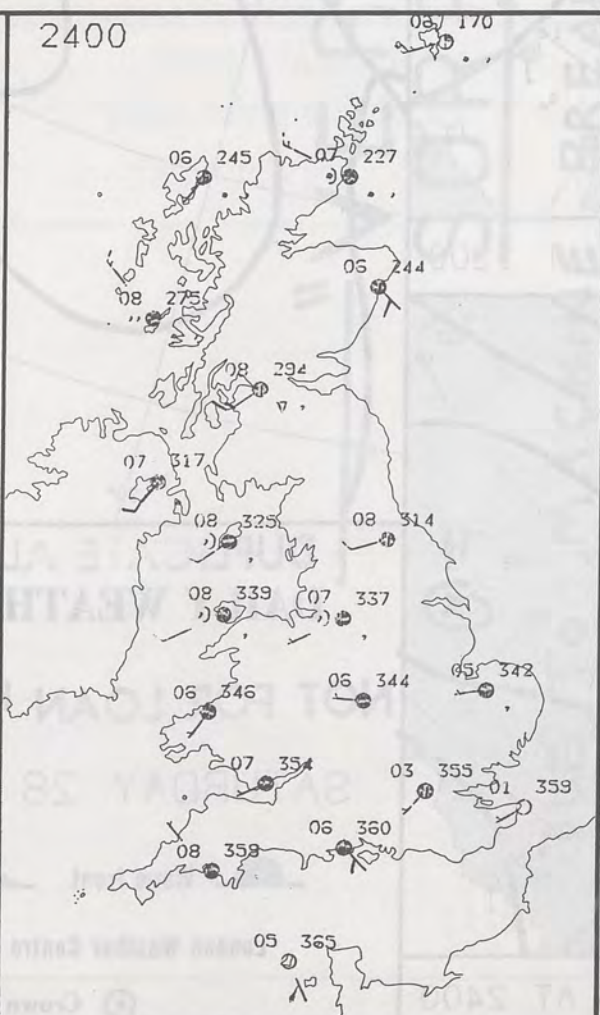
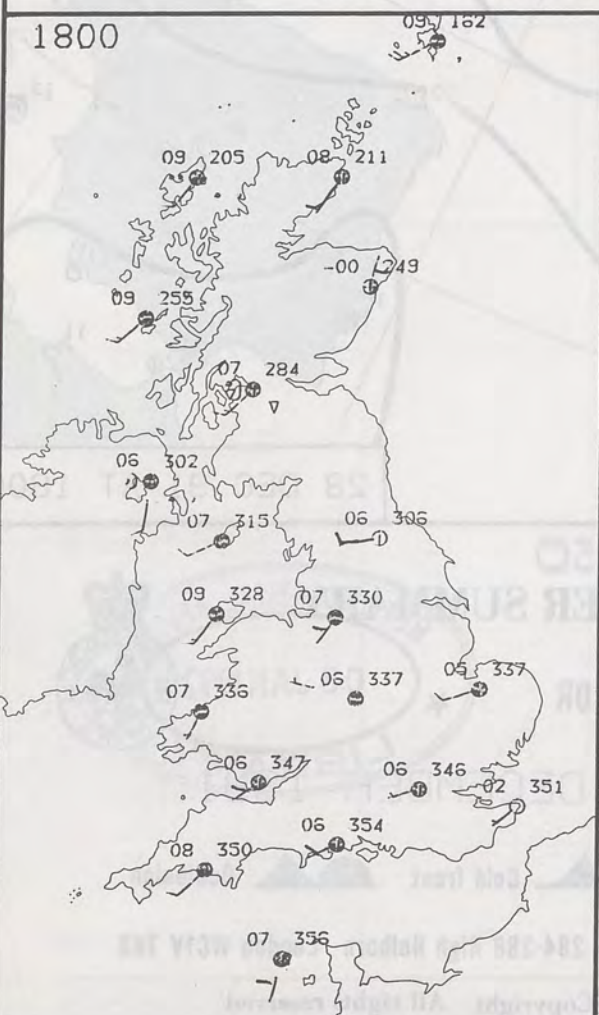
