

Moderate northerly (NE to NW) winds prevail on our northern and western coasts this morning and fresh northwesterly winds chiefly on our other coasts. Rain has again fallen on our north and east coasts and at Liverpool, - at places the amount has been very large. ~~Sea~~ Barometric pressure has increased in the north and west but decreased in the east and south. Temperature generally has changed but little.

In Ireland the winds are moderate from the northward with fine weather & slightly increased barometric pressure.

On our northern & eastern coasts a great deal of rain has fallen, accompanied by cold strong northerly & northwesterly winds - apparently a consequence of continued low pressure over the north sea & a great portion of the Continent.

Yesterday Barometers were ^(lower) in Holland than elsewhere & round this area of low pressure the winds appear to some extent to have circulated, - being easterly over the Baltic, westerly over the Mediterranean & northerly or northwesterly over the British Isles & France.
